We have performed audits of the financial statements of Farmers Mutual Insurance Company of Nebraska Employee Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of February 28, 2025 and February 29, 2024, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institutions as of and for the years ended February 28, 2025 and February 29, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### ***Opinion***

Notes to Financial Statements

**(1) Description of the Plan**

The following brief description of the Farmers Mutual Insurance Company of Nebraska Employee Retirement Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for more complete information.

**(a) General**

The Plan is a defined benefit plan sponsored by Farmers Mutual Insurance Company of Nebraska (the Company or Plan Sponsor or Employer). Each employee of the Company who has completed one full year of continuous employment (at least 1,000 hours) and who is at least 21 years of age is eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Employee Benefits Committee of the Board of Directors is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Employee Benefits Committee has retained an ERISA Section 3(38) Investment Advisor to assume the role of a fiduciary for the asset allocation services provided to the Plan. The tasks of (1) establishing the asset allocation; (2) implementing the investment strategy; and (3) monitoring the investment options have been delegated to the ERISA Section 3(38) Investment Advisor.

**(b) Pension Benefits**

Employees with five or more years of service, or upon reaching age 65 while employed by the Company, are entitled to annual pension benefits beginning at normal retirement age (65). The Plan provides for accrued retirement benefits to be determined by taking 1.2% of final average earnings, as defined in the plan agreement (the participant's average annual compensation for the five highest consecutive years of compensation among the last 10 years of employment preceding termination or retirement), multiplied by years of service plus 0.5% of final average earnings in excess of covered compensation (as defined in the plan agreement) multiplied by years of service that is not in excess of 35 years. The Plan permits early retirement at ages 55 to 64. If employees terminate before rendering five years of service, they forfeit the right to receive the portion of their accumulated plan benefits attributable to the Company's contributions. Employees may elect to receive their pension benefits in the form of a period-certain annuity, joint and survivorship annuity, or a life annuity.

**(c) Death Benefits**

If an active employee dies at age 55 or older, the surviving spouse or beneficiary shall be entitled to a death benefit equal to the benefit under a joint and survivorship annuity, or a 10-year certain annuity if that was chosen by the participant. If a vested participant dies on or before the early retirement age (55), the participant's spouse shall receive the same benefit that would be payable if the participant had (a) separated from service on the date of death, (b) survived to early retirement age, (c) retired with an immediate qualified joint and survivor annuity at early retirement age, or (d) died on the day after early retirement age. The benefit shall be payable to the spouse on the date the participant would have reached early retirement age.

**(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The following are the significant accounting policies followed by the Plan:

**(a) Basis of Accounting**

The accompanying financial statements are prepared in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles and under the accrual basis of accounting.

**(b) Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**(c) Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Certain of the Plan's investments are held in an immediate participation guarantee fund with Equitable Financial Life Insurance Company, one of the Plan's custodians, and are reported at contract value as this is the amount a participant would receive if they were to initiate a withdrawal. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus investment income, less funds used to make benefit payments and administration expenses charged by the custodian. The fund is valued daily and the redemption period is daily. Investment income is recognized at fair value as it is earned.

The Plan's other investments are unit investments in pooled separate accounts of the other custodian (Principal Life Insurance Company). Each pooled separate account is reported at fair value. Fair value is based on net asset value (NAV) as determined by the custodian and is primarily based on quoted market prices for the underlying securities or similar instruments. See note 6 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis as earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**(d) Actuarial Present Value of Accumulated Plan Benefits**

Accumulated plan benefits, see Note 7, are those future periodic payments, including lump-sum distributions, which are attributable under the Plan's provisions to the service employees have rendered. Accumulated plan benefits include benefits expected to be paid to (a) retired or terminated employees or their beneficiaries, (b) beneficiaries of employees who have died, and (c) present employees or their beneficiaries. Benefits under the Plan are based on employees' compensation during their five highest consecutive years of credited service, occurring in their last 10 years of service. The accumulated plan benefits for active employees are based on their average compensation during their last five years ending on the date as of which the benefits information is presented (the valuation date).

**(e) *Payment of Benefits***

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

**(f) *Administrative Expenses***

Certain administrative expenses, including recordkeeping expenses, are included in the total investment expense of one or more of the Plan's investment options. All other administrative expenses, including auditing expenses, are paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements.

**(g) *Risks and Uncertainties***

The Plan invests in various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rates, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Plan contributions are made and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits are reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, inflation rates, and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term would be material to the financial statements.

**(h) *Subsequent Events***

The Plan has performed an evaluation of subsequent events through September 24, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and determined there are no other items to be disclosed.

**(3) *Funding Policy***

The Company has voluntarily agreed to make contributions to the Plan sufficient to provide the Plan with assets to pay benefits to Plan participants. All contributions to the Plan are made by the Company. Plan participants are not permitted to make contributions to the Plan. The Plan has met the minimum funding requirements established by ERISA.

The contributions of the Company are designed to fund the Plan's current service costs on a current basis.

**(4) *Plan Termination***

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA.

In the event the Plan terminates, the net assets of the Plan will be allocated, as prescribed by ERISA and its related regulations, generally to provide the following benefits in the order indicated:

1. Benefits attributable to employee contributions, taking into account those paid out before termination.

2. Annuity benefits that former employees or their beneficiaries have been receiving for at least three years, or that employees eligible to retire for that three-year period would have been receiving if they had retired with benefits in the normal form of annuity under the Plan. The priority amount is limited to the lowest benefit that was payable (or would have been payable) during those three years. The amount is further limited to the lowest benefit that would be payable under plan provisions in effect at any time during the five years preceding plan termination.
3. Other vested benefits insured by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation (PBGC) (a U.S. government agency) up to the applicable limitations (discussed below).
4. All other vested benefits (i.e., vested benefits not insured by the PBGC).
5. All nonvested benefits.

Certain benefits under the Plan are insured by the PBGC if the Plan terminates. Generally, the PBGC guarantees most vested normal age retirement benefits, early retirement benefits, and certain disability and survivor's pensions. However, the PBGC does not guarantee all types of benefits under the Plan, and the amount of benefit protection is subject to certain limitations. Vested benefits under the Plan are guaranteed at the level in effect on the date of the Plan's termination. However, there is a statutory ceiling, which is adjusted periodically, on the amount of an individual's monthly benefit that the PBGC guarantees.

Whether all participants receive their benefits should the Plan terminate at some future time will depend on the sufficiency, at that time, of the Plan's net assets to provide for accumulated benefit obligations and may also depend on the financial condition of the Company and the level of benefits guaranteed by the PBGC.

**(5) Certification of Plan Custodian**

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA guidelines. Accordingly, Equitable Financial Life Insurance Company and Principal Life Insurance Company, both qualified institutions, have certified that all of the information provided is complete and accurate. Information included in the accompanying financial statements as to investments, immediate participation guarantee fund, accrued investment income, net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest income, and all information included in the supplemental schedule is presented in reliance solely upon those certifications.

The Plan's independent auditor did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

**(6) Fair Value Information**

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
  - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
  - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
  - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or
  - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at February 28, 2025 and February 29, 2024.

*Pooled separate accounts:* Pooled separate accounts (other than Principal U.S. Property) invest primarily in domestic and international stocks, bonds, commercial paper, and mutual funds. The fair values of the Plan's interest in these pooled separate accounts are based on each account's daily NAV as determined by the insurer and are primarily based on quoted market prices for the underlying securities or similar instruments.

The Principal U.S. Property account invests primarily in commercial real estate and includes mortgage loans, which are backed by the associated properties. The fair value of the underlying real estate is estimated using discounted cash flow valuation models that utilize public real estate market data inputs such as transaction prices, market rents, vacancy levels, leasing absorption, market cap rates, and discount rates. In addition, each property is appraised annually by an independent appraiser. This pooled separate account is redeemed at NAV on a daily basis which approximates fair value.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Calculations of the actuarial present value of vested benefits under the Plan were made by using the following significant actuarial assumptions as of March 1, 2024: (a) life expectancy of participants (the PRI 2012 Total Employee and Healthy Annuitant Mortality Table, with 2024 adjustment for future mortality improvement projection was used for the 2024 valuation), (b) retirement age assumptions (the assumed average retirement age was 65), (c) assumed annual withdrawal rates ranging from 0% to 15.30%, and (d) interest rate of 7.5% was used in 2024.

The foregoing actuarial assumptions are based on the presumption that the Plan will continue. Were the Plan to terminate, different actuarial assumptions and other factors might be applicable in determining the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits.

**(8) Tax Status**

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on September 27, 2016, in which the Internal Revenue Service states that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

U.S. generally accepted accounting principles require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of February 28, 2025 and February 29, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or an asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

**(9) Party-In-Interest Transactions**

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association or relatives of such persons.

The Plan is sponsored by the Company. Certain plan investments are shares of pooled separate accounts managed by Principal Life Insurance Company and an immediate participation guarantee fund with Equitable Financial Life Insurance Company. Principal Life Insurance Company and Equitable Financial Life Insurance Company are the custodians as defined by the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan paid administration fees for custodial services provided by Principal Life Insurance Company in the amount of \$153,882 and \$150,965 in 2025 and 2024, respectively. The Plan paid administration fees for custodial services provided by Equitable Financial Life Insurance Company in the amount of \$8,184 and \$8,586 in 2025 and 2024, respectively. All the above transactions are exempt from prohibited transaction provisions of ERISA and the IRC.

The company provides certain administrative services at no cost to the Plan.

**(10) Plan Amendments**

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to adopt certain changes expanding pre-retirement survivor benefits to a participant's surviving beneficiary in the event of a participant's death prior to age 55 and to make other administrative changes. The actuarial present value of accumulated benefits does not reflect the effect of the January 1, 2024 plan amendment, as of March 1, 2023.



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

<b><i>Benefit Service</i></b>	Service measured from date participant satisfies the eligibility requirements. One thousand nine hundred and fifty hours of service, following a plan year, constitutes a full year of Benefit Service, with pro-rata credit for 1,000 to 1,949 hours. Benefit Service during the first or last year of participation is not subject to the 1,000 hour minimum.
<b><i>Compensation</i></b>	Gross calendar year earnings including Section 125 deferrals and 401(k) deferrals.
<b><i>Final Average Earnings</i></b>	The highest 60 consecutive month average of compensation within the last 120 months preceding date of termination.
<b><i>Covered Compensation</i></b>	The average of the Social Security Wage Bases for the 35 years ending in the year of the participant's Social Security Retirement Age.
<b><i>Normal Retirement Date</i></b>	The first day of the month coinciding with or next following the attainment of age 65.
<b><i>Early Retirement Date</i></b>	The first day of the month after attaining age 55 and five years of Vesting service.
<b><i>Late Retirement Date</i></b>	Eligible to remain in the employment of the employer after age 65.

**Benefits**

***Normal Retirement***                      Monthly annuity equal to 1.20% of Final Average Earnings multiplied by years of Benefit Service, plus .50% of Final Average Earnings in excess of Covered Compensation multiplied by years of Benefit Service which is not in excess of 35 years.

***Early Retirement***                      Monthly annuity calculated in the same manner as Normal Retirement Benefit based on Final Average Earnings and Benefit Service to Early Retirement Date. Benefit commences at Normal Retirement Date or reduced by 5/12 of 1% for each month that commencement precedes age 65.

***Late Retirement***                      Monthly annuity calculated in the same manner as the Normal Retirement Benefit.

***Death***                                      Upon the death of an active Participant who has attained age 55, one of the following benefits:

- (a)    If not married and the Spouse Benefit option is not in effect, the accrued benefit, reduced for early retirement, payable to the beneficiary for a period of 10 years.
  
- (b)    If married and the Spouse Benefit is in effect, 50% of the accrued benefit, reduced for election of a 50% joint and survivor annuity, and for early retirement, payable for the life of the surviving spouse.

If a married vested participant dies prior to attainment of age 55, the participant's surviving spouse will receive a monthly benefit beginning on the participant's early retirement date. The monthly benefit is equal to 50% of the vested accrued benefit reduced for early retirement and to reflect payment in the form of a Joint and 50% Survivor Annuity.

***Death (continued)***                      If an unmarried vested participant dies prior to attainment of age 55, the participant's designated beneficiary will receive a monthly benefit for a period of 10 years certain beginning on the participant's early retirement date. The monthly benefit is equal to 100% of the vested accrued benefit reduced for early retirement.

***Termination Benefit***                      Fully vested interest in the accrued benefit after 5 years of Vesting Service. The vested accrued benefit is payable at Normal Retirement Date, but a reduced benefit can be paid after attaining age 55.
