NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. THE PLAN

The following description of the Southwest Dealer Services 401(K) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan established for non-union employees of Southwest Dealer Services, Inc. (SWDS or the Company). The Plan is administered by management of SWDS and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a/ Principal Trust Company (Principal) is the trustee of the Plan.

Eligibility

Employees are immediately eligible to begin salary deferrals and receive employer matching contributions. All employees are eligible to participate in the Plan, except for collective bargaining employees, employees who are not U.S. residents and leased employees. Certain highly compensated employees were not eligible to receive the Company’s matching contributions.

Contributions

Participants may contribute a percentage of their annual compensation subject to certain IRS limitations. The Company also contribute safe harbor matching contributions. The Company’s safe harbor match for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 was equal to 100% of each participant’s elective deferrals, not to exceed 3% of the participant’s compensation, plus 50% of each participant’s elective deferrals in excess of 3% but not in excess of 5% of participant’s compensation.

Vesting

Participants are immediately fully vested in their voluntary contributions, rollover contributions and the Company’s safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings and losses thereon.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions along with an allocation of the Company’s contribution, Plan earnings and losses and administrative expenses. Contributions allocated to an employee’s account are invested according to the employee’s discretion.

Investment Options

The Plan currently offers various investment options, including mutual funds and common collective trusts. All investments are participant directed and participants may change their investment options daily.

1. THE PLAN (Continued)

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of employment, the participant's vested benefit can be received in a single lump sum payment or have the payment paid as a direct rollover to an individual retirement account or to another employer's qualified tax plan. If the value of the employee's vested account balance is \$5,000 or less on the applicable valuation date as provided under the Plan, the Company can cash the employee's entire vested account balance out of the Plan. On termination of service due to death before distribution of the employee's benefits has begun, the employee becomes 100% vested and the vested account balance will be payable in a single lump sum to the participant's beneficiary.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their account up to a maximum amount that is equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. No loans less than \$1,000 will be made and only one loan may be outstanding to a borrower at any time. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the Wells Fargo Prime rate plus 1% rate at the time the loan is made. Principal and interest is paid in substantially equal payments over the life of the loan through payroll deductions. The loan in its entirety must be repaid within 5 years of the date the loan proceeds are received, unless used to acquire the principal residence (which must be repaid within 10 years).

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their accounts.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates and such differences may be significant.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative costs, including management and bank custody fees, are paid by the Plan.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are stated at fair value. The net appreciation in the fair value of investments consist of realized gains or losses on the sales of investments and the unrealized appreciation of investments. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date and purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis (the date the order to buy or sell is executed). Interest income is recognized on the accrual basis.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document.

Fair Value Measurements

The Plan uses various valuation techniques in determining fair value. GAAP defines fair value as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date and provides a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). Observable inputs are inputs that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability developed based on market data obtained from sources independent of the Plan. Unobservable inputs are inputs that reflect the Plan's assumptions about the assumptions market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability, developed based on the best information available in the circumstances.

Fair Value Measurement - Definition and Hierarchy

The hierarchy is broken down into three levels based on the reliability of inputs as follows:

- Level 1 - Valuations based on quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access. Valuation adjustments are not applied to Level 1 instruments. Since valuations are based on quoted prices that are readily and regularly available in an active market, valuation of these products does not entail a significant degree of judgment.
- Level 2 - Valuations based on quoted prices in markets that are not active or for which all significant inputs are observable, directly or indirectly.
- Level 3 - Valuations based on inputs that are unobservable and significant to the overall fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measure at fair value:

Mutual funds: The accounts are valued based on the quoted market price at the Plan year-end.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

Collective investment trusts (CIT): Valued at fair value using the net asset value (NAV) reported by each fund as a practical expedient for determining the fair value of these investments. In accordance with the terms of the trust, the net asset value of each fund is calculated daily and net investment income and realized and unrealized gains on investments are not distributed, but rather reinvested and reflected in the net asset value of the fund. Units of the fund are issued and redeemed at the current net asset value. There are no restrictions on redemptions of the CITs and no unfunded commitments related to these investments. The Principal S&P 500 and S&P Mid Index CIT's primary investment objectives are to seek capital appreciation. The Galliard Stable Return fund seeks to provide investors with a moderate level of stable income without principal volatility.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

There have been no changes in valuation techniques during 2024 and 2023.

5. TAX STATUS

The Plan document is based on a Volume Submitter Profit Sharing Plan document. The Internal Revenue Service has determined, by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit-Sharing Plan with CODA was designed, at that time, in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and the opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

6. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Transactions between Principal and the Plan qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Additionally, notes receivable from participants are party-in-interest transactions. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

In addition, the Plan also allows participants of the Plan to receive loans under specific circumstances. As such, transactions between participants with loans and the Plan qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Other than for the certified investment information, the financial statements and supplemental schedule were audited by us in accordance with GAAS and were subjected to tests of your accounting records and other procedures as we considered necessary to enable us to express an opinion as to whether they are presented in compliance with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Our audit of the financial statements does not relieve you or management of its respective responsibilities.

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Other Information in Documents Containing Audited Financial Statements

We are not aware of any documents prepared by management which contain our reports on the audited financial statements of Southwest Dealer Services 401(k) Plan. Our responsibility for this information does not extend beyond the financial information identified in the report. We do not have an obligation to perform any procedures to corroborate other information contained in the report. We have read the reports to corroborate the financial information. Nothing came to our attention that caused us to believe that such information, or its manner of presentation, is materially inconsistent with the information, or manner of information appearing in the financial statements.

Planned Scope and Timing of the Audit

We performed the audit according to the planned scope and timing previously communicated to you in our engagement letter dated July 2, 2025.

Significant Findings

Qualitative Aspect of Accounting Policies

Management is responsible for the selection and use of appropriate accounting policies. In accordance with the terms of our engagement letter, we will advise management about the appropriateness of accounting policies and their application. The significant accounting policies used by Southwest Dealer Services 401(k) Plan are described in Note 2 to the financial statements. No new accounting policies were adopted and the application of existing policies was not changed during the year ended December 31, 2024.

We noted no transactions entered into by the Plan during the year that were both significant and unusual, and of which, under professional standards, we are required to inform you, or transactions for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus. In addition, we did not identify any significant findings or issues during the audit in connection with the Plan's related parties.

Accounting estimates are an integral part of the financial statements prepared by management and are based on management's knowledge and experience about past and current events and assumptions about future events. Certain accounting estimates are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the financial statements and because of the possibility that future events affecting them may differ significantly from those expected.

Management's estimate of the fair value of the Plan's investments is described in Note 2 of the financial statements. We evaluated the key factors and assumptions management used to develop the fair value estimates pertaining to those investments and determined that such estimates and assumptions are reasonable.

The disclosures in the financial statements are neutral, consistent, and clear.

Difficulties Encountered in Performing the Audit

We encountered no significant difficulties in dealing with management in performing and completing our audit.

Significant Unusual Transactions Identified During the Audit

We identified no significant unusual transactions during the audit.

Difficult, Contentious or Other Matters Encountered During the Audit

We encountered no difficult, contentious, or other matters for which we consulted outside the engagement team that were, in our professional judgment, significant and relevant to those charged with governance regarding the responsibility to oversee the financial reporting process.

Corrected and Uncorrected Misstatements

Professional standards require us to accumulate all known and likely misstatements identified during the audit, other than those that are trivial, and communicate them to the appropriate level of management. Management has corrected all such misstatements.

Reportable Findings

For purposes of this letter, a reportable finding is a matter that includes one or more of the following: (1) noncompliance or suspected noncompliance with laws and regulations, (2) a finding that in our professional judgment is significant and relevant to you regarding your responsibility to oversee the financial reporting process, and (3) an indication of internal control deficiencies identified during the audit that have not been previously communicated to management by other parties and that we determined are sufficiently important to merit management's attention. We identified the following reportable findings:

- **Documentation of the Oversight Process:**

During our audit, we noted that Plan management did not document its plan oversight meetings during the year. Meeting minutes serve as important documentation that a fiduciary process was followed, and the Plan is being prudently managed. We recommend that Plan management implement a policy to document their regular meetings and any important decisions or discussions held during these meetings, to include the following:

- Date, time and location of the meeting
- Identification of the people present at the meeting
- Reference to any investment reports used during the meeting
- Participation issues such as education, goals for increasing the number of participants, or deferral rates
- Plan fee issues
- Fund performance issues
- Decisions made, such as the decision to place a specific fund on a formal or informal "watch list" that will need to be addressed at a future meeting
- Decisions made which require immediate action, such as the decision to remove and/or replace a fund in the Plan's line-up

- **Documentation of the Oversight Process:**

There were no formal minutes maintained for actions taken by the trustee during the year. With the complexity of investment alternatives and the tax laws covering the qualifications of the Plan and fiduciary responsibilities of the trustee, it is important that the plan sponsor adequately document the due diligence exercised over the operations of the Plan. We recommend the trustee establish procedures for carrying out the above and document the establishment of those procedures in formal minutes. Periodic plan-administrative meetings should include consideration of items such as:

- Review of Plan's investment performance
- Selection of investment options
- Creation and monitoring of investment policy
- Evaluation of service providers
- Report from the plan administrator
- Employee complaints or concerns, if known
- Report from investment advisor, if applicable
- Consideration and approval of plan amendments (or recommendation of amendments for the Board of Directors)
- Compliance with ERISA regulations

Disagreements with Management

For purposes of this letter, professional standards define a disagreement with management as a matter, whether or not resolved to our satisfaction, concerning a financial accounting, reporting, or auditing matter that could be significant to the financial statements or the auditors' report. We are pleased to report no such disagreements arose over the course of the audit.

Circumstance Affecting the Form and Content of the Auditor's Report

We encountered no circumstances that affect the form and content of the auditor's report.

Consultations with Other Independent Accountants

In some cases, management may decide to consult with other accountants about auditing and accounting matters. If a consultation involves application of an accounting principle to the Plan's financial statements, or a determination of the type of auditors' opinion that may be expressed on those statements, our professional standards require the consulting accountant to check with us to determine that the consultant has all the relevant facts. To our knowledge, there were no such consultations with other accountants.

Management Representations

We have requested certain representations from management that are included in the management representation letter. This letter has been provided to you.

Independence

We are not aware of any relationships between Bonadio & Co., LLP and the Plan that, in our professional judgment, may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence. Relating to our audit of the financial statements of Southwest Dealer Services 401(k) Plan as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024, Bonadio & Co., LLP hereby confirms in accordance with the Code of Professional Conduct issued by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, that we, in our professional judgment, are independent with respect to the Plan.

Form 5500

In performing our audit, in accordance with GAAS, we are responsible for obtaining and reading the draft Form 5500 in order to identify material inconsistencies, if any, with the audited ERISA plan financial statements. During our audit we obtained and read the draft Form 5500 from management and did not identify any material inconsistencies.

Other Audit Findings or Issues

We generally discuss a variety of matters, including the application of accounting principles and auditing standards, with management each year prior to retention as the Plan's auditors. However, these discussions occurred in the normal course of our professional relationship and our responses were not a condition to our retention. We have other matters that we wanted to communicate to you regarding the operation of the Plan. Those items are included in the attached Management Recommendations.
