To the Participants and Administrator of the

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Sefar 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Opinion

The following description of the Sefar 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan with salary reduction features as permitted under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan is funded by employee and employer contributions and covers all employees of Sefar, Inc. (the Company, or the Plan Sponsor) who are not covered by a collective bargaining agreement. For the purposes of both employee deferrals and employer match, employees who have completed three months of service and have attained the age of 21 are eligible to participate the first day of the month coincident with or next following satisfaction of the eligibility requirements. Plan investments are maintained in investment funds held by John Hancock Life Insurance Company of New York (John Hancock). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Pension Plan Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and is responsible for oversight of the Plan.

Contributions: Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). All participants who are eligible to make elective deferral contributions may elect to designate all or any of their deferral contributions as a Roth elective deferral contribution. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Plan Sponsor may make a matching contribution that is a discretionary percentage to be determined by the Company. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the matching contribution was 100% of the employees' elective deferrals, up to a maximum of the greater of \$1,400 or 3% of the participant's qualified compensation. Employer matching contributions are recorded each pay period.

Additionally, the Plan Sponsor, at its discretion, may make a profit sharing contribution to the Plan based on the employee's compensation proportionate to the compensation of all participants. In order for a participant to receive the profit sharing contribution, the employee must complete 1,000 hours of service, as defined, and be employed on the last day of the Plan year. No profit sharing contribution was made by the Plan Sponsor during the years ended December 31, 2024 or 2023. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit sharing contribution and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting: Participants are vested immediately in their employee, employer matching and employer profit sharing contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Notes Receivable from Participants: Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates that range from 4.25% to 9.50%. The interest rate is set at 1% above the prime rate, as defined in the Plan's loan policy. Principal and interest is paid ratably through weekly or biweekly payroll deductions.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1. PLAN DESCRIPTION (CONTINUED)

Excess Contributions Payable: Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2025 and the 2023 excess contributions prior to March 15, 2024.

Payment of Benefits: Unless a participant elects otherwise, distributions will be made as soon as practical after a participant's normal retirement date or actual retirement date occurs. The normal retirement date is the date upon which a participant reaches age 65.

Participants may receive their accumulated vested benefits held by the Plan's custodian upon termination of employment or elect to keep their vested balance in the Plan until the earlier of normal retirement age, death, or disability if their account balance is in excess of \$1,000. If the participant elects to keep their vested interest in the Plan, the participant's account will continue to receive its share of earnings and losses. The Plan also allows hardship distributions and other in-service distributions under certain circumstances.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Pension Plan Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and custodian. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants: Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the participant loan is deemed to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses: Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

NOTE 3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820: *Fair Value Measurements*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts: The separate accounts are stated at net asset value (NAV) per unit based on the quoted market prices of the underlying investments. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the separate accounts will sell the investments for an amount different from the NAV. In accordance with Subtopic 820-10, investments that were measured at net asset value per share (or its equivalent) are not required to be classified in the fair value hierarchy.

The following tables summarize investments for which fair value is measured using the net asset value per share practical expedient as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 5. PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain plan investments are pooled separate accounts currently managed by John Hancock. John Hancock is the custodian as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. Administrative fees paid by the Plan amounted to \$9,524 for the year ended December 31, 2024 (\$7,299 - 2023). The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

NOTE 6. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

NOTE 7. TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted a non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan sponsored by Associated Pension Consultants, Inc. The non-standardized pre-approved plan has received an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 from the IRS as to the non-standardized pre-approved plan's qualified status. The opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
