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## Independent Auditor's Report

To the Participants and Plan Administrator of the

### ***Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit***

We have performed audits of the financial statements of OQ Chemicals Corporation Retirement Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information described in Note 4 to the financial statements is complete and accurate.

### ***Opinion***

#### **Note 1 – Plan Description**

The following description of the OQ Chemicals Corporation Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document or Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

##### ***General***

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan covering eligible employees of OQ Chemicals Corporation and participating employer, OQ Chemicals Bishop, LLC (collectively, the “Company” or “Employer”). The Plan commenced effective March 1, 2007, and was amended and restated effective January 1, 2022, to comply with current rules and regulations. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”) and the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”).

##### ***Plan Custodian and Trustees***

Voya Institutional Trust Company (“Voya” or the “Custodian”) is the Plan Custodian and maintains custody of all investments held by the Plan, maintains the Plan’s participant account balances, and provides recordkeeping services to the Plan. Among other duties, the Custodian receives contributions, holds and invests the fund assets in accordance with the directions of participants, and makes distributions as directed by the Company. Members of the Plan Administrative Committee serve as trustees of the Plan.

##### ***Eligibility and Plan Entrance Date***

Union employees are not eligible to participate in the Plan. All other employees aged 21 or older are eligible to participate in the Plan upon hire.

##### ***Contributions***

Participants may elect to contribute, on a pre-tax or Roth basis, up to the maximum amount allowed annually by the IRC, which was \$23,000 for 2024. Participants who reach the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions up to the maximum amount allowed annually by the IRC, which was \$7,500 for 2024. The Plan permits after-tax 401(k) contributions which are made with after-tax dollars and do not reduce the participants taxable income. After-tax contributions are not subject to the IRC limits. Participants also may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (“rollovers”).

The Plan provides for the following Employer contributions:

- a) A discretionary matching contribution of 100% of the first 5% of eligible compensation contributed by the participant. Matching contributions totaled \$1,606,359 for 2024.
- b) A nonelective discretionary profit-sharing contribution of 5% of eligible compensation for all participants. Profit-sharing contributions totaled \$1,865,921 for 2024.

##### ***Participant Accounts***

Each participant account is credited with the participant’s contributions, Employer’s contributions, allocations of net Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

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#### Note 1 – Plan Description (continued)

##### *Participant-Directed Investments*

All assets of the Plan are participant-directed investments. The Plan has selected various investment options, as more fully described in the Plan Document, and participants may direct the allocation of their account balances to one or more of these investment options, which vary in types of investments, rates of return, and investment risk.

##### *Vesting*

Participants are immediately vested in their pre-tax deferred and after-tax contributions, as well as any income or loss thereon. Employer contributions and earnings thereon are subject to vesting. Participants become fully vested in all Employer contributions and related earnings after completing three years of credited service with the Employer, or upon the participant's death, permanent disability, or retirement. Participants who separate from service prior to full vesting forfeit the nonvested portion of their account balance. For vesting purposes, the participants' period of service with Celanese Americas Corporation will be counted.

##### *Notes Receivable from Participants*

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. General loans may have terms of up to five years, while loans to purchase a principal residence may have terms of longer than five years. Interest rates on the loans are based on the current rates quoted by local financial institutions for similar loans. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions and are due in equal installments not less frequently than quarterly. Participants may have a maximum of two outstanding loans at any one time.

##### *Payment of Benefits*

Upon separation of service due to retirement, death, permanent disability, or termination of employment, a participant receives a distribution equal to the value of their vested account balance. Distributions are made according to the form of payment elected by the participant, within the limitations defined in the Plan.

Participants facing financial hardship, as defined by the Plan, are permitted to make hardship withdrawals in accordance with IRC regulations. Additionally, the Plan permits in-service withdrawals for participants aged 59½ and older.

##### *Forfeited Accounts*

Participants who terminate employment with the Company prior to full vesting forfeit the nonvested portion of their account balance. Forfeited nonvested accounts are used to reduce future Employer contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$628,251 and \$337,728, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures of \$140 were used to pay Plan administrative expenses.

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#### **Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

##### ***Basis of Accounting***

The Plan's financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

##### ***Use of Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, changes in those assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of Plan additions and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

##### ***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's trustees determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, Custodian, and insurance company. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold, as well as those held during the year.

##### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions on the basis of the terms of the Plan Agreement.

##### ***Payment of Benefits***

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

##### ***Administrative Expenses***

Loan origination fees associated with notes receivable from participants, check fees associated with distributions, and certain expenses incurred maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan and are reflected in the financial statements as administrative expenses. Investment management fees are charged to the Plan as a reduction of investment return and are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments. The Employer pays all other expenses of the Plan.

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#### Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1), and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) 820 are described as follows:

- **Level 1** – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.
- **Level 2** – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- **Level 3** – Inputs in the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- **Pooled Separate Accounts** – Valued using the net asset value (“NAV”) of units held by the Plan at year-end as provided by the Custodian. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, net of the investment management fee, and is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the pooled separate account, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months’ notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily, and there are no significant restrictions on participant redemptions or any unfunded commitments.

The following table sets forth by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan’s assets at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Classification within the fair value hierarchy table is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

The Plan’s independent auditor did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information with the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedules.

#### Note 5 – Guaranteed Investment Contracts

The Plan maintains guaranteed investment contract-related investment options, the Voya Fixed Account and Voya Fixed Account A, issued by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (“VRIAC”). The contract underlying these investment options meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria; thus, these investment contracts are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

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#### **Note 5 – Guaranteed Investment Contracts (continued)**

The guaranteed investment contracts are traditional investment contracts. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The Fixed Account minimum guaranteed interest rate, which is guaranteed for the lifetime of the contract, is 2.0%. The contracts cannot be terminated before the scheduled maturity date.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer, including, but not limited to, the following: (i) the Plan Sponsor provides effective communication to the Custodian that the agreement will be fully or partially terminated as of a date selected by the Company, which will be no earlier than thirty days after the date such communication is made; (ii) the Plan fails to meet the requirements of the applicable Code provision; (iii) termination or partial termination of the Plan; (iv) the Plan breaches a provision of the agreement; or (v) the Custodian provides effective communication to the Plan Sponsor that the agreement will be terminated as of a date at least ninety days after the date such communication is made.

The Plan Administrator does not believe that any events that might limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with both the contract issuer and the participants are likely to occur.

#### **Note 6 – Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions**

Certain Plan investments are units of pooled separate accounts or guaranteed investment contracts managed by the Custodian and qualify as party-in-interest transactions as defined by ERISA. Such transactions are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

As described in Note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to service providers. The Plan has notes receivable from participants as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. These receivables and all related transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions and are exempt from being prohibited by ERISA.

There have been no known prohibited transactions with parties-in-interest.

#### **Note 7 – Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time, and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their Employer contributions.

#### **Note 8 – Tax Status**

The Plan operates under an adoption agreement in connection with a standardized prototype profit-sharing plan and custodial document sponsored by Voya. This prototype plan document was filed with the appropriate agency, and Voya has obtained a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"), dated June 30, 2020, stating that the prototype plan constitutes a qualified plan under Section 401 of the IRC, and that the related trust was tax exempt as of the financial statement date.

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#### Note 8 – Tax Status (continued)

Although the Plan has not filed individually with the IRS for a letter regarding the Plan's qualified tax status, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC. As such, there has been no provision for income taxes made in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

#### Note 9 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rates, market, and credit risks. Because of the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

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#### **Note 11 – Prohibited Transactions**

The Company failed to remit to the Plan's Custodian certain participant contributions and participant loan repayments in the aggregate amount of \$598,553 within the period prescribed by DOL Rules and Regulations. The DOL considers late deposits to be nonexempt prohibited transactions. Delays in remitting contributions to the Custodian were due to unintentional administrative errors. During 2024, the Company corrected \$231,474 of these contributions and remitted potential lost earnings due to the delay. The Company is in the process of correcting the remaining \$367,079 of contributions to the affected participants' accounts to compensate those participants for potential lost earnings due to the delay.

#### **Note 12 – Subsequent Events**

The Company has evaluated subsequent events through August 31, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

During 2024, the Plan Sponsor became aware of a Plan operational error in the definition of eligible compensation used in the calculation of Employer contributions. The Plan Sponsor engaged an ERISA attorney to review the Plan's compensation definition and to provide guidance on corrective actions, if necessary. The outcome of this review could potentially impact participant balances and Employer contributions.

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## Independent Auditor's Report

### ***Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit***

We have performed audits of the financial statements of OQ Chemicals Corporation Retirement Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information described in Note 4 to the financial statements is complete and accurate.

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#### **Note 1 – Plan Description**

The following description of the OQ Chemicals Corporation Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document or Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

##### ***General***

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan covering eligible employees of OQ Chemicals Corporation and participating employer, OQ Chemicals Bishop, LLC (collectively, the “Company” or “Employer”). The Plan commenced effective March 1, 2007, and was amended and restated effective January 1, 2022, to comply with current rules and regulations. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”) and the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”).

##### ***Plan Custodian and Trustees***

Voya Institutional Trust Company (“Voya” or the “Custodian”) is the Plan Custodian and maintains custody of all investments held by the Plan, maintains the Plan’s participant account balances, and provides recordkeeping services to the Plan. Among other duties, the Custodian receives contributions, holds and invests the fund assets in accordance with the directions of participants, and makes distributions as directed by the Company. Members of the Plan Administrative Committee serve as trustees of the Plan.

##### ***Eligibility and Plan Entrance Date***

Union employees are not eligible to participate in the Plan. All other employees aged 21 or older are eligible to participate in the Plan upon hire.

##### ***Contributions***

Participants may elect to contribute, on a pre-tax or Roth basis, up to the maximum amount allowed annually by the IRC, which was \$23,000 for 2024. Participants who reach the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions up to the maximum amount allowed annually by the IRC, which was \$7,500 for 2024. The Plan permits after-tax 401(k) contributions which are made with after-tax dollars and do not reduce the participants taxable income. After-tax contributions are not subject to the IRC limits. Participants also may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (“rollovers”).

The Plan provides for the following Employer contributions:

- a) A discretionary matching contribution of 100% of the first 5% of eligible compensation contributed by the participant. Matching contributions totaled \$1,606,359 for 2024.
- b) A nonelective discretionary profit-sharing contribution of 5% of eligible compensation for all participants. Profit-sharing contributions totaled \$1,865,921 for 2024.

##### ***Participant Accounts***

Each participant account is credited with the participant’s contributions, Employer’s contributions, allocations of net Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

### Notes to the Financial Statements December 31, 2024 and 2023

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#### Note 1 – Plan Description (continued)

##### *Participant-Directed Investments*

All assets of the Plan are participant-directed investments. The Plan has selected various investment options, as more fully described in the Plan Document, and participants may direct the allocation of their account balances to one or more of these investment options, which vary in types of investments, rates of return, and investment risk.

##### *Vesting*

Participants are immediately vested in their pre-tax deferred and after-tax contributions, as well as any income or loss thereon. Employer contributions and earnings thereon are subject to vesting. Participants become fully vested in all Employer contributions and related earnings after completing three years of credited service with the Employer, or upon the participant's death, permanent disability, or retirement. Participants who separate from service prior to full vesting forfeit the nonvested portion of their account balance. For vesting purposes, the participants' period of service with Celanese Americas Corporation will be counted.

##### *Notes Receivable from Participants*

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. General loans may have terms of up to five years, while loans to purchase a principal residence may have terms of longer than five years. Interest rates on the loans are based on the current rates quoted by local financial institutions for similar loans. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions and are due in equal installments not less frequently than quarterly. Participants may have a maximum of two outstanding loans at any one time.

##### *Payment of Benefits*

Upon separation of service due to retirement, death, permanent disability, or termination of employment, a participant receives a distribution equal to the value of their vested account balance. Distributions are made according to the form of payment elected by the participant, within the limitations defined in the Plan.

Participants facing financial hardship, as defined by the Plan, are permitted to make hardship withdrawals in accordance with IRC regulations. Additionally, the Plan permits in-service withdrawals for participants aged 59½ and older.

##### *Forfeited Accounts*

Participants who terminate employment with the Company prior to full vesting forfeit the nonvested portion of their account balance. Forfeited nonvested accounts are used to reduce future Employer contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$628,251 and \$337,728, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures of \$140 were used to pay Plan administrative expenses.

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#### **Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

##### ***Basis of Accounting***

The Plan's financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

##### ***Use of Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, changes in those assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of Plan additions and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

##### ***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's trustees determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, Custodian, and insurance company. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold, as well as those held during the year.

##### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions on the basis of the terms of the Plan Agreement.

##### ***Payment of Benefits***

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

##### ***Administrative Expenses***

Loan origination fees associated with notes receivable from participants, check fees associated with distributions, and certain expenses incurred maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan and are reflected in the financial statements as administrative expenses. Investment management fees are charged to the Plan as a reduction of investment return and are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments. The Employer pays all other expenses of the Plan.

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#### Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1), and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) 820 are described as follows:

- **Level 1** – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.
- **Level 2** – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- **Level 3** – Inputs in the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- **Pooled Separate Accounts** – Valued using the net asset value (“NAV”) of units held by the Plan at year-end as provided by the Custodian. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, net of the investment management fee, and is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the pooled separate account, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months’ notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily, and there are no significant restrictions on participant redemptions or any unfunded commitments.

The following table sets forth by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan’s assets at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Classification within the fair value hierarchy table is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

#### Note 5 – Guaranteed Investment Contracts

The Plan maintains guaranteed investment contract-related investment options, the Voya Fixed Account and Voya Fixed Account A, issued by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (“VRIAC”). The contract underlying these investment options meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria; thus, these investment contracts are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

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#### **Note 5 – Guaranteed Investment Contracts (continued)**

The guaranteed investment contracts are traditional investment contracts. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The Fixed Account minimum guaranteed interest rate, which is guaranteed for the lifetime of the contract, is 2.0%. The contracts cannot be terminated before the scheduled maturity date.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer, including, but not limited to, the following: (i) the Plan Sponsor provides effective communication to the Custodian that the agreement will be fully or partially terminated as of a date selected by the Company, which will be no earlier than thirty days after the date such communication is made; (ii) the Plan fails to meet the requirements of the applicable Code provision; (iii) termination or partial termination of the Plan; (iv) the Plan breaches a provision of the agreement; or (v) the Custodian provides effective communication to the Plan Sponsor that the agreement will be terminated as of a date at least ninety days after the date such communication is made.

The Plan Administrator does not believe that any events that might limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with both the contract issuer and the participants are likely to occur.

#### **Note 6 – Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions**

Certain Plan investments are units of pooled separate accounts or guaranteed investment contracts managed by the Custodian and qualify as party-in-interest transactions as defined by ERISA. Such transactions are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

As described in Note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to service providers. The Plan has notes receivable from participants as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. These receivables and all related transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions and are exempt from being prohibited by ERISA.

There have been no known prohibited transactions with parties-in-interest.

#### **Note 7 – Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time, and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their Employer contributions.

#### **Note 8 – Tax Status**

The Plan operates under an adoption agreement in connection with a standardized prototype profit-sharing plan and custodial document sponsored by Voya. This prototype plan document was filed with the appropriate agency, and Voya has obtained a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"), dated June 30, 2020, stating that the prototype plan constitutes a qualified plan under Section 401 of the IRC, and that the related trust was tax exempt as of the financial statement date.

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#### Note 8 – Tax Status (continued)

Although the Plan has not filed individually with the IRS for a letter regarding the Plan's qualified tax status, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC. As such, there has been no provision for income taxes made in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

#### Note 9 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rates, market, and credit risks. Because of the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

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#### **Note 11 – Prohibited Transactions**

The Company failed to remit to the Plan's Custodian certain participant contributions and participant loan repayments in the aggregate amount of \$598,553 within the period prescribed by DOL Rules and Regulations. The DOL considers late deposits to be nonexempt prohibited transactions. Delays in remitting contributions to the Custodian were due to unintentional administrative errors. During 2024, the Company corrected \$231,474 of these contributions and remitted potential lost earnings due to the delay. The Company is in the process of correcting the remaining \$367,079 of contributions to the affected participants' accounts to compensate those participants for potential lost earnings due to the delay.

#### **Note 12 – Subsequent Events**

The Company has evaluated subsequent events through August 31, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

During 2024, the Plan Sponsor became aware of a Plan operational error in the definition of eligible compensation used in the calculation of Employer contributions. The Plan Sponsor engaged an ERISA attorney to review the Plan's compensation definition and to provide guidance on corrective actions, if necessary. The outcome of this review could potentially impact participant balances and Employer contributions.
