We have performed audits of the financial statements of Tax Deferred Annuity Plan for Employees of Missouri Historical Society (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2024 And 2023

1. Description Of The Plan

The following description of Tax Deferred Annuity Plan for Employees of Missouri Historical Society (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a 403(b) defined contribution plan established by Missouri Historical Society (the Employer) under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

TIAA is the recordkeeper and issuer for the Plan's investments. CREF is the issuer of certain other Plan investments.

Participation

Employees are immediately eligible to defer a portion of their eligible compensation as pre-tax deferral contributions into the Plan. An employee must be 21 years of age and have three consecutive months of service to receive the Employer matching contribution.

Contributions

Participants may defer a portion of their annual compensation, as defined by the Plan, subject to certain limitations. Participants who attain age 50 during the Plan year may elect to make catch-up contributions, subject to certain limitations. Participants may also make rollover contributions representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

If the participant is deferring at least 1% of his or her eligible compensation, the Employer will make a matching contribution equal to 1% of the participant's eligible compensation or \$500, whichever is greater.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Employer contributions and an allocation of Plan earnings. The allocation of earnings is determined by the participant's investment selection based on each participant's account balance, as defined in the Plan Document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes To Financial Statements (*Continued*)

Plan Loans

Participants are also allowed to take loans directly from TIAA and CREF. These loans require collateral of 110% of the outstanding loan balance in case of default. Participant account balances held as collateral for loans at December 31, 2024 and 2023 amounted to \$35,842 and \$44,580, respectively, and are included in the guaranteed investment contract balance on the statement of net assets available for benefits. Loans considered in default at December 31, 2024 and 2023 amounted to \$35,842, and \$34,035, respectively. The collateral amounts held on defaulted loans are not payable to TIAA and CREF until a distributable event has occurred.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The term of the loans cannot exceed five years, except for a loan that is used to acquire a principal residence. The loans must be adequately secured by the participant's vested account balance and bear interest at rates, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Contributions Receivable And Credit Loss Policy

Amounts due from the Company for contributions are stated at the amount management expects to collect from outstanding balances. The carrying amount may be reduced by a valuation allowance that reflects management's best estimate of amounts that will not be collected. This estimate must include consideration of historical experience, current conditions and reasonable and supportable forecasts. The standard applies to the Plan's Company contributions receivable.

The Plan has concluded that no allowance for current expected credit losses was necessary at December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Vesting

All contributions and earnings thereon are fully vested and nonforfeitable at all times.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may direct their contributions and Employer contributions in a variety of investment options.

Notes To Financial Statements (*Continued*)

Payment Of Benefits

Amounts in a participant's account and earnings thereon are distributed upon retirement, death, disability, or other termination of employment. Benefit payments in excess of \$1,000 may be distributed as a lump-sum, partial payments, by purchase of annuity contracts, or a series of equal payments over a period of time until fully distributed. Benefit payments of \$1,000 or less may only be distributed as a lump-sum.

In-Service Withdrawals

Active participants who reach age 59-½ may withdraw all or part of their account resulting from elective deferral contributions. Participants who experience a qualifying financial hardship may withdraw all or part of their vested account resulting from all contributions. Hardship withdrawals will be approved only if they conform to the Plan provisions and established Internal Revenue Service (IRS) safe harbors.

Administrative Expenses

The Employer pays significant administrative expenses of the Plan. Investment related expenses are netted against earnings and are included in investment income on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

2. Summary Of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis Of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are presented on the accrual basis of accounting.

Estimates And Assumptions

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions to and deductions from net assets during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes To Financial Statements (*Continued*)

Investment Valuation And Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, which is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Interest income is recorded as earned on the accrual basis. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. The net change in fair value of investments in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits includes gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Payment Of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through the date the financial statements were available for issue, which is the Independent Auditors' Report date.

3. Certified Investment Information

The following is a summary of the Plan's asset information as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, included throughout the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule that was prepared by or derived from information certified by TIAA and CREF, and furnished to the Plan Administrator. The Plan Administrator has obtained certifications from TIAA and CREF that the information provided to the Plan Administrator related to the following information is complete and accurate.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The Plan utilizes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

Notes To Financial Statements (*Continued*)

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Guaranteed Investment Contract

Valued at fair value by the insurance company by discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar instruments with comparable durations considering the credit-worthiness of the issuer. Because the participants transact at contract value, fair value is determined annually for financial statement reporting purposes only. In determining the reasonableness of the methodology, management evaluates a variety of factors including review of existing contracts, economic conditions, industry and market developments, and overall credit ratings. Certain unobservable inputs are assessed through utilizing discount rates applied.

Pooled Separate Account

Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units held by the Plan at year end. The NAV, as provided by TIAA, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchased and sales) may occur daily. The pooled separate account files an annual report on Form 5500 as a direct filing entity.

Mutual Funds

Mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The funds held by the Plan are open-end funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded..

Variable Annuity Accounts

Valued at the daily closing price as reported by CREF. CREF accounts held by the Plan publish their daily NAV, transact at that price and are deemed to be actively traded.

Variable Annuity Contracts

Valued at NAV based on the value of the underlying assets. The NAV, as provided by TIAA, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

The methods described above may produce fair value calculations that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Income Tax Status

The Plan adopted the TIAA volume submitter 403(b) plan, for which a favorable opinion letter was issued to TIAA by the IRS on August 7, 2017. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter. The Plan has been amended since the date of the opinion letter. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right to terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. Participants will remain 100% vested in their accounts.

7. Party In Interest Transactions

The Plan's investments in a guaranteed investment contract, a pooled separate account, variable annuity contracts, and variable annuity accounts are managed by TIAA and CREF. In addition, certain participants have outstanding loans with the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. These transactions qualify as allowable party in interest transactions.

8. Risks And Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities, which in general are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
