INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Plan Administrator and Participants
TSFR 401(k) Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the TSFR 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). We are required to be independent of the TSFR 401(k) Plan and to meet our ethical responsibilities in accordance with the ethical requirements relating to our audits. Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

Note 1 – Description of the Plan

General

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan that was established on April 15, 1994 by TSFR Apple Venture, LLC and related entities, under a controlled group: TSFR Pizza, LLC, SOK Venture, LLC, DT Venture, LLC and TSFR Burger, LLC (the “Company”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The following description of the Plan is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Description or the Adoption Agreement, including amendments thereto, for a complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

Administration

The Plan Sponsor and named Plan Administrator is TSFR Apple Venture, LLC. The Plan Administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan Administrator has formed an investment committee made up of Company officers and other employees. The Committee monitors the Plan’s Trustee, Investment Custodian, investment performance and plan fees. The Plan’s Trustee and Investment Custodian is Empower Trust Company, LLC. The Investment Custodian holds all of the Plan’s assets and executes all of the Plan’s transactions. The Plan Administrator has also retained Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America to provide participant recordkeeping and administration services.

Eligibility

The Plan covers all employees of the Employer, except those who are covered by a collective bargaining agreement, and non-resident aliens. All eligible employees who have completed 90 days of service and are age 18 or older may begin participating in the Plan on the first day of the plan year quarter, following completion of the eligibility.

Contributions to the Plan

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of their pre-tax eligible compensation, as defined by the plan document, through payroll withholdings. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the year are eligible to make additional ‘catch-up’ contributions; however, the Plan Sponsor does not match these contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers).

Discretionary matching contributions may be contributed to the Plan at the discretion of the Company’s Board of Directors. To receive employer contributions, a participant must complete at least one year of service, must be eligible to contribute to the Plan on the first day of the plan year, and be actively employed on the last day of the plan year (December 31). The Plan Sponsor elected to contribute a matching contribution equal to the first 1% of deferred compensation for 2024.

Participants direct the investment of both their individual contributions plus their share of employer matching contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company’s contributions are allocated in the same manner as that of the participant’s elective contributions.

Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of Company matching contributions and plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Funds contributed by participants are invested at percentages as directed by participants in any one or more of several investment alternatives.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participant loans are allowed only in cases of hardship and only active employees may obtain a loan. Participants may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, subject to certain Department of Labor and IRS requirements. Loan transactions are treated as participant-directed investments. Loan terms range from one to five years. Loan terms may be extended up to 15 years in the event the loan proceeds are used to purchase or construct the participant's principal residence. Loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with prevailing prime rates, with the exception of any loans that are transferred into the Plan. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Distribution of Benefits

On termination of service, participant account balances between \$1,000 and \$5,000 will automatically be rolled over into an individual retirement account determined by the Company unless the participant affirmatively elects otherwise. Participants with balances less than \$1,000 will receive a cash distribution. On termination of service, participants with account balances greater than \$5,000 may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution of their account balance or payment in installments. Alternatively, they may elect to rollover their account balance to another qualified account. The distributable amount is equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Those participants whose account balances exceed \$5,000 may also elect to defer the distribution of their plan balance. Participants who elect to have their benefit payments deferred continue to share in allocations of investment income and losses but do not share in subsequent allocations of discretionary contributions. Special rules apply to distributions due to death, disability and retirement. Participants should refer to the full plan document for details.

Participants who are age 59 1/2 or older may elect to take an in-service distribution from the portion of their plan account balance which represents their 401(k) deferrals and earnings thereon. The Plan also allows for in-service distributions due to financial hardships as defined in the plan document.

Vesting

The balance in each participant's account, including employer related funds, is 100% vested at the time eligibility is met.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting. Employer contributions and income from investments are recorded when they are earned. Employee contributions are recorded when withheld from pay. Expenses are recorded in the accounting period in which they are incurred.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment adviser and custodian. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are valued at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make repayments on a note receivable and the Plan Administrator deems the note receivable to be uncollectible, the balance on the note receivable from the participant is reclassified to benefits paid to participants.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2025.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Fees and Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The financial statements and related disclosures include evaluation of events up through and including September 16, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 – Unaudited Investment Information Certified by the Custodian/Trustee

Plan management has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted under such election, the following information has been certified by Empower Trust Company, LLC as to its completeness and accuracy and was not subjected to any auditing procedures performed by the Plan's independent auditors:

1. All investment balances reflected in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023;
2. All investment activity reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024;
3. All investment-related information included in the Supplemental Schedule H, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024; and
4. Notes receivable from participants as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and the related income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 4 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified contractual term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

Mutual Funds are valued at daily closing prices as reported by the fund. Mutual Funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. Mutual Funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Investments Measured at Net Asset Value

The Putnam Stable Value Fund is not publicly traded. Fair value is determined by the underlying daily value reported by Putnam Investments using NAV as a practical expedient. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that a fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported net asset value.

Note 5 – Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain plan investments are managed by Empower Trust Company, LLC who is the Plan's Custodian. Indirect compensation (that is netted against investment income on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits) is paid to the Custodian from total annual operating expenses charged on the balance of fund investments, depending on the particular fund. In addition, the Plan paid direct compensation of approximately \$23,000 to the third-party administrator related to recordkeeping and administration services and approximately \$41,000 to the investment advisors.

Transactions involving these investments and services are considered party-in-interest transactions; however, these transactions are not considered prohibited transactions under 29 CFR 408(b) of the ERISA regulations.

Note 6 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions and to terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. Custodial fees and other operating expenses incurred after the termination date may, at the discretion of the Plan Sponsor, be paid by the Plan.

Note 7 – Plan Amendment and Tax Status

The Plan is utilizing a non-standardized pre-approved plan, which has been filed with the IRS and has received a favorable opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, from the IRS. The Plan Sponsor has not elected to apply for an individual IRS Determination Letter on the adoption of the Plan nor on any subsequent amendments. However, the Plan Sponsor believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) that the related Trust is tax-exempt as of December 31, 2024.

The Plan permitted provisions of SECURE Act 2.0 during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Written amendments to the plan document to reflect these operational changes will be adopted at a later date in accordance with the deadlines pursuant to applicable laws and IRS guidance.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
