Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Stan Boyett & Son, Inc., Profit Sharing 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). December 31, 2024 and 2023

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Stan Boyett & Son, Inc, Profit Sharing 401(k) Plan (“Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement and Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

GENERAL

The Plan is a participant-directed defined contribution plan covering all full-time non-leased employees of the Company who have 1,000 hours of service and are age 21 or older. After meeting this requirement, the employee will enter the plan the first day of the next following month. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The financial statements are prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

CONTRIBUTIONS

Each year, participants may make pre-tax salary deferrals that cannot exceed the lesser of the annual specified maximum allowed by income tax regulations or 90% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investments offered by the Plan Custodian.

All employees who are eligible to make pre-tax salary deferrals can also make after-tax salary deferrals. These contributions are also known as Roth deferral contributions. This means that you will be taxed on the money when it is withheld from your paycheck. You can contribute all or a portion of salary deferral as a Roth deferral.

The Company instituted a safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of elective deferrals that do not exceed 3% of compensation of each participant, plus 50% of the elective deferrals that exceed 3% of compensation but do not exceed 5% of compensation of each participant. The Company contributed \$451,085 during 2024.

The Company may also make a profit-sharing contribution. The contribution amount is discretionary and will be allocated to participants in the same ratio as each participant's compensation bears to the total of such compensation of all participants. Profit sharing contributions will be used to satisfy contributions determined by the Davis Bacon Act of any other federal, state or municipal prevailing wage law.

PARTICIPANT ACCOUNTS

Participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution (if applicable) and (b) Plan earnings. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

FORFEITED ACCOUNTS

There were forfeitures of \$0 during 2024. Non-vested contributions that are forfeited are applied to reduce administrative expenses of the Plan. The remaining forfeited amounts are applied to reduce fees and employer contributions. During the year, the plan used \$0 forfeiture funds to reduce fees and plan expenses.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

AUTOMATIC SALARY DEFERRAL

The plan has an automatic salary deferral feature. If a participant fails to complete a salary reduction agreement provided to them by their employer, their compensation will automatically be reduced by 2.00% and contributed to the plan on their behalf. At the anniversary date that the participant's automatic deferrals were first implemented, the initial automatic deferral amount shall increase 1% of compensation per year up to a maximum of 6% of compensation.

If a participant does not want the automatic deferral feature to apply to them, they must notify their employer. This plan feature will apply to all new participants, and all current participants without an election.

VESTING

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their own contributions, and immediately vested in the safe harbor contributions.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

On termination of service for any reason, accounts with vested benefits less than \$1,000 will be distributed in a lump sum. For accounts with vested benefits greater than \$1,000 but less than \$7,000 will be automatically rolled over to an IRA that meets certain parameters. For accounts with vested benefits greater than \$7,000 a participant may elect to receive a single lump sum distribution, part lump sum distribution and part installments, or installment payments over a specified time period.

ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES

Administrative expenses recorded in the Plan represent custodial fees, accounting fees and other third-party administration fees paid directly from the Plan to the respective service provider. The Company also pays administrative costs of the plan associated with plan communication and recordkeeping as well as provides equipment, personnel, and supplies to administer the Plan.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

Participants may borrow up to 50% of the current value of their vested account balance less any current outstanding loan balance (up to a maximum of \$50,000). The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. In addition, other terms and restrictions to amounts and repayment may apply.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

INVESTMENT VALUATION AND INCOME RECOGNITION

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements. Quoted market prices are used to value investments. Shares of pooled separate accounts are valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at the year end. Participant loans are valued at their outstanding balances, which approximate fair value.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gain and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

Loans to participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participants account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses have been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced to zero, and the delinquent note receivable is recorded as a deemed distribution. The deemed distribution would be recorded as a benefit payment on the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

Benefits are recorded when paid.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

FASB ASC 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2

Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. Assets valued using the net asset value practical expedient, if any, are not required to be reported within the hierarchy.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds

Mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Stable Value Fund

No investments were held in the stable value fund during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 4 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

John Hancock USA was the trustee and custodian of plan assets. As the custodian and trustee of the Plan, any transactions with them qualified as party-in-interest transactions. Therefore, the fees associated with the trustee and the third-party administrator are deemed to be party-in-interest transactions.

In addition, if accounting and plan administration services are paid directly by the Plan these services are also deemed to be party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 5 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become fully vested in their accounts.

NOTE 6 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Investments consist primarily of pooled separate accounts comprised of underlying mutual funds. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated March 31, 2014, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

The Company's income tax returns are subject to routine audit examination by the appropriate tax jurisdictions, and the company's tax returns generally remain open for the last three years.

NOTE 8 – INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY PLAN TRUSTEE

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by John Hancock USA.
