Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed the audits of the financial statements of the AUI Supplemental Retirement Annuity Plan – AUI/NRAO TDA Plan (the “Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (“ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit”). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (“investment information”) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (“qualified institution”).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1 - Description of the Plan

The following brief description of the AUI Supplemental Retirement Annuity Plan – AUI/NRAO TDA Plan (the “Plan”) provides for only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution and tax deferred annuity plan most recently amended in 2020, for eligible employees of Associated Universities, Inc. (“AUI”), including the employees at the National Radio Astronomy Observatory (“NRAO”) and Green Bank Observatory (“GBO”). AUI manages the observatories under cooperative agreements with the National Science Foundation (“NSF”), (collectively the Employer or Plan Sponsor). Eligible employees can participate in the Plan upon hire. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). Substantially all investments are participant-directed.

Participants’ Contributions

Participants may defer a portion of their eligible annual compensation in the Plan, as defined, subject to dollar limits set by Federal Law. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions in accordance with the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) regulations. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (“Rollovers and Transfers”).

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and a pro-rata allocation of the Plan’s investment earnings/losses and charged with an allocation of administration expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings/losses, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the Participant’s vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their contributions and earnings thereon.

Payment of Benefits

Participants are entitled to the vested account balance upon death, disability, or retirement or termination of employment. In-service withdrawals are also allowed upon reaching age 59.5 or due to financial hardship. Hardship withdrawals are allowed to meet the immediate and heavy financial need. The Plan provides for benefit distributions to Plan participants or their beneficiaries (either in the form of an annuity, installment, or lump sum) of their account balance.

Note 1 - Description of the Plan (Continued)

Plan Administration

The Employer is the Plan administrator and has the authority to appoint person(s) or entities to carry out the operation of the Plan. Individual participant accounts are charged directly for benefit disbursement processing fees; however, the majority of expenses incurred in the administration of the Plan are charged to and paid by the Employer.

Investment Options

Participants have the option to direct contributions and the balance accumulated in their accounts. The participants may elect to choose among The Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America (“TIAA”) guaranteed annuity contracts, TIAA real estate pooled separate account, or TIAA and College Retirement Equities Fund (“TIAA-CREF”) mutual funds. The Plan also offers each participant a choice of funds offered by Fidelity Investments. Participants may change their election or transfer monies between certain funds at any time. Effective July 15, 2024, through a recommendation of the AUI Retirement Plans Committee, TIAA and CREF and TIAA as agent for TIAA, Trust, N.A. have been named the recordkeeper and custodian of the Plan. Accordingly, the Plan’s assets held at Fidelity were transferred to TIAA during the Plan year 2024.

Other Income

Excess fees paid by AUI to TIAA and CREF were refunded to the Plan during 2024 and are labeled as a Plan Servicing Credit. This credit is used to pay for reasonable and necessary administrative expenses and services related to the retirement plan.

Administrative Expenses

The administrative expenses associated with the Plan’s administration are paid by AUI.

Notes Receivable from Participants and Plan Loans

Participants may borrow a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the balance of their vested account balance. Loan terms are for up to five years (or longer for the purchase of a primary residence). The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at a reasonable rate. Principal and interest are paid directly to TIAA and Fidelity by the Participants.

Notes Receivable from Participants and Plan Loans (Continued)

Additionally, through 2022, participants were allowed to obtain loans directly from TIAA and CREF secured by the participant's balance in the TIAA Traditional Fund. Participants must transfer an amount equal to 110% of their outstanding loan balances from their fund accounts to the TIAA Traditional Fund to be held as collateral for the loans. This collateral remains invested in the Plan and the participants continue to earn contractual interest and additional amounts as declared by TIAA's Board of Trustees. Should participants default on their loans, TIAA and CREF removes the portion of the collateral held in the TIAA Traditional Fund equal to the participants' outstanding loan balances plus any unpaid accrued interest to pay off the defaulted loan. Participants may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 45% of the participant's vested account balance. These loans are not plan assets and totaled \$149,165 and \$223,111 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, with interest rates ranging from 4.45% - 5.56%. Principal and interest are paid directly to TIAA and CREF.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Investments, Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments other than fully benefit-responsive investment contracts (valued at contract value) are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded when earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

The Plan has fully benefit-responsive investment contracts and a non benefit-responsive investment contract with TIAA and CREF. TIAA and CREF maintain the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Unit Values

Individual participant accounts for the pooled separate investment account are maintained on a unit value basis. Participants do not have beneficial ownership in their specific underlying securities or other assets in the funds, but do have an interest therein represented by units valued daily. The funds earn dividends and interest which are automatically reinvested in additional units. Generally, contributions to and withdrawals from each fund are converted to units by dividing the amounts of such transactions by the unit values as last determined, and the participants' accounts are charged or credited with the number of units properly attributable to each participant.

Benefits Paid

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could vary from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from Participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred.

Reclassifications

Certain amounts have been reclassified in the 2023 financial statements to conform to the 2024 presentation. There was no effect on the net assets available for benefits or Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Subsequent Events

The Plan administrator has evaluated subsequent events through September 23, 2025, the date that the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no significant matters identified for disclosure during this evaluation.

Note 3 - Information Certified by Custodians

Plan investments are held in mutual funds, fixed rate and variable annuities, and a pooled separate investment account by the custodians, Fidelity (through July 15, 2024), TIAA and CREF and TIAA as agent for TIAA, Trust, N.A. in 2024 and 2023. Fidelity administers the Plan pursuant to trust agreements. TIAA and CREF administers the Plan through annuity contracts with the individual participants offered by TIAA and TIAA-CREF mutual funds. The fair value and contract value of investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and all investment transactions for the year ended December 31, 2024, including interest and dividend income and net appreciation in fair value are reported to the Plan and certified as complete and accurate by the custodians. Information included in the supplemental schedule and notes receivable from participants have also been derived from information certified by the custodians.

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level I) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level III). Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

- Level I* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan can access at the measurement date.
- Level II* – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted market prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level II input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level III* – Inputs that are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement for the asset or liability.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

TIAA Real Estate Account

The TIAA Real Estate account generally invests in real estate properties and real estate-related investments. The account's value is principally derived from the market value of the underlying real estate holdings or other real estate-related investments. Real estate holdings are valued principally utilizing external appraisals, which are estimates of property values based on a professional's opinion. The account sometimes holds securities as well, and these securities are generally priced using values obtained from independent pricing sources.

The fair value of the Plan's interest in the TIAA Real Estate Account (a pooled separate investment account) is based on the fund's daily Net Asset Value ("NAV"), which is considered by Plan management to be the best approximation of fair value. This investment is measured at net asset value in the fair value hierarchy. The unit value of the fund is calculated daily and available to Plan administrators and client investors on TIAA and CREF's website. There are no unfunded commitments from participants in the Plan who invest in this account. These investments may be redeemed quarterly with one day's notice.

TIAA Traditional - Fixed Rate Annuity

The TIAA Traditional Annuity is a fixed rate guaranteed annuity contract available as an investment option to Plan participants. Each contract is fully and unconditionally guaranteed by TIAA. The TIAA Traditional Annuity is offered through a variety of contract types, including Retirement Annuities ("RA") and Group Retirement Annuities ("GRA"). The type of contract through which a participant invests in the TIAA Traditional Annuity determines the applicability of certain account features, such as the guaranteed minimum interest rate, additional interest declarations, the degree of liquidity of the participant's account, and the options for receiving income upon retirement.

Investments in certain TIAA Traditional Annuity contracts are reported at fair value (RA and GRA), which approximates contract value. As these investments are contract-based, observable prices for identical or similar investments do not exist, and accordingly, these investments are valued using unobservable inputs (Level III). The contract value equals the accumulated cash contributions and interest credited to the contract, less any withdrawals. Liquidity restrictions apply to certain types of contracts that could impact the value realized upon exiting the contract.

When participants choose to allocate a portion of their retirement savings to the TIAA Traditional Annuity during the accumulation phase of the contract, their contributions purchase a specific amount of lifetime income based on the contractual rate schedule in effect at the time the premium is paid. The participant's principal, plus a specified minimum rate of interest, are guaranteed by TIAA's claim-paying ability. The TIAA Traditional Annuity also provides the potential for additional interest if declared by TIAA's Board of Trustees. Additional interest, when declared, remains in effect for the declaration year, which begins each March 1 for accumulating annuities, and January 1 for lifetime payout annuities. Additional interest is not guaranteed for future years. Together, the guaranteed minimum and additional amounts make up the crediting interest rate. For accumulating RA and GRA contracts, the crediting interest rates were 5.375% and 6.25% as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

TIAA Traditional - Fixed Rate Annuity (Continued)

The RA contract does not allow lump-sum cash withdrawals, and transfers must be spread over 10 annual installments. With the GRA contracts, lump-sum withdrawals are available within 120 days of termination of employment and are subject to a 2.50% surrender charge. All other withdrawals and transfers from RA and GRA contracts must be spread over 10 annual installments (five annual installments for withdrawals after termination of employment). All other withdrawals must be spread over 84 monthly installments. When a participant's accumulation in the TIAA Traditional Annuity is converted to a lifetime payout annuity, the present value of the stream of payments is equal to the accumulated balance, and the entire amount is recorded as a distribution in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

CREF Variable Annuities

The accounts invest principally in equity securities, fixed income instruments and short-term investments in accordance with each portfolio's investment objectives. Account investments are primarily valued using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing sources who may employ various pricing methods to value the investments including matrix pricing.

The fair values of accumulation units held by the Plan in CREF Variable Annuity accounts are based on each account's daily NAV, which is considered by Plan management to be the best approximation of the fair value. The NAV is based on the fair values of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. Data for NAVs are available daily to Plan administrators and client investors on TIAA and CREF's website and provides sufficient corroborative evidence to ascertain the relationship between each fund's NAV and the values of individual underlying holdings. There are no unfunded commitments from participants in the Plan who invest in these accounts. The CREF Variable Annuities are measured at net asset value in the valuation hierarchy and are redeemable daily with one day's notice.

Mutual Funds and Mutual Funds in Self-Directed Brokerage

Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The categorization of an investment within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the pricing transparency of the investment and does not necessarily correspond to Plan management's perceived risk of that investment.

Note 5 - Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

The following is a description of the investments and valuation methodologies for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts:

TIAA Traditional Annuity

SRA and GSRA contracts are also traditional annuity contracts as discussed in Note 4. SRA and GSRA contracts have no liquidity restrictions and are therefore fully benefit-responsive contracts reported at contract value. When a participant's accumulation in the TIAA Traditional Annuity is converted to a lifetime payout annuity, the present value of the stream of payments is equal to the accumulated balance, and the entire amount is recorded as a distribution in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

The contract value for the TIAA Traditional SRA and GSRA fully benefit-responsive investment contracts at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$22,973,549 and \$23,061,834, respectively. For accumulating SRA and GSRA contracts, the crediting interest rate was 4.625% and 5.50% as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by the future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the Plan to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer. Such interest rates are periodically reviewed for resetting.

The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Note 7 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, any unallocated assets of the Plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Employer may determine.

Note 8 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Market risks include global events such as an international conflict, which could impact the value of investment securities. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Note 9 - Related Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan's investments are managed by Fidelity and TIAA and CREF. Fidelity and TIAA and CREF are the custodians as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

Note 10 - Tax Status

The Plan adopted the TIAA Volume Submitter 403(b) Plan Document that received an IRS opinion letter dated August 7, 2017 which stated that the Plan is acceptable under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code") for use by eligible Employers for the benefit of their employees. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of Section 403(b) of the Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related accounts are tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
