Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024 and 2023

**1. Description of the Plan**

The following description of the Austin Bank, Texas, N.A. Employees' Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan whereby eligible employees of Austin Bank, Texas, N.A. or any affiliate who has adopted the Plan (collectively referred to as Company or employer) are permitted to make contributions that are tax deferred under section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). The Plan is subject to the requirements of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan is overseen by the Company's Profit-Sharing Plan Committee which reports to the Company's board of trustees and is administered by a Plan Administrator. The Profit-Sharing Plan Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investments and monitors investment performance.

Eligibility

Eligible employees may participate in the Plan on the first day of employment.

Contributions

Participants may contribute between 1% and 50% of their pretax annual compensation allowed by law, subject to certain maximum limitations imposed by the Internal Revenue Code ("the Code"), as defined in the Plan. Participants may elect to make Pre-Tax 401(k) deferrals or Roth 401(k) deferrals. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans.

Participants who are eligible to make salary deferral contributions under the Plan and have attained age 50 before the close of the plan year may make catch-up contributions in accordance with, and subject to the maximum limitation imposed by the Code.

The Plan includes an automatic deferral feature whereby the Employer automatically withholds 4% of a participant's compensation each payroll period and contributes that amount to the Plan as a pre-tax 401(k) deferral unless the Employer amends the Plan, or the participant opts out or enters into a Salary Reduction Agreement. The automatic escalation provisions (AEP) apply to participants who have completed a Salary Reduction Agreement to defer at least 1% of compensation, unless and until they make a contrary election after the AEP's effective date. A participant's pre-tax elective deferral withheld under the AEP rules will increase by 1% each plan year until the amount reaches 15% of compensation unless and until a participant makes a contrary election after the AEP's effective date. The increase in the amount automatically withheld from a participant's pay will be effective on April 1<sup>st</sup> following the date that the participant executes a Salary Reduction Agreement, or, if sooner, the effective date of the AEP.

The Plan is a "safe harbor plan." Under these provisions, the Employer will make a safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of a participant's elective deferrals that do not exceed 4% of the participant's eligible compensation.

The Employer may also make a discretionary additional matching contribution (profit sharing contribution) and discretionary nonelective contributions to participants who have completed one year of service, or 1,000 hours of service as defined in the Plan. A participant's share of nonelective contributions is determined using a formula specified in the Plan. Employer contributions for the current year paid to the Plan during the following year are accrued as receivables on the statement of net assets available for benefits. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, employer contribution receivables were comprised of accrued profit-sharing contributions in the amounts of \$1,501,503 and \$1,376,937, respectively.

Vesting

Participants are immediately fully vested in their salary deferral, rollover and safe harbor contributions plus actual earnings (losses) thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary match contributions and Company's profit-sharing contributions plus related earnings (losses) thereon is determined by the years of service based on the following vesting schedule:

In the event of death, disability or attainment of the normal retirement age while employed by the Company, participants become 100% vested in their portion of employer contributions.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and discretionary contributions, and an allocation of plan earnings. Each participant's account is also charged for distributions and certain direct expenses. Allocations are based on participant account balances, as defined in the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the vested benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Notes receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest (prime rate in effect plus 1%) at rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined periodically by the Plan. Principal and interest are paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions. A participant can only have one loan currently outstanding, from the Plan.

Investment Options

Participants must direct contributions to selected investments as made available and determined by the Plan Administrator. Participants may change their investment options at any time throughout the year via internet or direct phone access to the Empower plan sponsor web site.

The Plan currently offers various mutual funds and a common collective stable value fund as investment options for participants. The Plan's Qualified Default Investment Alternative ("QDIA") for those participants, including beneficiaries, who have not provided investment directions, is the Guaranteed Income Fund ("GIF") within the GoalMaker portfolio model funds. Contributions are automatically invested in QDIA funds until changed by the participant.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures represent the portion of non-vested benefit payments remaining in the Plan for all terminated employees. Forfeitures may be used to reduce discretionary additional employer matching contributions or pay Plan expenses. During 2024 and 2023, newly forfeited account balances totaled \$65,216 and \$22,699, respectively. During 2024 and 2023, the Plan used forfeitures totaling \$15,142 and \$33,641, respectively, to reduce employer matching contributions. During 2024 and 2023, the Plan used forfeitures totaling \$26,809 and \$11,894, respectively, to offset administrative expenses of the Plan. During 2024 and 2023, the net earnings credited to the forfeitures account totaled \$1,253 and \$1,174, respectively. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the balance of forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$77,245 and \$52,727, respectively.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits under the Plan will generally be made out in cash only. Distributions to participants with vested account balances less than \$5,000 are made in a single lump-sum payment equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account. In determining whether the vested account balance exceeds the \$5,000 threshold, "rollover" contributions (and any earnings allocable to "rollover" contributions) will be considered. Participants with vested account balances in excess of \$5,000, may elect to receive distributions in the form of a single lump-sum payment, partial withdrawals, or installments over a period of not more than the assumed life expectancy of the beneficiary and/or participant. To comply with certain requirements of the SECURE Act and IRS regulations in effect at December 31, 2024, the Plan requires participants to take their first required minimum distribution in the year they attain age 73.

**2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

Date of Management's Review and Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through September 8, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are presented on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with a basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Certain investments of the Plan are FBRICS comprised of stable value funds in a general account reported at contract value. Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts (FBRICS). Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Therefore, the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits has been prepared on a contract value basis for that portion related to FBRICS. The Profit-Sharing Plan Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies.

Certain investments of the Plan are mutual funds reported at fair value based on observable market quotations, and bank collective investment trusts reported at net asset value based on other observable inputs within the fair value hierarchy. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. These investments are presented as Investments, at fair value in the accompanying financial statements and are further discussed in disclosure of fair value measurements at Note 5.

The net appreciation in value of investments consists of the realized gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year and unrealized appreciation (depreciation) of investments. The net change in unrealized appreciation (depreciation) in value of investments is determined by the change in value from the beginning of the year to the end of the year or change in value from date of the purchase to the end of the year.

Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income and dividend income is recorded when received. Therefore, interest and dividend income on a significant portion of investments was not accrued as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded.

If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

The fair value disclosures for financial instruments are not required for participant loans. Also, participant loans continue to be considered as investments for Form 5500 reporting purposes.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Officers or employees of the Company perform certain administrative functions for the Plan. However, such officers and employees receive no compensation from the Plan. Part of the Plan's administrative expenses paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements.

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**4. Guaranteed Investment Contracts with Insurance Company**

The Plan investments include one benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract (Guaranteed Income Fund). The Guaranteed Income Fund ("GIF") is a stable value fund issued by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, an affiliated entity of Empower Trust Company (Empower). The contributions in the GIF are maintained by Empower in a general account. The GIF accounts are credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuers are contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contracts meet the criteria to be considered fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contracts. The guaranteed investment contracts are presented on the face of the statement of net assets available for benefits at contract value. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the contract value of the GIF stable value fund was \$21,875,943 and \$23,348,431, respectively.

Contract value, as reported to the Plan by the issuers represents contributions made under the contracts, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer but may not be less than zero percent. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the issuers. Such events include the following: (a) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (b) changes to the plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (c) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the plan, or (d) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Furthermore, certain events would allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Plan participants are probable of occurring. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the issuer to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

**5. Fair Value Measurements**

ASC Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures* establishes a fair value hierarchy for valuation inputs that gives the highest priority to quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs. The three broad levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows:

- Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority.
- Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1).
- Level 3 inputs consist of unobservable inputs and have the lowest priority.

The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs are not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available. There are no plan assets requiring the use of Level 3 inputs for the periods presented.

*Level 1 Fair Value Measurements*

**Mutual funds** - The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds must publish their daily net asset value and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are considered to be actively traded.

**6. Party-In-Interest Transactions**

Certain Plan investments shares of mutual funds managed by Empower Trust Company (Empower). Other Plan investments are stable value funds in a group annuity contract issued by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, an affiliated entity of Empower. Empower is the contract administrator and trustee of the Plan as defined in the Plan. Therefore, transactions with Empower qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for contract administration services are included in administrative expenses on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. During 2024, fees directly paid by the Plan for contract administration services provided by Empower totaled \$15,548.

Empower uses Wells Fargo Wealth Brokerage Insurance Agency (“WFB”) to provide investment management services to the Plan, and Wells Fargo Advisors (“WFA”) to provide investment advisory services to the Plan. Therefore, transactions with WFB and WFA qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services and investment advisory services are included in investment income on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits, as they are paid through revenue sharing rather than direct payment arrangements. During 2024, fees paid by the Plan to WFB for investment management services was \$76,494, and the fees paid by the Plan to WFA for investment advisory services was \$167,530.

Payne & Smith, LLC is the Plan’s independent public accountant (“IPA”) as defined in the Plan. Therefore, the IPA is a party-in-interest under ERISA and transactions with the IPA qualify as party-in-interest transactions. During 2024, fees paid by the Plan for audit and nonattest services provided by the IPA were paid by the Company in full and are therefore, neither disclosed nor included or accrued on the accompanying financial statements.

These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

**7. Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan provides for various investment options in investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risks associated with investment securities, and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of these securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and changes in net assets available for benefits.

**8. Tax Status**

The Plan sponsor is an adopter of a pre-approved plan that received a favorable Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) Opinion Letter dated September 16, 2022, in which the IRS stated that the Plan was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Although the Plan has been amended and restated since receiving the Opinion Letter, the Plan Administrator believes this Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the Plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**9. Plan Termination**

While there is no intention to do so, the employer reserves the right to terminate the Plan. In the event of termination of the Plan, the participants become fully vested in their employer contribution balances, and the net assets of the Plan will be distributed to the participants of the Plan in accordance with the provisions of ERISA.
