## **Note 1. Description of Plan**

The following description of the Info Tech, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

### ***General***

The Plan, which was established on July 1, 1989, and subsequently amended and restated, is classified as a defined-contribution plan, covering full-time and certain part-time employees of Info Tech, Inc. (the “Company”/“Employer”) with no minimum service requirement (except for interns or provisional employees, who must complete one year of service, defined as working at least 1,000 hours during the 12-month period immediately following the date of hire). Leased employees, as defined, are excluded from the Plan. The purpose of the Plan is to reward eligible employees of the Company for long and loyal service by providing them with retirement benefits. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Company’s 401(k) Plan Committee is named the Plan administrator and is responsible for oversight of the Plan and determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and reports to the Board of Directors.

The Plan provides for eligible participants to be automatically enrolled in the Plan, unless they affirmatively decline to participate.

In March 2025, the Plan adopted an amendment to change the Plan name to Info Tech 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan.

### ***Contributions***

Each year, participants may contribute a percentage of their pre-tax or after-tax (Roth) annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. The Plan currently includes a Qualified Automatic Contribution Arrangement (“QACA”) Safe Harbor provision. Under this provision, the Company makes Safe Harbor matching contributions of 100% of deferrals up to 1% of pre-tax compensation, as defined in the Plan, plus 50% of deferrals on the next 5% of compensation, measured on an annual basis. In addition, the Company may also make additional discretionary matching contributions, as well as profit-sharing contributions, as defined in the Plan. Employees must be employed on the last day of the applicable Plan year to be eligible to receive discretionary Employer contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company did not make any additional discretionary contributions to the Plan.

### ***Participant Investment Account Options***

Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may elect to have their employee and Employer contributions, and related earnings thereon, allocated to one or more investment options held with Matrix Trust Company (the “Plan Trustee”).

### ***Participant Accounts***

Under the Plan, a separate account is maintained for each participant. Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of the Company’s contribution and Plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s account.

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***Vesting***

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their accounts is based on years of continuous service.

***Participant Notes Receivable***

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, or one-half of their vested account balance. Participant notes receivable transactions are treated as a transfer to (from) the Investment Fund from (to) the Participant Notes Receivable Fund. Participants may not have more than two notes receivable outstanding from the Plan at the same time. The notes are collateralized by the balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at a rate equal to the Prime Rate plus 1%, as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

***Payment of Benefits***

Upon the death, permanent disability, or retirement of participants at the age of 59 and a half, their entire account balances become fully vested. Distribution of benefits may be made in one lump-sum cash payment or, upon retirement, in installments, based upon the participant’s life expectancy at the time of retirement. Participants who terminate for reasons other than death, disability, or retirement are entitled only to their vested balances payable in a lump-sum distribution. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no unpaid amounts allocated to participants who elected to withdraw from the Plan but had not yet been paid.

***Forfeited Accounts***

Forfeitures of terminated participants’ non-vested accounts are used to reduce Company contributions otherwise payable for the Plan year in which such forfeitures arise, and for each succeeding Plan year, if necessary, until such forfeitures have been exhausted. At both December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had approximately \$1,000 of forfeited, non-vested accounts, which will be used to reduce future Employer contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures in the amount of approximately \$1,000 were used to offset Employer contributions.

## **Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

### ***Basis of Accounting***

The financial statements of the Plan are presented on the accrual basis of accounting.

### ***Use of Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### ***Noninterest-bearing Cash***

Noninterest-bearing cash primarily represents contribution remittances received by the Plan but not yet traded as of year-end.

### ***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

The Plan's investments include registered investment companies, which are stated at fair value, as well as an insurance company general account, which is stated at contract value.

Investments held in registered investment companies are recorded at their reported net asset value ("NAV"), which is computed based on the estimated fair value of the funds' underlying securities, less any fund liabilities. Valuation methods used by the Plan Trustee are based on quoted market prices, if available, as well as quotes from pricing services and brokers.

Purchases and sales of marketable securities are reflected on a trade-date basis, and interest income is recorded as earned on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. The net depreciation in the fair value of the Plan's investments include the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as the unrealized gains and losses on those investments that are held at the end of the year.

The valuation methods used by the Plan may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is deemed to be the relevant measurement attribute for those contracts, because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions and reinvested income, less any withdrawals and administrative expenses, plus accrued interest. The Plan's investments in the AUL Stable Value Account (the "AUL Stable Value Account"), which is held in an insurance company general account, are deemed to be fully benefit-responsive and, therefore, are stated at contract value (see Note 4).

### ***Administration and Other Costs***

Plan administration costs charged to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024 were approximately \$109,000. Certain other administration costs are paid by the Company. Investment fees, commissions, and related expenses are included in net change in fair value of investments in these financial statements.

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***Risks and Uncertainties***

The Plan's investments are not insured and are subject to credit and market risks. Financial information relating to those investments is included in these financial statements, based on information provided by the Plan Trustee.

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, markets, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and due to recent market volatility, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

***Participant Notes Receivable***

Participant notes receivable are recorded at their unpaid principal balance, plus accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan Document.

***Contributions***

Company contributions to the Plan are recorded in the period in which they become obligations of the Company.

***Payment of Benefits***

Benefits are recorded when paid.

***Subsequent Events***

In preparing these financial statements, the Company has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition through September 19, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**Note 3. Certification of Plan Trustee**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Matrix Trust Company, a qualified institution, has certified the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and participant notes receivable as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023
- Investment income and interest income from participant notes receivable as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024
- Investment information and participant notes receivable included in the accompanying schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

**Note 4. Disclosure About Fair Value Measurement of Plan Assets and Liabilities**

The fair value of financial instruments is presented based upon a hierarchy of levels that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy, under Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification ("FASB ASC") 820-10 are described as follows:

- Level 1** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2** Inputs to the valuation methodology that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

### **Note 5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contracts**

The AUL Stable Value Account, which is held in an insurance company general account, is a fixed annuity product issued by American United Life Insurance Company ("AUL"). It is an interest-earning investment option which is deemed fully benefit-responsive, provides a guarantee of principal, and is backed by AUL's general account assets. An interest rate is declared prior to the beginning of a calendar year and is guaranteed for the year until the new rate is set for the next year. Participants invested in the AUL Stable Value Account can transfer money into and out of the account without any restrictions. However, employer-initiated withdrawals, such as removal of the investment option, may be restricted by AUL for up to 365 days. AUL Stable Value Account investments primarily consist of a mix of high-quality corporate and agency securities, as well as direct commercial mortgages, with very limited exposure to equities or alternative securities. The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with a fully benefit-responsive contract is dependent upon the contract issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. There are no reserves against contract values for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

### **Note 6. Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right, under the Plan, to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

### **Note 7. Income Tax Status**

The Plan is designed to be a qualified trust under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") and is subject to the provisions of ERISA. Effective January 1, 2022, the Plan adopted a Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan with CODA, sponsored by OneAmerica Financial Partners, Inc., which received a favorable opinion letter dated August 19, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan with CODA, as then designed, qualified under Section 401 of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receiving the most recent opinion letter. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan, as currently amended, is designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's accompanying financial statements.
