## **INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT**

### **Opinion**

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local Union #1919 Annuity Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits of International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local Union #1919 Annuity Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the changes in its net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local Union #1919 Annuity Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

### **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local Union #1919 Annuity Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

**NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local Union # 1919 Annuity Fund provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General** - The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of a participating Company from the first day of employment. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA).

**Contributions** - Under a collective bargaining agreement, participating employers contribute at the agreed rate per hour for each participant covered.

**Participant Accounts** - Each participant's account is credited with (a) the employer's contribution and (b) Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting** - Participants are 100 percent vested immediately.

**Investments are self directed** - Each participant selects from the investment options for their desired portfolio.

**Payments of Benefits** - When a participant meets one of the conditions which precipitate payment, he may choose either a lump sum payment or one of several annuity plans. There are also provisions for payment to designated beneficiaries if a participant dies before receiving the full amount in his account. Amounts due participants at any time are limited in total to the net assets of the Plan.

**NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

The financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Significant accounting policies are summarized below:

**Date of Management's Review of Subsequent Events** - Subsequent events were evaluated through the date of the Independent Auditor's Report, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and it was determined that there were no subsequent events that required disclosure.

**Estimates** - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition** - Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Board of Trustees determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance. The trustees also determine the Plan's valuation policies. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)**

**Income Tax Status** - The plan obtained its latest determination letter in 2013, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. Plan management and Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The fair value measurements accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs were used only when Level 1 inputs were not available. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Level 1 Fair Value Measurements** - The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Fund at year-end. The fair values of common stocks are based on the closing price reported on the active market where the individual securities are traded.

**Level 2 Fair Value Measurements** - The fair values of certain corporate bonds and U.S. government securities for which quoted market prices are not available are based on yields currently available on comparable securities of issuers with similar credit ratings.

**Level 3 Fair Value Measurements** - For those assets with fair value measured using Level 3 inputs, the Fund determines the fair value measurement using available current market conditions and other applicable third party information.

It is the intention of the Trustees to continue the Plan indefinitely. If the Plan were to be terminated by the Trustees, the assets of the Trust Fund would be used for the exclusive benefit of eligible employees to provide benefits and pay fund expenses until exhausted.
