Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Bank of Springfield Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits of the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the changes in its net assets available for benefits for the years then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Emphasis of Matter

As discussed in Note 2 and Note 3, investments amounting to \$4,197,171 and \$2,941,399 represent 99.18% and 99.53% of total assets as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, whose fair values, in the absence of readily ascertainable fair values, have been estimated by the Board of Directors with the assistance of an independent third-party appraisal firm. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2024 and 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Bank of Springfield Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is an employee stock ownership plan established in 2021, covering all full-time employees of Bank of Springfield, a subsidiary of Spring Bancorp, Inc. (the Company) who are age 21 or older and meet the eligible service requirement, which is defined as 1,000 hours of service within an employee's first 12 months of employment. The Plan excludes employees hired or rehired in a consulting capacity. An eligible employee shall become a participant of the Plan effective the first day of the Plan year in which the eligibility criteria are satisfied. The Plan operates as an employee stock ownership plan (ESOP) and is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) of 1986, as amended. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

The Company makes discretionary contributions consisting of shares of Company common stock. The common stock contribution to each eligible participant is allocated based on the total eligible compensation for all participants who meet the eligibility requirements for the Plan year. Participants who are not employed on the last day of the plan year are generally not eligible for an allocation of the discretionary contribution, except for in the case of normal retirement, death or disability. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company made contributions to the Plan in the form of common stock valued at \$942,370 and \$917,140, respectively. For the years ended December 31, 2024, and 2023, the Company also contributed recirculated shares from distributions made to participants, valued at \$54,758, and \$17,834, respectively. Contributions by participants are not required or permitted.

Contributions are subject to certain limitations as mandated by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Participant Accounts

A separate individual account is established for each participant, with each participant's account credited as of the last day of each plan year with an allocation of (a) any Company contributions and recirculated shares, (b) Plan earnings (losses), and (c) forfeitures of terminated participant's nonvested accounts and charged with the participant's benefit payments. Allocations are based on a participant's eligible compensation, relative to total eligible compensation. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance. All shares held by the Plan are allocated to participant accounts and there were no unallocated assets or liabilities as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Voting Rights

The shares of Company stock held in the Plan will be voted by the trustees. However, in the event of a stockholder vote with respect to a major corporate event such as a corporate merger or consolidation, recapitalization, liquidation, or sale of substantially all of the corporate assets, the participant is entitled to direct the trustee on how to vote the shares of Company stock allocated to their account. The trustee is not permitted to vote any allocated share for which instructions have not been given by a participant. The trustee is required, however, to vote any unallocated shares on behalf of the collective best interest of Plan participants and beneficiaries.

Put Option

Under federal income tax regulations, the Company stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradeable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the fair market value of the stock. The Company can pay for the purchase with interest over a period of five years. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

Payment of Benefits

Distributions are made in the event of retirement, total and permanent disability, death and termination of employment with the Company. If a participant terminated employment due to death, disability or retirement at or after their normal retirement date, the distribution will be made in one lump sum payment. Distributions to terminated participants for any other reason shall be in substantially equal installments over a period not longer than five years, if the vested balance is greater than \$7,000. A participant that terminates employment whose account balance is less than \$7,000 (\$5,000 prior to January 1, 2024) will receive a distribution of their vested aggregate account balance without the consent of the participant.

Payment of Benefits (Continued)

If the distribution is less than \$1,000, the distribution will be made in the form of lump sum cash. If the distribution is greater than \$1,000, but less than \$7,000, the Plan will pay the distribution in an automatic direct rollover to an individual retirement account (IRA).

The amount to be distributed is based upon the immediately preceding valuation date. Distributions are made in cash or, if a participant elects, in the form of Company common stock plus cash for any fractional share of common stock.

Under the provisions of the Plan, the Company is obligated to repurchase participant shares, which have been distributed under the terms of the Plan if the shares are not publicly traded or if the shares are subject to trading limitations.

Diversification

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least 55 with at least 10 years of participation in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a 5-year period. Since the Plan was established in 2021, diversification is not applicable for 2024.

Dividends

The Company paid a dividend to the Plan of \$0.90 per share, on 22,450 shares, and \$0.85 per share, on 15,450 shares, or \$20,205 and \$13,133 during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Cash dividends received by the Plan with respect to any share of Company stock are allocated to participant accounts based on allocated shares held by each participant account.

Vesting

Participants' vesting of their account is based on years of service for any reason other than retirement, disability or death. Participants become vested in their accounts based upon years of service, defined as 1,000 hours in a calendar year, as follows:

Forfeited Accounts

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no forfeited nonvested accounts. Future forfeited amounts will be used in accordance with the applicable plan provisions to reduce the Company's contributions, to pay administrative expenses of the Plan, or to reallocate to participants.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Cash

Cash is defined as currency on hand, in demand deposits.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements is in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP) and requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Concentration

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held a significant concentration of its assets in the common stock of Spring Bancorp, Inc., parent Company of the Plan, consistent with the Plan's purpose as an Employee Stock Ownership Plan (ESOP). Investments in Spring Bancorp, Inc. common stock represented approximately 99.18% and 99.53% of total plan assets at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition (Continued)

The investment in the Company common shares is valued at \$4,197,171 (\$144.98 per share) and \$2,941,399 (\$131.02 per share) as of December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023, respectively, based upon an appraisal performed by an independent valuation firm, and approved by management. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis and dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. As provided in the Plan agreement, administrative expenses may be paid either by the Plan or by the Company.

Recent Accounting and Regulatory Pronouncements

The SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 was signed into law on December 29, 2022. This legislation includes a vast array of provisional changes to retirement plans, becoming effective in 2023 and beyond. Plan management adopted mandatory provisions effective for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, effective January 1, 2024 with no formal amendment adopted. Plan management continues to evaluate the impact of the optional provisions of SECURE 2.0 and awaiting additional regulatory guidance from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and Department of Labor (DOL). The application of SECURE 2.0 Act did not have a material effect on the Plan's financial statements for the plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan will be amended to reflect any changes made in response to SECURE 2.0 prior to the deadline set by law or applicable regulations.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- a. Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets,
- b. Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets,
- c. Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability,
- d. Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full-term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

Common stock: Investments in the Company common stock are valued by an independent appraisal as of the last day of each annual reporting period. In approaching the valuation, a variety of factors are taken into consideration, including:

- a. The nature and history of the business, its current position, and its outlook,
- b. The general and relevant economic conditions prevailing at the time of the appraisal; and
- c. The current conditions and outlook in the market in which the subject company competes.

The approach to determining fair value of the common stock involved the following:

- a. Determine estimated fair value of shares of common stock using the Earnings Value Method, which considers the current earning power of the Company and current market price to earnings ratios for other banks and bank holding companies.
- b. Determine estimated fair value of shares based upon the book value of the Company and current price to book value ratios of publicly traded banks and holding
- c. Conclusion of the fair value is based on the weighted average of the approaches discussed above.

These policies and procedures are reassessed annually to determine if the current valuation techniques are still appropriate. At that time, the unobservable inputs used in the fair value measurements are evaluated and adjusted, as necessary, based on current market conditions and other third-party information.

Demand deposit account: Valued at the deposit account balance, payable on demand.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Fair Value of Level 3 Assets

The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model-based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value level to another. We evaluate the significance of transfers between levels based upon the nature of the financial instrument and size of the transfer relative to total net assets available for benefits.

The Plan's Level 3 assets for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 included purchases of \$942,370 and \$917,140, respectively. There were no transfers into or out of Level 3 during 2024 and 2023.

5. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in the value of their account and the interest of each participant in the trust fund will be distributed to such participant or his or her beneficiary at the time prescribed by the Plan terms and the IRC.

6. TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by letter dated February 22, 2023, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC.

US GAAP requires management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan's investments, which include 28,950 shares of the Company's common stock, are held by the Trustees of the Plan. Transactions involving the funds administered by the Company are considered party-in-interest transactions. The Plan's other investments are managed by the custodian; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. These transactions are not, however, considered prohibited transactions under 29 CFR 408(b) of the ERISA regulations. Certain administrative expenses are paid by the Company. These transactions qualified as party-in-interest. Employees of the Company provide administrative services to the Plan for which no fees are charged.

8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests primarily in Company stock. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, liquidity, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in their value will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

9. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through August 25, 2025, which was the date that these financial statements were available for issuance and determined that there were no significant nonrecognized subsequent events through that date.
