Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Greater St. Louis Service Employees' Pension Trust 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Greater St. Louis Service Employees' Pension Trust 401(k) Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Greater St. Louis Service Employees' Pension Trust 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

Our audits were conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the financial statements as a whole. The supplemental Schedules of Assets (Held at End of Year) and Delinquent Participant Contributions, are presented for the purpose of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion, the information in the accompanying schedules is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the financial statements as a whole, and the form and content are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

1. Plan Description

The following description of the Plan is provided for financial reporting purposes. Participants of the Plan should refer to the plan document and summary plan description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was established January 1, 2002, amended and restated as of November 1, 2020, and is a multiemployer defined contribution plan as defined by Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") serving employers who are members of the Local 1 Service Employees International Union - Missouri Division (the "Union"). The Plan covers all employees for whom contributions must be made according to the terms of a collective bargaining agreement ("CBA") with contributing employers (the "Employers"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as amended.

The Plan is administered by a joint board of trustees (the "Trustees") consisting of two representatives of the Union and two representatives of Employers.

Eligibility

Eligibility varies based on the terms of CBAs with the Employers.

Contributions

For each Plan year, employees can elect to defer a portion of their compensation up to the maximum amount allowed by applicable law. Each Employer may make a discretionary matching contribution if stated in the CBA. Any matching contributions will be a percentage of the elective contribution or a set amount according to the terms of the CBA. Employers must pay an amount negotiated in the CBA for each hour worked for its employees each month or a fixed amount per month per employee. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined contribution plans if allowed by their respective CBA.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and the Employer's contributions, if applicable, and allocations of the Plan's earnings and administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting and Forfeitures

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Employer's contribution portion of their account plus earnings is based on years of service, as defined in the plan document, in accordance with the following schedule:

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the forfeited nonvested account totaled \$23,081 and \$37,595, respectively. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$58,614 and \$59,429, respectively, was used to pay administrative expenses and fund uncollected and delinquent Employer contributions or elective deferral contributions from forfeited nonvested accounts.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The plan document includes provisions authorizing loans from the Plan to active eligible participants if Employers allow for the repayments. Participants may borrow from their account balance a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The maximum number of loans available to any participant is one. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate is set at the prime rate (7.65 at December 31, 2024) plus one percent, as defined in the plan document. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Prior to separation from service with an Employer, a participant may request a distribution of rollover contributions. In the event of a financial hardship, certain participant funds, as defined in the plan document, may be requested for distribution. In-service distributions may also be requested by participants who are at least age 59 1/2.

Upon retirement after the age of 65, becoming permanently or totally disabled during employment, or death, participants become fully vested and the account balance is paid in a lump sum payment. Upon early retirement or termination, that portion of the participant's account that is vested is paid in a lump sum payment.

Effective January 1, 2023, the Trustees approved an amendment on September 26, 2024, for the Plan to adhere to the requirements under the SECURE Act to extend the required beginning date for required minimum distributions to participants who attain age 72.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB"), Accounting Standards Codification (the "FASB ASC"), which is the source of authoritative, non-governmental accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP"). All references to authoritative accounting guidance contained in our disclosures are based on the general accounting topics within the FASB ASC.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Fair Value Measurements

The Plan follows guidance issued by the FASB on fair value measurements, which establishes a framework for measuring fair value, clarifies the definition of fair value within that framework, and expands disclosures about the use of fair value measurements. This guidance applies whenever fair value is the applicable measurement. The three general valuation techniques used to measure fair value are the market approach, cost approach, and income approach.

Employer Contributions Receivable

Employer contributions receivable represents Employer contributions due to the Plan for hours worked prior to the end of the Plan year, but not yet received by year-end. Employer contributions receivables are reported at their outstanding balances, net of an estimate made for credit losses. Management estimates the allowance for credit losses by regularly evaluating individual Employer receivables and considering an Employer's financial condition, payment history, and current economic conditions, and management's expectations of conditions in the future. Employer contributions receivables are written off when deemed uncollectible. Management is of the opinion that no allowance for credit losses is necessary as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Employer contributions are due by the 15th of the month following the month hours are worked. Contributions not received by the 15th of the month are considered past due.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent loans are treated as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan permits the payment of Plan expenses from Plan assets. The expenses paid using Plan assets will generally be allocated among the accounts of all participants in the Plan. These expenses will be allocated either proportionately based on the value of the account balances or as an equal dollar amount based on the number of participants in the Plan. The method of allocating the expenses depends on the nature of the expense. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through July 31, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation method to include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets, inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, or inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The instruments' fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Level 1 investments consist of mutual funds. Mutual funds are recorded at the daily closing price as reported by the funds. These are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Investments at fair value also include a common collective trust fund valued at the net asset value ("NAV") of shares of the bank collective trust held by the Plan at year-end. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund. The NAV is used as the practical expedient to estimate fair value. Investments that are measured at NAV per share (or its equivalent) have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy.

4. Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Qualified Benefit Consultants, Inc. d/b/a Ekon Benefits, is the recordkeeper of the Plan's activity and provides certain administrative services for the Plan. The administrative service fees paid by the Plan for these services amounted to \$34,511 and \$34,314 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

5. Plan Amendments

The Trustees approved an amendment on December 12, 2024, to be effective January 1, 2025, for the Plan to adhere to the requirements under the SECURE Act to clarify when distributions to sole beneficiary begin.

6. Plan Termination

Although they have not expressed any intent to do so, the Trustees have the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to ERISA guidelines. The Plan may be terminated by the Trustees one year after the date when there is no longer in force any CBAs requiring contributions to the Plan. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in the Employers contribution portion of their account.

7. Tax Status of Plan

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Plan's Trustees by a letter dated July 9, 2015, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. Management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

In accordance with GAAP, the Plan's management is required to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authority. The Plan's management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken, or expected to be taken, that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. Management believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021. The Plan is subject to routine audits by the Department of Labor, generally for six years after the statutory due date of the annual information return. There are currently no audits in progress for any tax periods.

8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

9. Delinquent Participant Contributions

In 2024, certain Employers failed to remit certain participant contributions totaling \$1,131 to the Plan on the earliest date these amounts should reasonably have been submitted. Late remittances of participant contributions constitute a prohibited transaction under ERISA. Lost earnings and excise taxes for 2024 have not yet been calculated and remitted as of the report date.
