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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Trustees of
Fulton Fish Market Welfare Fund

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Fulton Fish Market Welfare Fund an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits and of benefit obligations as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits and of changes in benefit obligations for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits and benefit obligations of the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the changes in its net assets available for benefits and benefit obligations for the years then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinion


We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following brief description of Fulton Fish Market Welfare Fund (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan is a multiemployer defined welfare benefit plan established under the provisions of an Agreement and Declaration of Trust effective November 1, 1950, as amended, between United Seafood Workers Smoked Fish and Cannery Union of Greater New York and Vicinity, Local 359, affiliated with the United Food and Commercial Workers International Union (UFCW), and the Hunts Point Seafood Employers Association. The Plan was established for the purpose of providing health and related benefits to employees of employers who participate in the Plan. Effective April 1, 2022, UFCW Local 359 merged into UFCW Local 342 (the Union) with the Union remaining the surviving entity. The Plan is administered by a Board of Trustees (Trustees) consisting of union and employer representatives and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Benefits - The Plan provides health and welfare benefits including medical, hospitalization, surgical, prescription drug, dental, and optical benefits. These benefits are self-insured and paid out of the general assets of the Plan and are processed by the Plan's third-party claims processors under administrative services only (ASO) arrangements. Insurance policies providing life insurance, disability, and paid family leave are fully insured. Retired participants are entitled to death benefits if they are receiving a pension benefit from the Fulton Fish Market Pension Fund. Retiree death benefits are fully insured.

The Plan has a stop-loss insurance arrangement in an effort to limit its exposure for self-insured medical, hospital, and prescription benefits (individual participant claims over a specific dollar amount, as well as aggregate exposure for all claims).

Funding Policy - Funding to provide the benefits is made through weekly contributions by participating employers on behalf of each covered employee as provided for in the applicable prevailing collective bargaining agreements with the Union. Contributions are also made by participants who have left covered employment and who elect to continue coverage with the Plan through the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (COBRA).



NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting - The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. Under this basis, revenue is recorded when earned and expenses are recorded as incurred, regardless of when cash is exchanged.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, including estimated amounts for claims incurred but not reported, postretirement benefit obligations, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, if any, at the date of financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan determines its valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment manager.

Purchases and sales of securities are recognized on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recognized on the accrual basis. Dividends are recognized on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Employer Contributions Receivable - Contributions due from employers are accrued at year end only as to those amounts applicable to contribution periods which ended on or before the financial statement dates and are based on subsequent period cash collections. Based on a review of historical losses, current economic conditions and supportable and reasonable forecast assumptions, the Plan has concluded that any expected credit losses on balances outstanding at year end will be immaterial.

Payment of Benefits - Claim payments are recorded when paid to the third-party claim processors. Amounts due to claim processors at year end that have yet to be paid by the Plan are included with claims incurred but not reported in the accompanying statements of benefit obligations. Insurance premiums are recorded when paid.

Stop-Loss Insurance - Premiums for stop-loss are included in benefits paid in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. Stop-loss recoveries totaling \$394,106 and \$365,491 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, have been netted with benefits paid in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. Stop-loss receivables of \$7,197 and \$14,837 have been reported on the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, and were received by the Plan in the subsequent periods.

Administrative Expenses - Expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.



NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Prescription Drug Rebates - The Plan retains a pharmacy benefit manager (PBM) which periodically provides rebates to the Plan based on the Plan's actual utilization pattern of specific drugs. Prescription drug rebates of \$406,283 and \$245,297 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, have been netted with benefits paid on the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Reclassifications - Certain reclassifications have been made to the 2023 financial statements to conform to the 2024 financial statement presentation. These reclassifications had no effect on the previously reported net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 3. BENEFIT OBLIGATIONS

Postretirement Benefit Obligation

A postretirement benefit obligation has been recognized for retiree death benefits for eligible participants and their beneficiaries upon retirement that is provided by the Plan. The amount reported represents the actuarial present value of those estimated future benefits that are attributed to participant service rendered through December 31, 2024 and 2023. Postretirement benefits include future benefits expected to be paid on behalf of and to (1) currently retired or terminated participants and their beneficiaries, and (2) deferred vested participants after retirement under the pension plan, and (3) active vested participants after retirement from service.

The postretirement benefit obligation represents the amount that is to be funded by contributions from the Plan's participating employers and from existing plan assets. Prior to an active employee's full eligibility date, the postretirement benefit obligation is the portion of the expected postretirement benefit obligation that is attributable to that employee's service in the industry rendered to the valuation date.

The actuarial present value of the expected postretirement benefit obligation is determined by the Plan's actuary and is the amount that results from applying actuarial assumptions to historical claims cost-data to estimate future annually incurred claims cost per participant and to adjust such estimates for the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as those for death, disability, withdrawal, or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment.

A lump sum payment of \$5,000 is payable upon the death of a retiree of the Fulton Fish Market Pension Fund (no benefits are payable upon the death of a surviving spouse or beneficiary receiving a pension).

 - Disabled: PRI-2012 Blue Collar Headcount-Weighted Disabled Retiree Male / Female Mortality Projected with Scale MP-2021.

The foregoing assumptions are based on the presumption that the Plan will continue. In the event the Plan was to terminate, different actuarial assumptions and other factors might be applicable in determining the actuarial present value of the postretirement benefit obligation. If assumed rates increased by one percentage point each year, it would not increase the obligation as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Claims Incurred but Not Reported

Plan obligations at December 31, 2024 and 2023, for claims incurred but not reported at that date are estimated by the Plan's actuary in accordance with U.S. accepted actuarial principles that take into consideration prior claims experience and also include analyzing claim lag studies based on data provided by the Plan's third-party claims administrator. Such amounts are reported undiscounted as these obligations typically are payable within one year. Any differences in the amounts estimated and actual amounts will be reported in future years.

NOTE 4. TAX STATUS

The Plan has received an exemption letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stating that the trust established under the Plan was in compliance with the applicable requirements of Section 501(c)(9) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan and trust are required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain the tax-exempt status of the trust. The Trustees believe that the Plan, as amended, is operating in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if it has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.



NOTE 5. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting standards provide the framework for measuring fair value which provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows on the next page:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Plan uses valuation techniques to measure fair value that are consistent with the market approach. The market approach uses prices and other relevant information generated by market transactions involving identical or comparable securities.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds - Valued at the daily closing price reported in the active market in which the funds are traded. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish its daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price, therefore, are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding method may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. In addition, the inputs and methodology used for valuing securities are not necessarily an indication of the risk associated with investing in those securities.

NOTE 6. PLAN TERMINATION

The Trustees, as Plan Sponsor, have the right under the Plan to modify the benefits provided to active and retired participants and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination of the Plan, remaining net assets will be applied in a uniform and nondiscriminatory manner toward the provision of benefits for or on account of the participants. No assets of the Plan will be used for purposes other than for the exclusive benefit of the Plan's participants.

NOTE 7. UNINSURED CASH BALANCES

The Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) insurance limit is \$250,000 per institution. Financial instruments that potentially subject the Plan to concentration of credit risk consist principally of cash held in a high-quality financial institution. The balance at times may exceed FDIC insured amounts. The Plan has not experienced any losses in such accounts and believes it is not exposed to any significant credit risk.

NOTE 9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and to uncertainties in estimates and assumptions, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of such investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.



NOTE 9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES (CONTINUED)

The actuarial present value of benefit obligations is reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, retirement and mortality rates, and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term would be material to the financial statements.

NOTE 10. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan receives all contributions, including payroll audit payments, from contributing employers for itself and its affiliated Fulton Fish Market Pension Fund (Pension Fund) and every month allocates and remits contribution income to the Pension Fund for its share. Employer contributions remitted to the Pension Fund from the Plan totaled \$1,119,121 and \$1,305,919 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan owed the Pension Fund \$33,169 and \$372,602, respectively. These amounts were remitted to the Pension Fund in the subsequent period.

The Plan pays certain administrative, investment, and professional fees to various service providers. These transactions are considered exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

NOTE 11. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events have been evaluated through September 19, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. This review and evaluation revealed no material event or transaction which would require an adjustment to or disclosure in the accompanying financial statements.
