To the Board of Trustees of the

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of the Local 812 Annuity Fund (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits of the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the changes in its net assets available for benefits for the years then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). The supplemental Schedule of Assets Held at End of Year are supplemental information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Supplemental information is the responsibility of the Plan's management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental information, we evaluated whether the supplemental information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion, the information in the accompanying schedules is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the financial statements as a whole, and the form and content are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Local 812 Annuity Fund (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Plan is a multiemployer defined contribution pension plan established under the provisions of an Agreement and Declaration of Trust between the Soft Drinks, Brewery Workers and Delivery Employees, Industrial Employees, Warehousemen, Helpers and Miscellaneous Workers, Greater New York and Vicinity, Local Union No. 812 International Brotherhood of Teamsters (the Union) and the various employers having collective bargaining agreements with the Union. The Plan was established on January 1, 2022 and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Board of Trustees is responsible for the oversight of the Plan, including determining the appropriateness of the Plan's investments in coordination with their investment advisors.

Under the current provisions of the Plan, an account is set up for each participant after the first contribution is received on the participant's behalf for work in covered employment.

A participant's account is adjusted for any withdrawals, investment income, gains and losses in asset value, investment expenses as well as charges for a proportionate share of Plan expenses.

The Plan allows for participant directed investing. Benefits are funded through employer contributions. The employer contribution rates have been established under collective bargaining agreements entered into between the Union and various employers. Employer contributions are accounted for as exchange transactions.

Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Method of Accounting - The accompanying financial statements are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments and Investment Income Recognition - Investments in mutual funds and guaranteed income funds are carried at fair value as of the last business day of the plan year, as provided by the custodian, based on the net asset value of the trusts and funds.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Employer Contributions Receivable - Employer contributions due and not paid prior to year end are recorded as contributions receivable. The Plan believes that the receivables are fully collectible; therefore, no allowance for credit losses is recorded.

Payment of Benefits - Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 3. PRIORITIES UPON TERMINATION

It is the intent of the Trustees to continue the Plan in full force and effect. In order to safeguard against any unforeseen contingencies, the right to discontinue the Plan is reserved to the Trustees. Termination shall not permit any part of the Plan to be used for or diverted to purposes other than the exclusive benefit of the participants and their beneficiaries. In the event of termination, the net assets of the Plan will be allocated to pay benefits in priorities as pre-described by ERISA and its related regulation. Whether or not a particular participant will receive full benefits should the Plan terminate at some future time will depend on the sufficiency of the Plans net assets at that time and the priority of those benefits.

NOTE 4. TAX STATUS

The Plan's administrator and the Plan's counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that, more likely than not, would not be sustained upon examination by the U.S. Federal, state, or local taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. Typically, plan tax years will remain open for three years; however, this may differ depending upon the circumstances of the Plan.

NOTE 5. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Identification of Organization

The Plan has the following related entities with which it has transactions:

- Soft Drink and Brewery Workers Union Teamsters Local 812 (Union)
- Soft Drink and Brewery Workers Union Local 812 Retirement Fund (Retirement Fund)
- Local 812 Health Fund (Health Fund)

All of the above entities qualified as tax-exempt organizations. The entities listed above share common Trustees or officers with the Plan.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan shares office space with related organizations, which is leased by the Union on a month-to-month basis. Leasehold improvements and common expenses are allocated based on cost sharing agreements between the Plan and related organizations. The Plan reimbursed the Retirement Fund the amount of \$23,847 and \$60,266 for shared expenses for the years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. As of December 31, 2024, the amount due from the Retirement Fund was \$6,236. As of December 31, 2023, the amount due from the Retirement Fund was \$49,722.

Benefits

Employees of the Union, the Retirement Fund, and the Health Fund, participate in the Plan, the Retirement Fund, and the Health Fund.

Contributions made to the Plan on behalf of all employee groups were \$55,440 and \$59,551 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The transactions above qualify as party-in-interest transactions which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 6. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Basis of Fair Value Measurement:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

NOTE 6. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (continued)

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The assets or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model-based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value level to another. In such instances, the transfer is reported at the beginning of the reporting period.

For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no transfers in or out of levels 1, 2 or 3.

NOTE 7. INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan has a traditional investment contract with Prudential Retirement, Insurance & Annuity Co. This contract is considered fully benefit responsive. Prudential maintains plan contributions with the general assets. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for plan withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract is included in the financial statements at contract value as estimated by the insurance company. The Plan's participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of the investment at contract value which represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract value, as estimated by Prudential at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$321,597 and \$258,824, respectively. The average yield, calculated for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 were approximately 2.93% and 2.23%, respectively.

There are not any events that allow the issuer to terminate the contract and which require the plan sponsor to settle at an amount different than contract value paid either within 90 days or over time.

NOTE 8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, sector and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and they have been evaluated in accordance with relevant accounting standards.
