NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of The AME Group 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Advanced Micro-Electronics, Inc. d/b/a The AME Group (the Employer or Plan Sponsor) who are age 21 or older. Eligible employees may enter the Plan on the 1st day of each calendar month after they have met the eligibility requirement. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Board of Directors is responsible for oversight of the Plan and determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to the maximum amount allowable by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Eligible employees may also elect after-tax (Roth) contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants also may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. They may change their investment options among those investments provided at any time during the plan year.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 2 percent of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balance fund until changed by the participant.

Subsequent to December 31, 2024, the Plan Sponsor adopted a safe harbor match policy, under which the Employer will make matching contributions in an amount equal to 100% of the first 3% contributed plus 50% of the amount contributed between 3% and 5% of eligible compensation. In addition, the Employer may elect to make a discretionary matching contribution. This policy does not impact the financial position of the Plan as of year-end but will be reflected in future periods.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each plan participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution as well as allocations of plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings on the contributions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reason, a participant with an account balance greater than \$5,000 may elect to receive a lump sum distribution, have the balance rolled over to an eligible retirement plan, or leave the account balance in the Plan. If the participant's account balance is \$5,000 or less, the participant's benefits will be paid as a lump-sum distribution.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes in those assets and liabilities, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Investments in pooled separate accounts are credited with earnings and gains or losses on the pooled investments. The separate accounts are stated at fair value as reported to the Plan by its custodian (Note 3), based on the quoted market prices of the underlying mutual funds. The unit value of the separate account is calculated by dividing the total value of the assets of the separate account by the number of units in the separate account. For separate accounts that

invest exclusively in mutual funds, the total value of the assets of the separate account is based on the net asset value (NAV), or price per share, of the underlying mutual fund. The mutual fund calculates its NAV by dividing the mutual fund's net assets by the mutual fund's outstanding number of shares.

The investment strategies for the pooled separate accounts investing in mutual funds or equity securities vary based on the degree of investment risk chosen by the fund manager and the criteria of the fund or security's investment goals. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchase and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded when earned. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses incurred maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net change in fair value of investments. Certain contract administrator related expenses are included in administrative expenses.

Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefit.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated events or transactions occurring subsequent to the statement of net assets available for benefits date for recognition and disclosure in the accompanying financial statements through the date the financial statements were available to be issued, which is September 18, 2025.

3. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S CUSTODIAN

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Transamerica Life

Insurance Company (TLIC), the custodian of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the schedule of assets at December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). However, in accordance with Subtopic 820-10, the pooled separate account investments that are measured at NAV per share (or its equivalent) have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy.

The description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value are included in Note 2. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Investments Measured Using the NAV per Share Practical Expedient

The following table summarize investments for which fair value is measured using the NAV per share as a practical expedient as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. There are no participant redemption restrictions for these investments; the redemption notice period is applicable only to the Plan.

5. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract values is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. The contract value of this traditional investment contract was \$26,250 and \$18,603 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0.75%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. Examples of such events include the following:

1. The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code
2. Premature termination of the contracts
3. Plan termination or merger
4. Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options
5. Bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract
3. A material misrepresentation
4. A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer

6. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Parties-in-interest are defined under DOL regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the Employer and certain others.

TLIC is the custodian for the Plan, and receives payment for contract administrative services, as well as direct payment from participants on a transactional basis for processing distributions. Investment advisory fees are paid to Raymond James and Associates Inc. and Mesirow Financial, Inc. FuturePlan by Ascensus is the third-party administrator for the Plan. Blue & Co., LLC is the independent auditor for the Plan and received payment from the Plan Sponsor.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions

of ERISA. Upon termination, the Employer shall direct the custodian regarding distribution of accounts to participants or their beneficiaries.

8. TAX STATUS

The Plan uses a preapproved plan document sponsored by Ascensus LLC, which has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020, stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the plan administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore, believes that the plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by various federal and state taxing authorities. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the accompanying financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
