Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(c) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Texas Tech Federal Credit Union 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of Texas Tech Federal Credit Union 401(k) Plan's (the Plan) financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

The supplemental schedule of assets held for investment purposes and schedule of reportable transactions as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024 are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Texas Tech Federal Credit Union 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Plan covers employees of Texas Tech Federal Credit Union, referred to as the “Employer”. The Plan was originally established and effective beginning January 1, 2011.

Eligibility – Employees are eligible for participation in the Plan after completing three months of service and attainment of age 18 years. Eligible employees become participants of the Plan on either the first day of each month following the satisfaction of the eligibility requirements.

Contributions – Under the Plan, the participant and the Employer are both allowed to make contributions. The participants are allowed to contribute a portion of their salary to the Plan subject to those limitations provided for in Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision where all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan, unless they elect not to participate, with a default deferral rate set at 6% of eligible compensation. The Employer makes safe harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of salary deferrals that do not exceed six percent of compensation.

Forfeitures – There are no forfeitures. All contributions are fully vested.

Vesting – Participants are always fully vested in their contributions and in the Employer matching contributions upon entering the Plan.

Participant Accounts – Each participant has one account that will consist of sub-accounts designated for participant contributions and Employer match contributions. Participant contribution accounts are credited with the participant’s contributions and the earnings of the specific investment vehicles selected. Participants may self-direct their contributions to pooled separate accounts and the stable value fund.

The Employer match contribution accounts are credited with the Employer’s matching contribution. Participants may also self-direct the Employer account to pooled separate accounts and the stable value fund.

Payment of Benefits – Upon normal retirement age or death, a participant or beneficiary may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the vested balance of the participant's account, or substantially equal installments over a period not to exceed the participant's lifetime or the joint lifetime of the participant and spouse. Participants may receive distributions prior to separation of service after normal retirement age is reached. Distributions to terminated participants will be made as soon as administratively feasible and an automatic distribution will be made to those participants with a vested balance below \$5,000. Hardship distributions are allowed under the Plan.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Investments are reported at fair value other than the Stable Value Fund which is recorded at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

3. Administration of Plan Assets

The Plan assets are held by the Trustee of the Plan. Employer and participant contributions are invested by the Trustee as directed by the participants. The administrative expenses associated with the third-party administrator for the Plan are paid directly by the participants. Other expenses associated with the Trustee of the Plan are paid by the Employer. Certain fees are paid by the participants' investment funds to their affiliated investment advisors, transfer agents and recordkeeper as further described in each fund prospectus, plan service agreements, or other published documents. These fees were deducted prior to allocation of the Plan's investment earnings activity and thus are not separately identifiable as an expense.

4. Information Prepared and Certified by Trustee

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB), *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provide the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets, inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, or inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Pooled Separate Accounts: The net asset value (NAV) of the pooled separate accounts is used as a practical method to determine fair value for these accounts. Each pooled separate account provides for redemptions by the Plan at reported NAV per share, with no advance notice requirement; therefore, these funds are classified within Level 2 of the valuation hierarchy. Investments in this category can be transferred once every 30 days at the current NAV per share based on the fair value of its underlying investments. Participants are not allowed to transfer back into this category until the 30-day period has expired. New contributions are allowed during this time period.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Net Asset Value (NAV) Per Share

Entities are permitted, as a practical method, to estimate the fair value of investments within its scope using the NAV per share of the investment as of the reporting entity's measurement dates.

The Plan has expanded its disclosure to include the category, fair value, redemption frequency, and redemption notice period for those assets whose fair value is estimated using the net asset value per share or its equivalent for which the fair value is not readily determinable at December 31, 2024 and 2023. For the Plan, such assets include investments in pooled separate accounts.

6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right, under the Plan, to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

7. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

8. Tax Status

The Plan is operating under a prototype plan through Principal Life Insurance Company. The Plan administrator and Plan's tax counsel still believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements for the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

The Plan adopted the "uncertain tax positions" provisions of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The primary tax position of the Plan is its filing status as a tax-exempt entity. The Plan determined that it is more likely than not that its tax positions would be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), or other State taxing authority. There were no penalties or interest recognized during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan is no longer subject to U.S. federal income tax examinations by federal taxing authorities for years before 2021.

9. Related Party Transactions

Certain Plan investments are shares of pooled separate accounts and stable value funds that are managed by Principal Life Insurance Company. Principal Life Insurance Company is the Trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 fees were paid by the Plan for the investment management services amounted to \$34,506 and \$28,948, respectively.

10. Reconciliation of Financial Statements to Schedule H of Form 5500

The accompanying financial statements show different amounts for contributions than what is represented in Schedule H of the Form 5500 because those amounts that are receivable at year end are not reflected on the Form 5500.
