Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have audited the financial statements of Micro Stamping Corporation Employees' Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security of 1974 ("ERISA") as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C)"), which comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Opinion

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Note 1 – Description of Plan

The following description of the Micro Stamping Corporation Employees' Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information for the eligible employees of Micro Stamping Corporation (the "Plan Sponsor" or "Company"). Participants should refer to the Plan's agreements for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution profit sharing and salary reduction plan (401k) effective September 1, 1980. The Plan was restarted and amended effective March 1, 2007. Fidelity Management Trust Company (the "Trustee") serves as the trustee of the Plan. The Plan covers substantially all non-union employees 21 years of age or older upon their completion of a three-month probationary period. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The group responsible for oversight of the Plan is comprised of members of Company management and shareholders. This group works closely with an independent third-party financial advisor to determine the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors the Plan's investment performance.

Contributions

Employees may elect to contribute a percentage of their compensation up to a maximum of \$23,000 and \$22,500 for 2024 and 2023, respectively. In addition, employees who have attained age 50 before the close of the year shall be eligible to make additional catch-up contributions to a maximum of \$7,500 for both 2024 and 2023. The Plan's provisions allow each participant to designate some or all their elective deferrals as a Roth Deferral Contribution. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company is authorized to make an employer discretionary matching contribution and or an employer discretionary profit sharing contribution. The employer discretionary matching contribution is equal to a uniform percentage or dollar amount of the employee elective deferrals and each year the employer will determine the formula for the discretionary matching contribution. The Company determines, in its sole discretion, how much, if any, it will make as employer profit sharing contributions. Any employer discretionary profit sharing contribution will be allocated or divided among participants eligible to share in the contribution for the Plan year. The contribution will be allocated to each participant's account in the same proportion that compensation plus compensation more than the Social Security Taxable Wage Base (also called "excess compensation") bears to the total compensation plus "excess compensation" of all eligible participants. The Plan, by law, cannot recognize annual compensation more than \$345,000 and \$330,000 for 2024 and 2023, respectively. In addition, generally, the law imposes a maximum limit on the contributions that may be received under the Plan. This limit applies to all contributions made to the Plan, excluding earnings. This total cannot exceed the lesser of \$69,000 and \$66,000 for 2024 and 2023, respectively, or 100% of annual compensation.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is self-directed and is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's matching contribution, and Plan earnings (losses) and is directly charged with certain administrative expenses when incurred by that participant. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The sole benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's vested account.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited non-vested accounts as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$29,714 and \$22,384, respectively, and are available to pay administrative expenses incurred by the Plan. Any forfeitures not used to pay administrative expenses under the Plan can be applied to reduce the contributions of the Company for the immediately following Plan year. Any remaining forfeitures attributed to nonelective contributions may be allocated as an additional employer discretionary matching contribution. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no non-vested forfeited accounts used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there was \$27,129 and \$21,874, respectively, of non-vested forfeited account balances used to offset Company contributions.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in amounts attributable to employer contributions is based on years of continuous service. Participants are eligible to receive employer discretionary matching and nonelective contributions after completing three months of service, as defined in the Plan. Participants will vest 20% in employer discretionary matching and nonelective contributions after one year of service, as defined in the Plan, graduating annually until 100% vested with five or more years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The maximum number of loans a participant can have at any given time is limited to two. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at 3.25% to 8.50%. Principal and interest are repaid, to the Plan, ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions. Loans are secured by the participant's vested balance.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid and are payable at normal or early retirement age, upon attaining age 59 1/2, upon hardship or upon death or disability. A participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest, or the participant can elect annuity installments available only when the vested balance exceeds \$5,000. Participants may also obtain a cash withdrawal of all or a portion of the value of their vested contributions, including rollover contributions, based on hardship as permitted under the Plan.

Inter-Plan Transfers

Inter-plan transfers can occur when participants in the Company's union employees' pension plan become salaried employees and move their equity from the union employees' plan to this salaried employees' profit sharing plan with the same company and trustee. There were \$545,987 of net transfers from the Micro Stamping Corporation Pension Plan to the Micro Stamping Corporation Employees' Profit Sharing Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accounts of the Plan are maintained, and the accompanying financial statements have been prepared, on the modified cash basis, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("US GAAP"). The primary differences between the Plan's accounting basis and US GAAP is that interest on notes receivable from participants is recognized when received instead of when earned, accounting for contributions are recorded when received, and administrative expenses and return of excess contributions are recorded when paid, rather than recording such items on the accrual basis. Management has determined that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Accordingly, the financial statements are not intended to present the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits and the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits of the Plan in conformity with US GAAP.

Date of Management's Review of Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through September 22, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) at the date of the financial statements and changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) during the year. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates. Any adjustments applied to estimated amounts are recognized in the year such adjustments are determined.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are valued at their unpaid principal balance. Interest income is recorded on the modified cash basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded. Included in the benefit payments to participants are discharged loans amounting to \$33,194 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, as certified by the Trustee of the Plan. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to settle a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and the Trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurement. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded when received. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain administrative expenses are charged directly to a participant's account when incurred by that participant. All other expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor and will not be reimbursed by the Plan and are therefore excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Note 3 – Information Certified by Plan Trustee by the Plan's Trustee

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103.8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the Trustee has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Schedule H, Line 4(i) - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity and interest income from notes receivable from participants reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 4 – Fair Value Measurements

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). This hierarchy consists of three broad levels under Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) issued Accounting Standards Codification 820 and are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan can access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds

The fair values of mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common Collective Trust Fund

The common collective trust fund is valued at NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the Trustee using other observable inputs, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value since it is not probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. The NAV is based on the assets of the fund less its liabilities.

Note 5 – Related Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Company provides certain accounting and administrative services to the Plan for which no fees are charged and pays for certain expenses of maintaining the Plan which will not be reimbursed by the Plan.

Certain Plan investments are managed by the Trustee, or an affiliate of the Trustee. The Trustee is the recordkeeper and trustee for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Pursuant to the Plan documents, the Trustee (or an affiliate of the Trustee) receives revenue from mutual fund service providers for services it provides to the funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to the Trustee (or an affiliate of the Trustee) for its administrative services to the Plan.

If the revenue received by the Trustee (or an affiliate of the Trustee) from such mutual fund service providers exceeds the amount owed by the Plan, the Trustee (or an affiliate of the Trustee) remits the excess to the Plan's trust. Such amounts may be applied to pay Plan administrative expenses or allocated to the accounts of the participants. During the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no excess amounts. The Plan may make a payment to the Trustee (or an affiliate of the Trustee) for administrative expenses not covered by revenue sharing.

Note 6 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in a variety of investment funds at the direction of each individual participant. Investments in general are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall volatility risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near-term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis).

Note 7 – Tax Status

The Plan uses a prototype plan document sponsored by FMR LLC. FMR LLC received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), dated June 30, 2020, which stated that the prototype document satisfied the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (the "IRC"). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator, tax counsel and Trustee believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been made in the Plan's financial statements.

Note 7 – Tax Status (Continued)

The basis of accounting used by the Plan requires management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.
