### ***Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit***

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Thermo System, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### ***Opinion***

**Notes to Financial Statements**  
**December 31, 2024 and 2023**

**1. Plan Description**

The following description of the Thermo System, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the "Plan") is provided for financial reporting purposes only. Participants of the Plan should refer to the plan document and summary plan description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan was established January 1, 2001, restated as of July 12, 2022, and amended as of January 1, 2024 to add an automatic enrollment provision. The Plan is a defined contribution safe harbor plan as defined by Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") covering all eligible employees of Thermo System, LLC (the "Plan Sponsor"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as amended.

**Eligibility**

Employees may become eligible following three months of service and attaining 21 years of age. Plan entry dates are the first of each month.

**Contributions**

Participants may contribute up to 90 percent of pre-tax or after-tax eligible annual compensation, as defined in the plan document, not to exceed certain dollar limits established by the IRC. As of January 1, 2024, certain participants, as defined in the plan document, are automatically enrolled at five percent of eligible compensation with no auto-increase provisions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

The Plan Sponsor matches the participants' contribution with an amount equal to 100 percent of the first three percent and 50 percent of the next two percent of the amount contributed by each participant, up to a maximum of five percent of eligible compensation as a safe harbor matching contribution.

The Plan Sponsor may also make an annual discretionary profit sharing contribution to the Plan. Contributions are allocated to eligible participants' accounts based upon the percentage of the participants' compensation to the total compensation of all eligible participants. The Plan Sponsor did not elect to make any discretionary profit sharing contributions for the 2024 and 2023 Plan years.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of the Plan Sponsor's contributions and Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting and Forfeitures**

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, Plan Sponsor safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Plan Sponsor's profit sharing contribution portion of their account plus earnings is based on years of service, as defined in the plan document, in accordance with the following schedule:

The nonvested balance is forfeited upon termination of service. Participants become fully vested upon death, termination of the Plan, normal retirement age, or total disability.

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$10 and \$11, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce administrative expenses and future Plan Sponsor contributions. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, Plan Sponsor contributions totaling \$1 and \$355, respectively, were paid from forfeited nonvested accounts.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

The plan document includes provisions authorizing loans from the Plan to active eligible participants. Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$500 up to the maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The maximum number of loans available to any participant is one. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at 4.25 to 9.50 percent, which is determined by the plan administrator and is based on the prime rate, as published by the Wall Street Journal, plus one percent. The loan repayment period is dictated by the plan document based on the original use of the funds. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

**Payment of Benefits**

Prior to separation from service with the Plan Sponsor, a participant may request a distribution of rollover contributions. In the event of a financial hardship, certain participant funds, as defined in the plan document, may be requested for distribution. In-service distributions may also be requested by participants who are at least age 59 1/2.

Upon attainment of normal retirement age, total disability, or death, the amount credited to a participant's account is payable in a lump sum or installments. Upon termination of employment for reasons other than retirement, total disability, or death, the participant's account balance will be distributed in a manner based on the value of the account. If a separated participant's account does not exceed \$5,000, the benefit will be distributed in a lump sum within a reasonable time after termination of employment. If the participant's account balance exceeds \$5,000, the participant may elect to receive the benefit in a lump sum, installments, or delay receipt of benefits in accordance with the plan document.

**2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

**Basis of Presentation**

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB"), Accounting Standards Codification (the "FASB ASC"), which is the source of authoritative, non-governmental accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP"). All references to authoritative accounting guidance contained in our disclosures are based on the general accounting topics within the FASB ASC.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Fair Value Measurements**

The Plan follows guidance issued by the FASB on fair value measurements, which establishes a framework for measuring fair value, clarifies the definition of fair value within that framework, and expands disclosures about the use of fair value measurements. This guidance applies whenever fair value is the applicable measurement. The three general valuation techniques used to measure fair value are the market approach, cost approach, and income approach.

**Employer Contributions Receivable**

The Plan provides an allowance for credit losses equal to the estimated losses that will be incurred in the collection of employer contributions receivable, if any. The allowance is based on multiple factors, including historical experience, the credit quality of the Plan Sponsor, current economic conditions, and management's expectations of conditions in the future, as applicable. The allowance and associated employer contributions receivable are reduced when the receivables are determined to be uncollectible. There was no allowance for credit losses as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent loans are treated as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

**Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses**

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payments are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation in fair value of investments.

**Subsequent Events**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 22, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**3. Information Certified by the Custodian**

Information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest on notes receivable from participants and dividends for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Sponsor and certified as complete and accurate by Reliance Trust Company ("Reliance"), the custodian of the Plan.

**4. Fair Value Measurements**

The framework for measuring fair value establishes a fair value hierarchy which prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value into Levels 1, 2, and 3. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for instruments measured at fair value.

Level 1 investments consist of publicly traded mutual funds. These securities are valued at daily closing prices of the funds at year-end.

**5. Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions**

Fees paid by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. During 2024 and 2023, the Plan Sponsor paid certain administrative and other operating expenses of the Plan.

**6. Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in the Plan Sponsor contribution portion of their account.

**7. Tax Status of Plan**

The Plan adopted a prototype plan provided by ADP, LLC. The prototype plan received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service on October 6, 2020 stating that the prototype plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since the date of the opinion letter. Plan Sponsor management believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

In accordance with GAAP, the Plan Sponsor is required to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The Plan Sponsor has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken, or expected to be taken, that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan Sponsor believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021. The Plan is also subject to routine audits by the Department of Labor, generally for six years after the statutory due date of the annual information return. There are currently no audits in progress for any tax periods.

**8. Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
