Notes to the Financial Statements
For the Year Ended December 31, 2024

(1) Description of the Plan

The following description of the St. Mary & All Angels Christian Church Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan documents, as amended, for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan, a defined contribution plan sponsored by St. Mary & All Angels Christian Church (the "Organization" or "Employer"), pursuant to section 401(k) and related provisions of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"), was established on January 1, 2004, and restated effective January 1, 2022. The Plan is designed to provide participants with a means to defer a portion of their compensation for retirement and to provide benefits in the event of disability, death, termination or financial hardship. The Plan covers certain employees of the Organization who meet certain eligibility requirements. It is subject to the provisions of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA"). The Plan's custodian is American United Life Insurance Company ("AUL" or the "Custodian").

An expansion of Setting Every Community up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 (SECURE 2.0) was signed into law on December 29, 2022, as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023. The effective dates of provisions within SECURE 2.0 vary through 2026. The Plan Sponsor has until the end of the first plan year beginning on or after January 1, 2025, to amend the Plan for the changes related to SECURE 2.0. The Plan has not been formally amended to adopt these provisions as of the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Plan administration

The Organization is the administrator of the Plan and, as such, carries out the duties imposed by ERISA. The Organization has delegated certain responsibilities for the operation and administration of the Plan. Recordkeeping services are provided by an affiliate of AUL. Certain administrative expenses, including audit fees, were paid directly by the Organization for the year ended December 31, 2024. Loan set up and maintenance fees are paid by the individual participants receiving a loan. Investment fees, which may vary according to the individual funds selected, are deducted directly from the investment fund balance. Participants should refer to the prospectus of the individual investment funds for further details on the fund's investment fees.

Eligibility

Employees covered under the Plan include all employees, except those who are union employees, nonresident aliens, leased employees, temporary substitute teachers, or seasonal employees. Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan upon reaching age 18 and completing 90 days of service. In order to be eligible for discretionary Employer nonelective profit sharing contributions, the employee must complete at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year and be employed on the last day of the Plan year.

Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute through payroll deductions amounts up to 100% of their annual eligible compensation as defined by the Plan, on a tax-deferred basis, and the maximum amount allowed by the IRC. Maximum allowed deferral amount was \$23,500 for 2024. Participants over the age of 50, before the end of the Plan year, may also contribute an additional \$7,500 catch-up contribution to the Plan for 2024. The Plan automatically enrolls all eligible employees in the Plan at a deferral rate of 4% of eligible compensation. Participants are also allowed to rollover contributions from other qualified employer-sponsored retirement plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Organization will make safe harbor matching contributions of 100% of a participant's elected deferral, up to 4% of eligible compensation. The Organization may, at its discretion, elect to make discretionary matching or employer nonelective profit sharing contributions to the Plan. There were no discretionary employer nonelective profit sharing or discretionary matching contributions made to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024. For the year ended December 31, 2024, employer safe harbor matching contributions were \$399,271.

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and adjusted for allocations of the Organization's contributions and Plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. Participant accounts are charged for Plan expenses and Plan investment losses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and the Organization's employer contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants ("participant loans" or "loans") are issued directly from participant's account balance. Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear a reasonable rate of interest at the time the loan is taken. The repayment of principal plus interest is required by the Plan to be made through semi-monthly payroll deductions over five years, unless the loan is used for the purchase of a primary residence. Interest rates on outstanding participant loans range between 2.00% to 5.00% as of December 31, 2024. Participant loans outstanding as of December 31, 2024, have various maturity dates through March 2034.

Payment of benefits

Distributions and withdrawals are payable upon retirement, termination, financial hardship, disability or death. If a participant's account balance is equal to or less than \$5,000, the balance will be distributed immediately in a lump-sum cash payment unless a direct rollover into another qualified benefit plan is requested. If the account balance is over \$5,000, the participant can consent to either a distribution paid in the form of a lump-sum cash payment, a direct rollover into another qualified plan or postpone payment to a later date and remain in the Plan as described in the Plan document.

In addition to the foregoing, participants are permitted to request in-service distributions from their vested Plan accounts at any time after having attained age 59 ½. Also, participants may request a distribution of their vested contribution accounts upon incurring financial hardship, as defined in the Plan.

Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses are generally paid by the Organization, but may, at the discretion of the plan administrator, be paid by the Plan. Transaction fees for certain participant-initiated activities are charged to the specific account of the participant initiating any such transaction. The Plan is not required to reimburse the Organization for expenses paid on its behalf.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent liabilities. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities could occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefit and changes therein.

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (Note 4). Contract value represents contributions made under a contract, plus interest, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses (Note 5).

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on sale of investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. An allowance for credit losses has been recognized as of December 31, 2024, for deemed distributions of participant loans in the amount of \$22,032. No allowance was recognized for 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the participant loan is determined to be a distribution, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a deemed distribution is recorded.

Contributions and contributions receivable

Contributions from participants are recorded based on the date the contributions or repayments have been separated from a participant's pay by the Organization, which is the pay date. The Plan records receivables for contributions based upon contributions recorded in the Plan year but received by the Plan subsequent to year end. Rollover contributions from participants are recorded based on the date the contributions are received by the Custodian.

Payment of benefits

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses are recorded when incurred.

(3) Information Prepared and Certified by Custodian (Unaudited)

The plan administrator, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(c) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of ERISA. Accordingly, the Custodian, determined to be a qualified institution by the plan administrator, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of:

- b. Total investment income, interest and dividends, interest income on notes receivable from participants, and revenue sharing, reflected on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024;
- c. Investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

Accordingly, as requested by the Plan administrator, the Plan's independent auditors performed no audit procedures on the certified information other than to agree the certified information to the related information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule.

(4) Fair Value Measurements

Accounting standards establish a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to measurements involving significant unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of fair value hierarchy are as follows:

- a. *Level 1* – inputs that are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.
- b. *Level 2* – inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices in active markets for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full-term of the assets or liabilities,
- c. *Level 3* – unobservable inputs for the asset or liability that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

(4) Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value as of December 31, 2024, and 2023:

- *Separate Accounts* – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the accumulation unit published each day. Separate accounts held by the Plan are in the form of accumulation units. The value of the accumulation unit is determined at the close of each business day and is directly related to the net asset value of the shares of underlying investment adjusted for any dividends or distributions received and the daily equivalent of any fee charged pursuant to the contract. The value of each accumulation unit is published each business day. Each investment account is invested exclusively in shares of a specific mutual fund or other investment entities as directed by the contract holder and/or the participant.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

(5) Guaranteed Annuity Contract with Custodian

The AUL Stable Value Fund is a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed annuity contract. Contributions are deposited into a non-unitized separate account. The contract provides a guaranteed effective interest rate of 1.46% and 0.98% for the years ended December 31, 2024, and 2023, respectively. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The fund is included in the financial statements at contract value as reported to the Plan by AUL. Contract value represents accumulated cash contributions made under the contract, plus interest credited to the contracts, less participant withdrawals and transfers. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all, or a portion, of their investment at contract value.

(5) Guaranteed Annuity Contract with Custodian

The AUL Stable Value Fund totaled \$13,503 and \$51,790 at December 31, 2024, and 2023, respectively.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due from the AUL contract is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations, which may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable at this time.

The AUL contract does not permit the respective issuer to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity dates, and as long as the Plan holds assets with AUL, the Plan is required to keep the AUL Stable Value Account as an investment option in the Plan.

(6) Related Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions

ERISA defines parties-in-interest similarly to the definition of a related party under accounting standards, except that ERISA's definition is broader and includes all entities and individuals that provide services to the Plan; however, these entities may not necessarily be related parties. Management did not identify any related parties to the Plan that were not also considered to be parties-in-interest.

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, and an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association or relatives of such persons.

Certain Plan investments offered under the Plan are managed by AUL. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

Notes receivable from participants and the related interest income are also considered party-in-interest transactions.

The Custodian retains as compensation for services provided to the Plan, any interest on amounts earned while certain transactions are pending, which applies to both contributions and distributions. Earnings are at institutional money market rates.

The investment options of the Plan include various portfolios within an AUL separate account. The separate account in turn invests in investment portfolios of certain open-end management companies. AUL receives indirect compensation from these investment companies for the services provided by AUL. The compensation computed by AUL is computed by each investment company by multiplying the daily account balance of the AUL separate account's interest in a particular portfolio by a predetermined rate negotiated with the investment company. Revenue sharing for the period ended December 31, 2024, was \$27,594.

(7) Tax Status

The Plan adopted a Non-standardized Pre-Approved Profit-Sharing Plan document through One America Financial Partners, Inc., the Plan's recordkeeper. The Internal Revenue Service has issued an opinion letter dated November 13, 2020, stating that the Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC and is appropriate for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

(8) Plan Termination

Although the Organization has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, amounts allocated to a participants' account become fully vested.

(9) Subsequent events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 16, 2025, the date the financial statements were available for issuance. No subsequent events have occurred that would have a material impact on the presentation of the Plan's financial statements.
