Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of The Contractors Retirement Plan Sponsored by Hanford Applied Restoration & Conservation, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of The Contractors Retirement Plan Sponsored by Hanford Applied Restoration & Conservation's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-12 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to such asset information related to the Plan's investment in the Contractors Retirement Plan Master Trust, a trust meeting the requirements of 29 CFR 2520.103-12 (b) and (c) as a Direct Filing Entity (DFE) or 103-12 Investment Entity (103-12 IE) described in the instructions to Form 5500 Annual Return/Report.

Management has informed us that the 103-12 IE qualifies as a DFE under the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Act of 1974 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section –

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the Plan's investment in the 103-12 IE, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by the 103-12 IE meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of The Contractors Retirement Plan Sponsored by Hanford Applied Restoration & Conservation and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note B to the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements and supplemental schedules are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibility of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note B, this includes determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about The Contractors Retirement Plan Sponsored by Hanford Applied Restoration & Conservation's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and, therefore, is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists.

The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Our audits did not extend to the investment information associated with the 103-12 IE, except for obtaining and reading the Form 5500 of the 103-12 IE, comparing the 103-12 IE investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the 103-12 IE information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of the modified cash basis of accounting.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the 103-12 IE information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. A. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of The Contractors Retirement Plan sponsored by Hanford Applied Restoration & Conservation (Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was formed effective January 1, 2001, was restated on January 1, 2022 upon adoption of The Contractors Retirement Plan and is a non-standardized defined contribution plan which contains a cash or deferred arrangement pursuant to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Participation

Eligible individuals consist of employees rendering services for Hanford Applied Restoration & Conservation (Plan Sponsor) on contracts subject to the Davis-Bacon Act, Service Contract Act or other federal, state or municipal prevailing wage laws. Other employees whose services are not subject to such prevailing wage laws may be included. There is no age or service requirement to participate in prevailing wage. Participants must be 21 years of age with no service requirement to participate in employer nonelective contributions. Participants must be 21 years of age with 3 months of service to participate in employee deferrals and corresponding safe harbor matching contributions. Participants must be 21 years of age with one year of service to participate in employer discretionary matching contributions.

Contributions

Participants may elect to defer a portion of their compensation (as defined). The company shall make safe harbor matching contributions. In addition, the Plan may make employer nonelective contributions and/or employer discretionary matching contributions, as well as prevailing wage contributions, determined by the employer based on rates that satisfy the wage determination issued by the governmental agency responsible for certain contracts. Such contributions cannot exceed the lesser of 100% of the employee's compensation or \$69,000 for the reportable Plan year. Rollover contributions are also allowed.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s elective deferral and an allocation of the employer’s contribution. Each participant has the authority to direct the investment of their account to one or more of the investment funds designated as investment options by the Plan Sponsor. Investment gain or loss is recognized in participants’ accounts on a daily basis as the unit values of the funds change. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the distributable value of the participant’s account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Upon application by any participant of the Plan, and subject to such rules as the Plan Administrator may establish, the Plan Administrator may in his/her discretion direct the Trustee to make a loan to such participant, not to exceed (including interest) the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant’s vested balance. Any loans made pursuant to the Plan prior to January 1, 2024, will bear a rate of interest equal to the prime rate at the loan origination date. Loans made after January 1, 2024, will bear a rate of interest equal to the prime rate at the loan origination date plus one percent. The interest rate on loan balances was 3.25%-9.50% for the year ended December 31, 2024. The loan is secured by a pledge of such participant’s vested balance and principal and interest are paid ratably by the participant.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their share of prevailing wage contributions, employee deferral contributions, employer safe harbor matching contributions, and net Trust earnings allocated to their accounts. Employer nonelective contributions and employer discretionary matching contributions vest according to the following schedule:

Regardless of the vesting schedule above, a participant is automatically fully vested in their share of employer nonelective and employer discretionary matching contributions upon death, total and permanent disability, or reaching the age of early retirement, which is age 55.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures, if any, may be used to reduce future employer contributions and Plan expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were unallocated forfeitures balances of \$212 and \$213, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeited account balances totaling \$3,221 were used to reduce plan expenses, and \$213 were used to reduce employer contributions.

Benefit Payments

Under terms of the Plan, participants are eligible for benefit payments upon reaching age 55. The Plan also provides for distributions to participants, or their beneficiaries, upon death, disability, and termination of employment. Withdrawals from the plan may also be made upon circumstances of financial hardship in accordance with the provisions specified in the plan. Participants may choose to have benefits paid directly to them or to have benefits paid directly to another qualified retirement plan or individual retirement arrangement on their behalf.

Plan Termination

The employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

Trustee and Special Trustee

SMARTTS, LLC dba SMART Trust Services (previously known as ERISA Smart, Inc.) is the directed trustee, and LeafHouse Financial is the ERISA 3(38) Investment Manager Fiduciary of The Contractors Retirement Plan Master Trust (Trust). The duties of the Investment Manager include selection and monitoring of the investment funds available to the Plan Sponsors that participate in the Trust. The directed trustee fee is a flat fee of \$34,880 annually, paid monthly and allocated on a per capita basis to the participants in the Trust. The investment manager's fee is 0.04% of the Trust assets annually, paid monthly and allocated on a per capita basis to the participants in the Trust. The employer also designates a Special Trustee for the Plan in the adoption agreement and is responsible for the collection of plan contributions.

B. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting and present net assets available for benefits and changes in those net assets.

Basis of Presentation – Continued

Under the modified cash basis of accounting utilized, contributions are recognized when received rather than when accrued by the employer. In addition, benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid and administrative expenses are accrued monthly by the Plan.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for investments in various investment securities, which in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility risks. Market risks include global events, which could impact the value of investment securities, such as international conflicts. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The fair value of the Plan's interest in the Trust (as defined in Note D) is based on the beginning of year value of the Plan's interest in the Trust plus actual contributions and allocated investment income less actual distributions and allocated administrative expenses.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest and dividend income is recorded when received. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – Continued

Management fees and expenses charged to the Plan for some investment accounts are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

Benefit Payments

Benefits to participants are recorded by the Plan when actual payment is made.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payment transactions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses.

C. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan follows FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, which defines and establishes a framework for measuring fair value and expands disclosures about fair value measurements. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (i.e. an exit price). FASB ASC 820 includes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 – Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible to the Plan at the measurement date for identical assets and liabilities.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities that are observable either directly or indirectly for substantially the full term of the asset or liability. Level 2 inputs include the following:

- Quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets

- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets of liabilities in active markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means

Level 3 – Unobservable inputs for the assets or liabilities (i.e., supported by little or no market activity). Level 3 inputs include management’s own assumption about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability (including assumptions about risk).

The asset or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Group Trust - 103-12 Investment Entity: The investment is valued based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. The Net Asset Value (“NAV”) is based on the market value of the underlying investments. The NAV is not a publicly quoted price in an active market.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflected of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Investments, at fair value, that are valued using NAV as a practical expedient totaled \$17,893,403 and \$19,052,228 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. There are no unfunded commitments at December 31, 2024 or 2023. The fund has a daily redemption frequency and redemption notice period.

D. INVESTMENT IN RETIREMENT PLAN GROUP TRUST

The Plan invests in a group trust, The Contractors Retirement Plan Master Trust (Trust), sponsored by Fringe Benefit Group, Inc. Under the terms of the plan document, all assets of the Plan are maintained in the Trust.

The Trust files a Form 5500 as a 103-12 Investment Entity.

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-12 of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the following information was not subjected to any auditing procedures performed by the Plan's independent auditor other than comparing such information provided by the Trust to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule:

- Investments, at fair value, as shown in the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Total investment income as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Schedule H, line 4i – schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

The Contractors Retirement Plan Master Trust does not meet the definition of a master trust as that term is most commonly used. The Plan's investment in the Trust represents the allocated net portion of the Trust that is attributable to The Contractors Retirement Plan sponsored by Hanford Applied Restoration & Conservation and includes all the Plan's investments.

The Plan's share of the net assets of the Trust is based on the underlying participant account values including the effects of contributions, allocated net investment income, withdrawals, and allocated administrative expenses. Net investment income, gains and losses are allocated to participating plans on a daily basis based on participants' investment choices. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan's interest in the net assets of the Trust was approximately 1%.

During the year ended December 31, 2023, Administration of the Trust elected to consolidate the assets of the Trust to a single insurance company, and on December 28, 2023, all investments held by Nationwide Trust Company were transferred to Transamerica Life Insurance Company. The investments held in the Trust are stated at either fair or contract value. Investments are valued based on unit values as reported to the Trust Transamerica Life Insurance Company holding assets for the Trust.

E. PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan is part of the Trust whose recordkeeper and sponsor is Fringe Benefit Group, Inc. Various administrative expenses and asset charges of the Trust are paid to Fringe Benefit Group, Inc. and are allocated to the Plan. The Plan Administrator for the Plan is the employer, or any other individual, committee or group appointed by the employer to serve in that capacity. Effective January 1, 2024, Transamerica Retirement Solutions (“TRS”) was assigned certain transactional and recordkeeping duties of the Plan.

The Plan Administrator, Special Trustee as referenced in Note A, Investment Manager and the Trustee are named as fiduciaries under the Plan. The sponsor of the Trust, Investment Manager, and Trustee are fiduciaries of the Trust as described in the Trust Agreement. All the above-named service providers for the Plan are considered parties in interest under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and are subject to ERISA rules concerning transactions with the Plan.

F. INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE STATUS

The Master Plan Sponsor obtained its latest opinion letter, dated August 24, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Master Plan was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Such an opinion is not a determination as to whether The Contractors Retirement Plan sponsored by Hanford Applied Restoration & Conservation itself qualifies under IRC Section 401(a); however, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe the Plan was qualified as of the financial statement date.

The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdiction; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

G. PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS

During the year ended December 31, 2024, Hanford Applied Restoration & Conservation, the Plan's Sponsor, failed to deposit one employee deferral contribution to the Plan's trust in a timely manner in accordance with Department of Labor and Regulations. A contribution totaling \$22 relating to one pay period during the year ended December 31, 2024, was deposited late. This instance of late deposit resulted in a prohibited nonexempt transaction in the form of a loan between the Plan and the Plan Sponsor. The company will make an interest payment to compensate the Plan for lost earnings related to this prohibited transaction.

H. PARTIAL PLAN TERMINATION

During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan Sponsor experienced the loss of contracts resulting in the termination of more than 20% of the Plan participants; accordingly, the Plan Sponsor determined that a partial plan termination had occurred. All participants who were affected by terminations were fully vested in their account balances.

I. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan evaluated its December 31, 2024 financial statements for subsequent events through September 29, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

On February 27, 2025, The Dutra Group acquired Hanford Applied Restoration & Conservation through a stock purchase agreement.

On April 22, 2025, the Board of Directors signed a resolution to terminate The Contractors Retirement Plan sponsored by Hanford Applied Restoration & Conservation effective April 30, 2025. Participation in The Contractors Retirement Plan shall cease upon the distribution of all Plan account balances to the Plan participants. As of September 29, 2025, the date of this report, the Plan has not distributed the account balances to the Plan participants.
