NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2024 and 2023

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

Rooney Holdings, Inc. (the "Company" or "Employer") sponsors the Rooney Holdings, Inc. 401(k) Savings Plan (the "Plan"). The following description provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established for the benefit of the Company's employees and employees of certain subsidiaries, except for collective bargaining employees, leased employees and non-resident aliens with no U.S. sourced income. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as amended.

The Plan is administered by the 401(k) Investment Committee, which is a committee appointed by the Company's board of directors. Fidelity Management Trust Company (the "Trustee") serves as the trustee of the Plan and holds the Plan assets. Fidelity Workspace Services processes and maintains the records of participant data.

Eligibility

Eligible employees who have completed two months of service are eligible to participate in the Plan. Eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan on the first day of the month after satisfying eligibility requirements. Every January 1 and July 1, employees who have completed six months of service are eligible to receive Employer contributions.

Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of their compensation, as defined in the Plan document, as either pretax or Roth deferrals. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

Eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan with a 3% deferral rate. Eligible employees who do not wish to participate in the Plan may affirmatively elect to opt out, or they may elect a different deferral percentage. If an automatically enrolled employee does not select a particular combination of investments, contributions will be allocated to the Vanguard Target Retirement Fund designated for their projected retirement date.

The Plan also provides for Employer matching contributions. The Company matched 50% of deferrals, excluding catch-up contributions, up to 8% of a participant's eligible compensation. Employer matching contributions are based on deferrals made each payroll period.

Additional amounts may be contributed by the Employer under the Plan's profit-sharing provisions at the discretion of the Company's board of directors. In order to be eligible for Employer profit-sharing contributions, participants must be employed on the last day of the Plan year. Allocations of profit-sharing contributions are based on the proportion of each participant's compensation to the total of all participants' eligible compensation. No profit-sharing contributions were made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain limitations of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code").

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's matching contribution (as defined in the Plan document), profit-sharing contributions, if any, rollovers, and applicable earnings or losses on investments. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in Employer match contributions are based upon years of continuous service as follows:

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Vesting Percentage</u>
Less than one year	0%
One, but less than two	20%
Two, but less than three	40%
Three, but less than four	60%
Four, but less than five	80%
Five years or more	100%

Participants automatically become 100% vested upon normal retirement (attainment of the later of age 55 or 5 years of completed service), disability, or death. Participants who terminate for any other reason are entitled to the vested amount of their accounts.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their vested accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance during the preceding 12-month period, or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates that range from 4.25% to 9.5%, which is based on a reasonable rate of interest as determined by the Plan administrator. Participants may have only one loan outstanding at any given time. Terms range from one to five years or up to 15 years for the purchase of a primary residence. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon retirement, termination, disability or death, a participant, or his or her beneficiary in the event of death, may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Additionally, participants may take in-service distributions upon reaching age 59½. Upon termination, automatic distributions are required for balances of less than \$5,000. Automatic distributions above \$1,000 made without the participant's consent are rolled into an individual retirement account designated by the Trustee. Generally, certain minimum distributions are required for participants who have separated from service and have reached age 73. The Plan allows hardship withdrawals, subject to account balance limits and applicable laws.

Participants who were automatically enrolled in the Plan have the option to withdraw their deferrals without penalty within 90 days of their automatic enrollment date.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures are first used to pay Plan administrative expenses and then to reduce Employer contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures in the amount of \$212,507 were used to pay Plan administrative expenses. The Plan had \$0 in unallocated forfeitures at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Administrative Expenses

Audit and legal expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company. The Company does not expect to be reimbursed by the Plan. Administrative expenses are paid by the Plan and represent loan origination fees charged to participants. Investment expenses incurred by the Plan are reflected as a reduction of investment income for such investments.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The 401(k) Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Loans are deemed distributions once they are in default.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15 of the subsequent year.

NOTE 3 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S TRUSTEE

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the Trustee of the Plan has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments, at fair value and notes receivable from participants as shown on the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023;
- Net investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024; and
- Schedule H, line 4(i) - schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification 820, *Fair Value Measurement* (ASC 820), establishes a framework for measuring fair value. The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology includes quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023. Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Mutual Funds - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the United States Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 - RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by the Trustee of the Plan; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Certain administrative fees related to the administration of the Plan are paid by the Plan or by the Company. The Plan also has notes receivable from certain of its participants. Such transactions are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are exempt from the prohibited transactions rules under ERISA.

NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in the Employer contribution portion of their accounts.

NOTE 7 - TAX STATUS

The Company adopted a Volume Submitter Profit Sharing Plan (the VSPS Plan) sponsored by the Trustee. The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the VSPS Plan sponsor by a favorable opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, that the VSPS Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the Code. The VSPS Plan's opinion letter is being relied on by the Plan. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, however management believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Company believes the Plan has maintained its tax-exempt status and concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported on the statements of net assets available for benefits.
