Scope and nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of Thryv Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. - The information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Auditor's report on the 2023 financial statements

Predecessor auditors performed an audit of the 2023 financial statements of the Plan. In accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the prior year audit did not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan that were certified by a qualified institution. Their report dated September 17, 2024, indicated that (a) the amounts and disclosures in the 2023 financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, were presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and (b) the information in the 2023 financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). Their report also indicated that the form and content of the 2023 supplemental schedule, other than the information in the 2023 supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, were presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA; and the information in the 2023 supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determines meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Thryv Savings Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document and Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

Thryv Holdings, Inc. (the “Company”) established the Plan effective January 1, 2018. The Plan is a defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (“ERISA”).

The Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement 2.0 Act of 2022 (SECURE 2.0) was signed into law on December 29, 2022. This legislation includes a vast array of provisional changes to retirement plans, becoming effective in 2023 and beyond.

Trustee and Administration of the Plan

The Plan Administrator is the Company’s Employee Benefits and Asset Management Committee (“EBAMC”), which consists of employees appointed by the Company’s chief financial officer. The EBAMC has the authority to select, retain, monitor and discharge recordkeepers and is responsible for administering the Plan, including day to day functions, benefit payments, claims, and for effectuating amendments. The EBAMC has authority to remove and/or instruct the trustee, establish and maintain a funding and investment policy and select and monitor funds.

Fidelity Management Trust Company (“Fidelity”) is the trustee and custodian for the Plan. Fidelity Workplace Services LLC, a wholly owned subsidiary of the trustee, is the contractual recordkeeping agent for the Plan and Fidelity Investments Institutional Operations Company, a wholly owned subsidiary of Fidelity Workplace Services LLC, provided recordkeeping services and other administrative services to the Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 75%, in whole percent increments, of their eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan document. Participant contributions may be on a pre-tax, Roth, or after-tax basis. Employees are automatically enrolled at a 6% pre-tax deferral rate upon becoming eligible to participate in the Plan, which will automatically increase 1% per year until the participant is deferring 10%, and participants may elect to change or discontinue deferrals at any time. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

Each pay period, the Company makes safe harbor matching contributions to the account of each eligible employee equal to 100% of the first 3% and 60% of the next 3% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. True-up matching contributions shall be made each plan year to ensure that participants receive the full safe harbor matching contribution for the Plan year, as further described in the Plan document. The Company may, at its discretion, make a performance-based matching contribution to eligible employees on an annual basis. The discretionary performance-based matching contribution shall not exceed 50% of the first 6% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. The Company did not make a discretionary performance-based matching contribution in 2024 and 2023. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

After-tax contributions are not subject to safe harbor company-matching contributions and participants who only make after-tax contributions are not eligible for discretionary matching contributions.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and an allocation of (a) the Company's contributions, (b) Plan earnings, and (c) forfeitures of Company contributions, and is charged with his or her withdrawals and an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant contributions, eligible compensation, participant account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The investment earnings or losses are allocated to each participant's account pro-rata by investment fund.

The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Each participant directs the investment of his or her account to any of the investment options available under the Plan.

Investment Options

Participants may direct their contributions into various collective trusts, mutual funds or the investments within the self-directed brokerage accounts offered by the Plan and can change their investment options on a daily basis, subject to the restrictions and procedures as are established by the recordkeeper and the investments' prospectus.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow up to the lesser of \$50,000 or one-half of their vested account balance, less the highest outstanding loan balance within the past 12 months. Participants may not have more than two note receivables outstanding at any time. The minimum note receivable amount is \$1,000. The minimum note receivable term is 6 months and the maximum note receivable term is 57 months unless the proceeds are used to acquire a participant's principal residence, in which case the maximum term is 117 months. The note receivable is secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loans bear interest at a rate of prime plus 2%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. A participant's note receivable shall become due and payable if such participant fails to make a principal and/or interest payment as provided in the note receivable agreement, subject to a grace period.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and rollovers plus actual earnings thereon. Participants are generally 100% vested in all safe harbor matching contributions upon completion of two years of service and discretionary performance-based matching contributions upon completion of three years of service.

For purposes of vesting, years of service are computed as the total time period commencing with the employee's first date of employment and ending on the last date of employment. Participants also become 100% vested in their accounts upon reaching normal retirement age (65), death or disability. There are certain other special events which can cause immediate vesting as further described in the Plan document.

Forfeitures

The amount of any non-vested forfeiture attributed to a participant's break in service as specified by the Plan document may be used to restore the participant's forfeited employer contribution, fund Company contributions, or pay expenses. During 2024, \$323,902 of forfeitures were applied to offset Company safe harbor matching contributions and \$77,268 were used to pay expenses. The remaining balance of forfeitures available to offset future Company matching contributions and pay administrative expenses as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$511,484 and \$257,512, respectively.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service, a participant is eligible to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Terminated participants who do not elect a distribution type and have an account balance of less than \$5,000 must take an immediate distribution. If the amount is more than \$1,000 but less than \$5,000, and the participant does not elect to receive the distribution directly in a lump sum and does not elect to have the distribution paid directly to an eligible retirement plan in a direct rollover, then the Plan Administrator will direct payment of the distribution in a direct rollover to an individual retirement plan ("IRA") designated by the EBAMC. Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan has adopted the SECURE 2.0 provision which increased this limit from \$5,000 to \$7,000.

Participants may elect to receive a partial distribution of their vested account balances. Participants (or their beneficiaries upon the death of the participant) may elect to receive their vested account balances as a single lump sum or paid in annual, semiannual, quarterly, monthly, or bi-weekly installments for a period of years, selected by the person exercising the election. Participants may also elect to transfer their benefit to another qualified retirement plan or IRA. In certain circumstances, participants may make voluntary in-service withdrawals and hardship withdrawals if certain criteria are met and subject to certain limitations as outlined in the Plan document. The Plan also provides for minimum required distributions per Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") regulations by April 1 of the calendar year following the later of the calendar year in which the participant reaches age 73 or the calendar year the participant retires.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan agreement to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their Company contributions and earnings thereon.

Subsequent Events

Plan management has evaluated subsequent events for recognition and disclosure through September 18, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was amended to suspend the safe harbor matching contributions. The plan was also amended for the discretionary company matching contribution. The discretionary company matching contribution, if any, will be determined as of the end of each plan year and may be paid to the Trustee after the end of the plan year.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures, and actual results may differ from these estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is based on the price that would be received by the Plan to sell an asset or paid to the Plan to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market

participants at the measurement date. The Plan Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and trustee. See Note 4 for further discussion and disclosures related to fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Participant contributions and the related Company matching contributions are recorded in the period payroll deductions are made.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest, with no allowance for credit loss, as repayments of principal and interest are received through payroll deductions and the notes are collateralized by the participants' account balance.

Administrative Expenses

Account maintenance fees, audit expenses, and investment advisory fees are paid from Plan assets. The Company pays for all other expenses incurred in connection with the administration of the Plan. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, investment management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan holds various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, liquidity and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the fair values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 3 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S TRUSTEE

Certain information in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule related to investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to settle a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. To increase the comparability of fair value measurements, the following hierarchy prioritizes the inputs to the valuation methodologies to measure fair value:

- Level 1: Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- Level 2: Inputs, other than quoted prices in active markets, that are observable either directly or indirectly.
- Level 3: Unobservable inputs that reflect the Plan's own assumptions incorporated into valuation techniques. These valuations require significant judgment.

In some cases, a valuation technique used to measure fair value may include inputs from multiple levels of the fair value hierarchy. The lowest level of significant input determines the placement of the entire fair value measurement in the hierarchy.

The following presents the valuation methods and assumptions used by the Plan to estimate the fair values of investments.

Mutual Funds: The fair values of mutual fund investments are determined by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchanges (Level 1 inputs).

Collective Trusts: Valued at the net asset value ("NAV") of shares held by the Plan at year end based on information reported by the trustee. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as the practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. The collective trusts provide for daily redemptions by the Plan at reported net asset values per share, with no advance notice requirement. There were no unfunded commitments of the collective trusts as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Self-directed Brokerage Accounts: Accounts primarily consist of registered investment companies that are determined by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchange (Level 1).

NOTE 5 – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Parties-in-interest are defined under DOL regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the employer, and certain others. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, certain investments held by the Plan are managed by an affiliate of Fidelity, the trustee of the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Notes receivable from participants also reflect party-in-interest transactions. These transactions, however, are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company, and no such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Some administrative expenses of the Plan are paid directly by the Company.

NOTE 6 - TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated August 14, 2019 that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, Plan management believes that the Plan is designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
