Basis for Opinion

Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following description of the River Valley Child Development Services ("Organization") 403(b) Defined Contribution Retirement Plan ("Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan in which all employees of the Organization hired after June 30, 2005 may participate after completing three months of service. Employees of the Organization hired prior to June 30, 2005 who were participating in the State of West Virginia Teachers' Defined Contribution (TDC) Retirement System as of July 1, 2005 were permitted to make a one-time election to remain in the TDC or to rollover their funds and become a participant in this Plan. The rollover election was required to be made by December 31, 2005. Established July 1, 2005, the Plan provides for retirement and death benefits. Hardship distributions of participant salary deferral amounts are permitted in certain circumstances. Loans from Plan assets are not permitted. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The administrative expenses of the Plan are absorbed by the Organization.

Contributions - Participants may elect to make salary deferral contributions subject to any limits imposed by Internal Revenue Service Regulations. Participant rollovers from other 403(b) plans are accepted. All Organization contributions are in the form of matching contributions. The Organization matches participant salary deferral contributions up to a maximum of 6% of compensation at a rate of 100%.

Participant Accounts - Contributions are placed into participant-selected investment accounts with Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association - College Retirement Equities Fund (TIAA-CREF) and Principal Trust Company. Available investment choices include fixed and variable annuity contracts and registered investment company stocks (mutual funds). Participants may generally transfer their existing account balances among the various investment options. However, transfers from non-benefit responsive annuity contract investments are generally limited to 10% of the participant's balance in that investment annually. The frequency of account balance transfers may also be limited by TIAA-CREF and Principal Trust Company. Net investment earnings are credited to participant accounts on a daily basis. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are immediately 100% vested in the entirety of their accounts including portions representing participants' contributions, employer contributions, and earnings thereon.

Payment of Benefits - Various benefit payment options are provided, including the purchase of single life, survivor, or fixed-term annuities, a lump-sum withdrawal (subject to certain surrender charges), or a combination of these alternatives. Generally, payment of benefits may occur only upon attaining age 59½, termination of employment, death, or disability. The Plan's normal retirement age is 65. Applicable regulations generally require that distributions begin by the later of the date the participant retires or April 1 of the year following the date the participant attains age 70½.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, except that interest and dividends earned on the Plan's investments are recognized as received. Management believes that the recognition of interest and dividends on the cash basis of accounting results in a presentation which does not differ materially from that which would be achieved if the accrual basis of accounting were employed for these items. Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - Investments are reported at fair value except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are recorded at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's valuation policies utilize information provided by the investment advisors, trustee, and insurance companies. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. See Note 5 for discussion of the fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Operating Expenses - All expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Organization.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Payment of Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Note 3 - Information Prepared and Certified by Trustees

The following is a summary of the unaudited information regarding the Plan, as included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule prepared by or derived from information reported by the trustees of the Plan for the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023. Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to measure the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value at the reporting date.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs are used only when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements - The pooled separate accounts invest in real estate properties and real estate-related investments. The fair value of the pooled separate accounts is based on the market value of the underlying real estate holdings (valued principally using external appraisals) and the market value of the underlying real estate-related investment securities (priced using values obtained from independent pricing sources). Registered investment companies invest principally in equity securities, fixed-income instruments, and short-term investments in accordance with each portfolio's investment objectives. The fair value of equity securities and fixed income instruments are primarily valued using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing sources. Money Market account holdings are generally valued at amortized cost.

Level 2 Fair Value Measurements - No Level 2 inputs were held by the Plan as of June 30, 2024 and 2023.

Level 3 Fair Value Measurements - The insurance company general contract is not actively traded and significant observable inputs are not available. The fair value of the insurance company general contract is determined based on contract values which equal the accumulated cash contributions and interest credited to the Plan's contract, less any withdrawals.

Note 5 - Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contracts

The Plan has entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association (TIAA). TIAA maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contracts are fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contracts. The guaranteed investment contracts are presented on the face of the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by TIAA, represents contributions made under the contracts, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contract value of the investment contracts at June 30, 2024 and 2023 was \$29,313 and \$23,637, respectively. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer. Such interest rates are reviewed on a periodic basis for resetting.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with TIAA. Such events include the following: (a) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (b) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (c) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (d) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The plan administrator does not believe that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with plan participants are probable of occurring.

The guaranteed investment contracts do not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Note 6 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right under the Plan to modify or discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of a termination of the Plan or complete discontinuance of Plan contributions, the plan administrator will notify all participants of the termination. As of the date of complete or partial termination, all participant accounts will become non-forfeitable to the extent that benefits are accrued.

Note 7 - Tax Status

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has concluded that as of June 30, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. With few exceptions, as of June 30, 2024, the plan administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to June 30, 2021.

Note 8 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Note 9 - Concentration of Credit Risk

The Plan has a substantial investment in TIAA-CREF fixed-rate annuity contracts which guarantee a return on principal invested. These accounts are backed by the general assets of the insurance company and, therefore, the performance of these investments is directly related to the financial stability of the insurance company. The fair value of \$379,659 and \$367,556 as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively, would be the maximum amount of loss due to credit risk should TIAA-CREF fail to perform according to the terms of the contracts and the collateral, if any, proved to be of no value.

Note 10 - Party-in-Interest and Related Party Transactions

Administrative services are provided by TIAA-CREF. As indicated in Note 2 to the financial statements, all of the Plan's assets are invested in investment contracts of TIAA-CREF. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan amounted to \$0 for the year ended June 30, 2024.

The Plan does not provide loans to participants. However, TIAA-CREF has made loans to participants collateralized by the individuals' account balances. The amount of such loans was approximately \$0 as of June 30, 2024 and 2023.

Certain Plan investments are managed by Principal Trust Company. Principal Trust Company is a trustee, as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan amounted to \$3,063 for the year ended June 30, 2024.

All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

Note 11 - Contingency

When a plan participant defaults on their loan agreement with TIAA-CREF that is collateralized by the individual's account balance, TIAA-CREF issues the individual a Form 1099 for the amount of default. Therefore, these amounts must be considered distributions to the participant for income tax purposes in the year of default. Even after the issuance of the Form 1099, TIAA-CREF maintains the assets in the Plan. Such assets, totaling \$0 at June 30, 2024 and 2023, are not reported in the accompanying financial statements as the plan administrator has taken the position that these assets have been distributed and therefore, no longer belong to the Plan.
