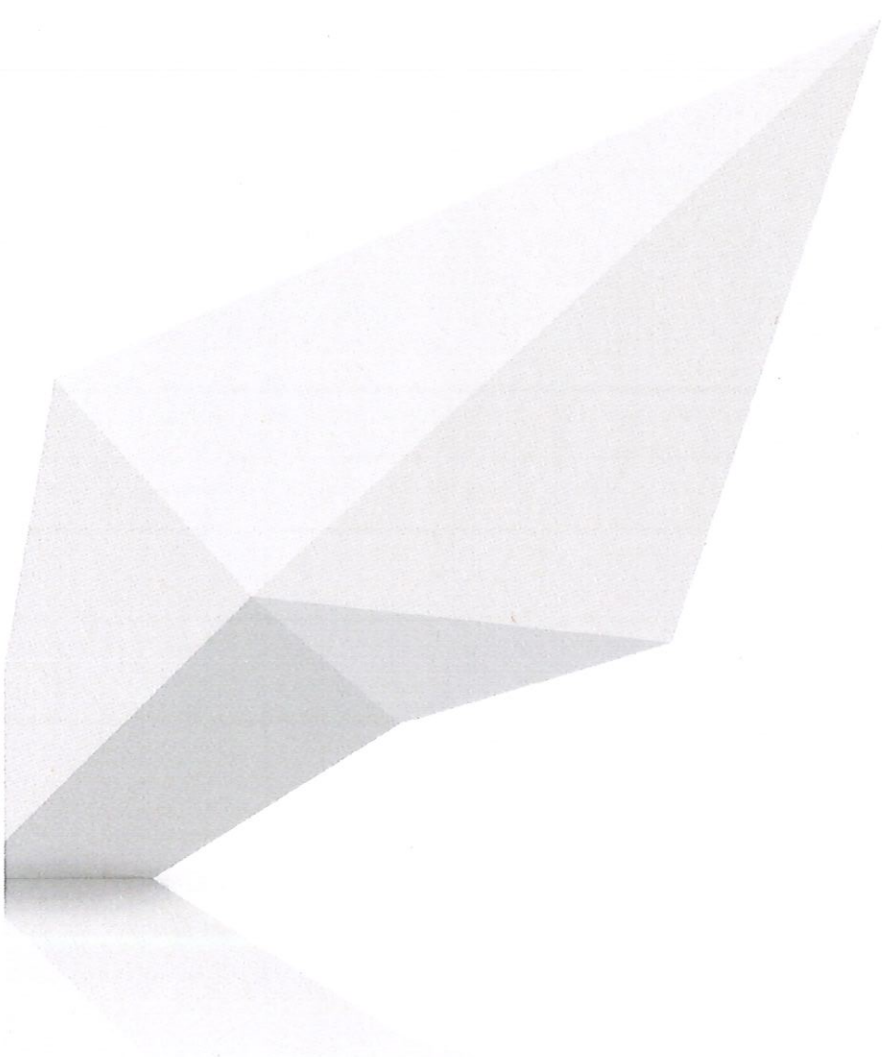

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Magid Glove and Safety Manufacturing Company, LLC 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1: Description of Plan

The following description of the Magid Glove and Safety Manufacturing Company, LLC 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan, as most recently restated effective January 1, 2022, and most recently amended for the 2024 Plan year on August 1, 2025, is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Magid Glove & Safety Manufacturing Company, LLC and Magid Manufacturing Co., Inc. (collectively the "Company"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Charles Schwab Trust Bank is the Custodian of the Plan's investments, Schwab Retirement Plan Service, Inc. is the Plan's recordkeeper and third-party administrator, and Nadler Financial Group is the Plan's investment advisor.

Eligibility

Employees are eligible to participate in making salary-deferral contributions to the Plan on their date of hire, provided the employee is not a union employee, is not a nonresident alien, and is not a leased employee.

Participants are eligible for Company matching and profit-sharing contributions following completion of at least 1,000 hours of service, as defined in the Plan, and upon being actively employed on the last day of the Plan year. A participant's account will share in Company matching and profit-sharing contributions in the event of the participant's death during the plan year.

Participants Contributions

Salary-deferral contributions: Each year, participants may contribute a portion of annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, as either a pretax or after tax Roth deferral, up to the maximum allowed by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Newly eligible full-time employees who do not elect an initial deferral rate or do not opt out of Plan participation are automatically enrolled in the Plan at a 3% pretax deferral rate into the Plan's qualified default investment alternative, until changed by the participant.

Catch-up deferral contributions: Each year, participants over age 50 may elect to make catch-up contributions up to the maximum allowed by the IRC.

Rollover and transfer contributions: Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions and Company contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Note 1: Description of Plan (Continued)

Company Contributions

Matching contributions: The Company may make discretionary matching contributions on behalf of each participant in an amount equal to a percentage of the participant's deferral contributions during the Plan year, as determined annually by the Company's board of directors. For 2024, matching contributions equaled 25% of a participant's salary-deferral contribution, not to exceed \$750 per participant. Matching contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 totaled \$225,640.

Profit-sharing contribution: The Company may also make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution, as determined by its board of directors, to be allocated to participants in proportion to a participant's compensation. The discretionary profit sharing contribution totaled \$1,921,205 before forfeitures for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Special contribution: The Company may also make a special contribution, which is nonelective and only allocated to certain non-highly compensated participants. The amount of this contribution shall not exceed the maximum annual addition that can be allocated to a participant's account for that year, reduced by all other annual additions. The special contribution for the year ended December 31, 2024 amounted to \$183,466.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company's matching contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's discretionary profit-sharing and special contributions; (b) reallocations of forfeitures, if any; and (c) Plan earnings (losses). Additionally, each participant's account is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on a participant's compensation, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their salary deferral contributions, Company matching and special contributions, and rollover contribution accounts, plus actual earnings (losses) thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary profit-sharing contribution portion of their accounts, plus actual earnings (losses) thereon, is based on years of continuous service. Participants vest at a rate of 20% per year beginning in year 2, with a participant being 100% vested after six years. Participants are immediately fully vested upon normal retirement (age 62), death, or permanent disability.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$84,536 and \$74,940, respectively. These accounts will first be used to restore prior forfeitures of a former participant if that participant resumes employment with the Company prior to incurring a "break in service," as defined. They may then be used to reduce future Company contributions, be reallocated to participants as Company contributions, or to pay administrative expenses of the Plan in accordance with the Plan document. Forfeitures of \$96,044 were used to reduce the 2024 discretionary Company profit-sharing contribution that was paid to the Plan in 2025.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Plan participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, less their highest outstanding note amount during the prior 12 months, or one-half of their total vested account balance in the Plan. A participant may have only two notes outstanding at any given time. Notes are repaid, with interest, through equal payroll deductions over a term of one to five years, unless the borrowings are used to acquire a principal residence, at which time the note can be repaid over a reasonable period of time not to exceed thirty years. The notes are secured by the vested balance in the participant's accounts. The interest rate is determined by the Plan administrator based on the prime lending rate offered by a qualifying financial institution for a similar type of note. The interest rates on outstanding notes receivable from participants ranged from 3.25% to 8.50% as of December 31, 2024.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or for other reasons, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in a lump sum. In addition, hardship distributions out of the participant's vested account balance are permitted if certain criteria are met. The Plan also allows for in-service distributions upon attaining age 59 1/2. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no amounts owed to former participants whose employment had been terminated and who requested payout.

SECURE 2.0 Act

In December 2022, Securing a Strong Retirement Act (SECURE 2.0) was passed into law. The provisions of SECURE 2.0 continue the themes and reforms that began with the 2019 CARES Act. The effective date of the provisions of SECURE 2.0 vary from becoming effective immediately through 2028. Those provisions include both required and optional elements. Plan management has evaluated those provisions and determined there is no material impact on the Plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Plan management will evaluate and determine which optional provisions, if any, to elect in the future.

Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees may be deducted from the proceeds of the loan and recorded as administrative expenses when incurred and/or charged to a participant account. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. Delinquent participant notes receivable are recorded as benefit payments on the basis of the terms of the Plan document.

Excess Contributions Payable

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, amounts payable to participants totaling \$49,872 and \$15,056, respectively, for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) were recorded as a liability with the corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions to the applicable participants in March 2025 and the 2023 excess contributions to applicable participants in April 2024.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Plan expenses directly attributable to a participant, such as loan fees and withdrawal fees, are paid by the applicable participant. Investment advisory and certain administrative expenses are paid with forfeitures, Plan assets, or by the Company. Expenses paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are charged to the Plan as a reduction of investment income and included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 22, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3: Fair Value Measurements

GAAP establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority level. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted market prices for identical assets (Level 1). Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. There are no Plan assets requiring the use of Level 3 inputs for the periods presented.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Money market funds: Fair values are based on NAV of \$1 per share at year-end.

Note 4: Information Prepared and Certified by the Custodian

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Certain information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Charles Schwab Trust Bank (CSB), the Custodian of the Plan.

Note 5: Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan invests in shares of mutual funds issued by CSB, and all investments are held by CSB, the Custodian, as defined by the Plan, and therefore these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Additionally, Nadler Financial Group provides investment advisory and investment management services. Schwab Retirement Plan Service, Inc. provides administrative and Plan recordkeeping services. These transactions are not considered prohibited transactions under the ERISA regulations.

Fees paid by the Plan for administrative expenses, inclusive of \$86,943 paid to Nadler Financial Group, amounted to \$90,693 for 2024. In addition, certain administrative functions are performed by trustees of the Plan or employees of the Company for which no compensation is received from the Plan for their services.

Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

Note 6: Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their Company profit-sharing contributions. Any unallocated assets of the Plan would be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Company may determine.

Note 7: Tax Status

The Company has adopted a restated and amended Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing/Money Purchase/CODA Plan ("Prototype Plan") sponsored by Schwab Retirement Plan Services, Inc. (Note 1). The Prototype Plan obtained its latest determination letter on September 21, 2020, in which the (IRS) stated that the Prototype Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has not requested its own IRS determination letter. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter; however, the Plan administrator believes the Plan is currently designed, and being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes is included in the Plan's financial statements.

Note 8: Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
