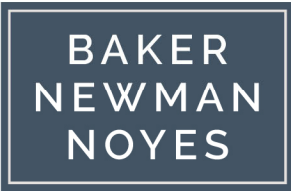

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

The Plan Administrator and Participants
Maine Community Bancorp 401(k) Retirement Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Maine Community Bancorp 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

1. Description of Plan

The following description of Maine Community Bancorp 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all full-time employees of Maine Community Bank (the Bank). It is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA).

The Plan was established effective January 1, 2017 by adopting a volume submitter plan, and restated effective December 1, 2021 by adopting a non-standardized pre-approved defined contribution plan, sponsored by Sentinel Benefits Group, Inc. (Sentinel). The recordkeeping for the Plan is performed by Sentinel. Fidelity Personal Trust Company, FSB is the trustee of the Plan.

Eligibility and Participation

Employees age 18 and over become eligible to participate on the first day of the month following one month of service.

The Plan automatically enrolls eligible employees and withholds 5% of eligible compensation. On the first day of each subsequent Plan year, the automatic withholding will increase by 1% up to a maximum of 8%. Participants may execute a salary deferral agreement at any time to select an alternative deferral amount or elect not to defer under the Plan.

On December 29, 2022, the *Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2022* (SECURE 2.0 Act) was signed into law. It includes mandatory and optional provisions impacting defined contribution plans. Applicable provisions outlined in the SECURE 2.0 Act will be adopted if elected and/or required. Plan amendments for these changes are not yet required.

Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute a portion of their compensation, on a pre-tax and a post-tax Roth basis, subject to Internal Revenue Service limits. The Bank matches 100% of the first 3% and 50% of the next 2% of the participants' compensation. The matching contribution formula complies with the Safe Harbor provision of the Internal Revenue Code.

The Bank may also make a discretionary profit sharing contribution on behalf of eligible participants. The amount of the discretionary profit sharing contribution, if any, is determined by action of the Bank's Board of Directors. A participant must complete three months of service to be eligible for profit sharing. Participants also must be employed on the last day of the Plan year; exceptions for death, disability, and retirement after age sixty with five years of plan participation apply. The amount of the profit sharing contribution for each eligible participant varies based on length of service with the amounts ranging from 3% to 8% of eligible compensation. Discretionary employer profit sharing contributions for 2024 and 2023 were \$514,556 and \$497,218, respectively, which are included in employer contributions receivable on the statements of net assets available for benefits at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

At the participant's option, contributions may be invested in any of the available investment options. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the options consisted of mutual funds and a stable value collective investment trust offered through Reliance Trust Company (the Collective Investment Trust).

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, employer contributions and an allocation of Plan earnings or losses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. Forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts are used to reduce future employer contributions to the Plan. Forfeited amounts were immaterial for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and the Bank's safe harbor matching contributions. Participants become vested in the discretionary profit sharing contribution after three years.

Payment of Benefits

The Plan provides benefits to participants upon death, disability, retirement or termination of employment. Benefits will be paid to the participant in a lump-sum or partial payment or by transfer to another qualifying plan. Participants are permitted to take two in-service distributions per year upon attaining the age of 59 ½. Participants are permitted to take hardship withdrawals from their account provided they meet certain criteria and the withdrawals are approved by the Plan Administrator. The Plan provides for involuntary withdrawal of a retired or terminated participant account balance less than \$5,000.

Notes Receivable From Participants

The Plan allows participants to borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Note terms generally range from 1 to 5 years, with longer terms allowed for the purchase of a primary residence. The notes are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Administrator at the time the note is established. Participants may only have one loan outstanding at any time. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Revenue Sharing

The Plan's money market funds are held in a revenue sharing account which is available to offset Plan expenses. The account is funded through revenue sharing agreements with certain funds. The balance of \$1,747 and \$23,488 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, is not allocated to participant accounts.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Bank has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their accounts.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments in money market funds and mutual funds are stated at fair value based upon quoted market prices which represent the net asset value of shares held by the Plan. The stable value collective investment trust is stated at fair value based on net asset value (NAV). NAV has been determined based on the unit values of the trust based on the fair value of the underlying assets. Certain employer initiated events may reduce the reported value of the investment in the collective trust. These events include discontinued operations, layoffs, Plan termination, bankruptcy or reorganization, merger, early retirement incentive programs, tax disqualification of the Plan or other events. Such events are not expected to be probable to occur.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation/depreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. Delinquent notes receivable are reclassified as a distribution based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Contributions

Contributions from participants are recorded in the period in which payroll deductions are made. Employer matching contributions are recorded in the same period as the corresponding participant contributions. Employer discretionary profit sharing contributions are recorded in the year of related eligible participant service.

Benefits Paid

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Fees

All administrative expenses not paid by the Plan are paid by the Bank.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options which invest in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as pandemics or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

Events occurring after the date of the statement of net assets available for benefits are evaluated by management to determine whether such events should be recognized or disclosed in the financial statements. Management has evaluated subsequent events through September 15, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

On January 1, 2025, the Plan's sponsor (i.e. the Bank) merged with Gorham Bancorp, MHC to better serve the needs of their respective communities and preserve their mutual form of ownership. In connection with the merger, Gorham Savings Bank was merged with and into Maine Community Bank. Currently, there are no definitive decisions regarding changes to the Plan.

3. **Tax Status**

A qualifying plan is one for which the employer may currently deduct contributions on its income tax return, the employee is not currently taxed on the contribution, and the plan income is not taxable.

The Plan is a pre-approved non-standardized defined contribution plan sponsored by Sentinel. This pre-approved non-standardized plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated November 30, 2020, as to the plan's qualified status. The opinion letter has been relied upon by the Plan. The Plan has been subsequently amended. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

3. **Tax Status (Continued)**

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by a plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. Management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that the Plan had maintained its tax exempt status and had taken no uncertain tax positions that require adjustment to, or disclosure in, the financial statements at December 31, 2024 or 2023. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

4. **Investments, Information Certified by Trustee and Fair Value Measurements**

Information Certified by Trustee

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the United States Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the information certified by Fidelity Personal Trust Company, FSB, the Plan's trustee, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, except for comparing such information certified by the trustee to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule.

The Plan Administrator has determined that the Trustee meets the requirements of a qualified institution as defined by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The Plan Administrator has obtained certifications from the Trustee stating that the information provided to the Plan Administrator by the Trustee is complete and accurate. The Plan's investments, related income and transactions, including net appreciation in fair value of investments, were certified by the Plan's trustee.

Fair Value Measurements

The Plan has adopted a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;

- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Money market funds and mutual funds: Valued at the closing price reported in the active market in which the security is traded.

The Collective Investment Trust is stated at fair value based on the NAV practical expedient. The trust was formed to allow defined contribution plans to invest in MetLife Group Annuity Contract No. 25053 to establish a stable value fund. The fund simulates the performance of a guaranteed investment contract through the guarantee of a specific interest rate and a portfolio of financial instruments that are owned by MetLife. There are no unfunded commitments related to this fund and redemptions are allowed daily.

5. **Related Party Transactions**

Administrative fees consist of amounts paid to the third-party administrator for various administrative services. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Investments in money market funds and certain mutual funds are held in an account with Fidelity, the trustee, therefore these transactions also qualify as party-in-interest. In addition, notes receivable from participants qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

6. **Reconciliation of Financial Statements to Form 5500**

There were no significant differences between the financial statements and Form 5500 as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, notes receivable from participants are reflected as a receivable on the financial statements, which is different from the Form 5500 presentation. On the Form 5500, notes receivable are classified as investments under the caption “participant loans.”
