Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1: Description of Plan

The following description of the Eppstein Uhen Architects, Inc. 401(k) Savings Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 ("SECURE 2.0"), signed into law on December 29, 2022, makes significant changes to existing law for retirement plans by building upon provisions in the SECURE Act of 2019. SECURE 2.0 introduces new requirements and considerations for plan sponsors that are intended to expand coverage, increase savings, preserve income, and simplify plan rules and administrative procedures. The effective date of the provisions of SECURE 2.0 vary from becoming effective immediately through 2028. Those provisions include both required and optional elements. Management has evaluated those provisions and determined there is no material impact on the Plan. Plan management will determine the optional provision(s) to elect in the future.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by Eppstein Uhen Architects, Inc. (the "Company") and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA"). Substantially all employees, except leased employees, are eligible to participate in the Plan and receive Company matching contributions, if any, after completing one month of employment and attaining age 21. Employees may become a participant in the Plan on the first day of the month following completion of eligibility requirements. The Company's Plan Administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan Administrator determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

Participants may contribute 1% to 50% of their total compensation, as defined by the Plan, not to exceed the annual maximum allowable by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"). Participants may also contribute distributions from other qualified plans ("rollovers").

The Company may also make a discretionary matching and profit sharing contribution. In 2024 and 2023, the Company elected to match \$.50 per every \$1.00 of the first 7% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. In order for a participant to receive a discretionary profit sharing contribution, the participant must have worked at least 1,000 hours in a given year and be employed on the last day of the year. The Company did not make a discretionary profit sharing contribution in 2024 or 2023.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit sharing contribution and Plan earnings (losses). Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings (losses) or account balances, as defined in the Plan. The balance to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1: Description of Plan (Continued)

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings (losses) thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions, plus actual earnings (losses) thereon, is based on the number of years of service, as defined by the Plan, as shown by the following:

6 or more	100 %

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, participants become fully vested in their account balances.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate determined quarterly by the Plan Administrator. Interest rates on existing notes varied from 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits may be paid to the participant or beneficiary upon death, disability, retirement or termination of employment, as defined in the Plan document. The Plan provides for normal retirement at age 65. The total vested portion of a participant's account balance is distributed in the form of a lump-sum payment or partial withdrawals, provided the participant's vested account balance exceeds \$5,000. If the participant's vested balance does not exceed \$5,000, the balance may only be distributed in a single lump-sum payment. Participants of any age experiencing financial hardship may withdraw a portion of this account balance as defined in the Plan document. In-service withdrawals without a financial hardship can begin at age 59 1/2.

Forfeitures

Plan forfeitures arise as a result of participants who terminate service with the Company before becoming 100% vested in the Company's contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$45 and \$0, respectively. Forfeitures may be used to pay administrative expenses or reduce future Company contributions. During 2024 and 2023, \$23,790 and \$8,820, respectively, were used to pay administrative expenses for the Company.

Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Use of Estimates in Preparation of Financial Statements

The preparation of the accompanying financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments include the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent participant notes receivable are recorded as benefit payments on the basis of the terms of the plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan permits the payment of Plan expenses to be made from the Plan assets. If expenses are paid using the Plan's assets, then the expenses will generally be allocated among the accounts of all participants of the Plan. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 23, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3: Fair Value Measurements

GAAP establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority level. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1). Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. There are no Plan assets requiring the use of Level 2 or 3 inputs for the periods presented.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024, and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective trust: Valued as determined by the issuer of the common collective trust using NAV per share measurement. The Putnam Stable Value Fund ("Stable Value Fund") is a common collective trust with underlying investments in fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. The objective is to maintain safety of principal while generating a level of current income exceeding that of a money market. The Stable Value Fund seeks to maintain a stable \$1.00 unit value although there is no guarantee it will be able to do so. The Stable Value Fund invests in traditional and synthetic guaranteed income contracts with various crediting formulas. The Stable Value Fund's manager may limit withdrawals in order to maintain sufficient liquidity.

Investments in the Stable Value Fund can be purchased and sold continuously. A notice of redemption is not required. The Plan has no obligation to buy additional units.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 4: Information Prepared and Certified by Trustee

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Certain information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental Schedule H, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year), including cash and investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest and dividends for the years then ended, and the valuation of notes receivable from participants and applicable interest earned, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Matrix Trust Company, trustee of the Plan.

Note 5: Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their Company contributions.

Note 6: Tax Status

The Company adopted a nonstandard prototype document with an IRS notification letter which states the prototype plan document is in compliance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter; however, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and has no income subject to unrelated business income tax. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Note 7: Related-Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. Additionally, the Plan issues notes to participants, which are secured by the participant's account balances. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Note 8: Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Note 9: Prohibited Transactions

Under DOL Reg. 2510.3-102(b), the Sponsor is required to remit the employee contributions to the Plan at the earliest date such amounts can be reasonably segregated from the Sponsor's general assets, but no later than the fifteenth business day of the month following the date that participant contributions are withheld by the Sponsor. As reported on Schedule H, Line 4a – Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions, contributions for one payroll during the Plan year ended December 31, 2024, totaling \$96,471, were remitted outside the 15-day requirement. This transaction constitutes a prohibited transaction as defined by ERISA. The correction was made during the Plan year ended December 31, 2024.
