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## Note 1 - Description of the Plan

The following brief description of Anika Therapeutics, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

### General

The Plan was established on January 1, 1993 as a defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), generally covering all employees of Anika Therapeutics, Inc. (the "Company") who have attained the age of 21 years or older. Effective May 1, 2021, the Plan amended the eligibility requirement to one month of service with the Company. The Company is the Plan administrator. Fidelity Management Trust Company ("Fidelity") serves as trustee, recordkeeper, and custodian of Plan assets.

The Plan includes an employees' thrift savings plan established under the provisions of Internal Revenue Code Section 401(k). Under the savings plan, a certain percentage of employees' wages, as defined in the Plan, can be deferred as an employee contribution to the Plan.

There were no significant changes to the Plan during the year ended December 31, 2024.

### Enrollment

After meeting the eligibility requirements, an employee shall be deemed to have elected to become a participant and have 5% of their eligible compensation contributed to the Plan. Automatic enrollment will occur 30 days after the date of hire, but no sooner than the commencement of employment. Participants may elect to increase this deferral percentage up to 60% of eligible compensation or decline to have any amount deducted from their compensation. Employees who have begun participating in the Plan who fail to affirmatively make a selection of investment fund(s) to defer their wages to, shall have their contributions invested in the Target Date Fund based on their estimated date of retirement. Participants may change their deferral percentage at any time.

Effective June 9, 2025, the Plan has been amended to change the eligibility requirements that remove the waiting period (one month of service) and entry date requirements for new participants' enrollment in the Plan. New hires will be eligible to participate in the plan as early as administratively possible, typically 1-2 pay periods after initiating their enrollment. If the new hire takes no action, auto enrollment in the Plan occurs after 30 days.

### Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 60% of eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may elect to designate a portion or all of their contributions as Roth 401(k) Contributions that are includable in the participant's gross income at the time deferred. Participants may also make rollover contributions representing distributions from other qualified plans. Discretionary Matching Employer Contributions and Nonelective Employer Contributions may be contributed at the option of the Company's Board of Directors. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made a Discretionary Matching Employer Contribution of \$2,271,608 equal to 140% of the first 5% of eligible compensation that a participant contributed to the Plan. There is no service requirement for the Discretionary Employer Matching Contribution, but participants are subject to certain vesting requirements. To be eligible for the Nonelective Employer Contribution, the participant must have at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year. For the year ended

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December 31, 2024, the Company did not make a Nonelective Employer Contribution. Contributions are subject to certain limitations and eligibility requirements apply to such contributions. As of January 1, 2025, the Discretionary Matching Employer Contribution changed to 100% of the first 5% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan and all vesting requirements were eliminated.

### Participant Accounts

Each participant account is credited and/or debited with (a) the participant's contributions, (b) Discretionary Matching Employer Contributions and an allocation of Nonelective Employer Contributions, if any, (c) plan earnings/losses, and (d) plan expenses. Allocations of the Nonelective Employer Contributions are based on participant compensation. Allocations of plan earnings are based on account balances, as defined. The benefit, to which a participant is entitled, is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

### Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their salary deferral contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Discretionary Matching Employer Contribution and Nonelective Employer Contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon are based on years of credited service. A participant is 100% vested after four years of credited service. As of January 1, 2025, participants are immediately vested in the Discretionary Matching Employer Contribution and Nonelective Employer Contribution plus actual earnings thereon.

### Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, and at any time during the year, a participant may direct their contributions in one percent increments to various investment options comprised of certain selected mutual funds and collective investment trusts. Participants may reallocate their funds or redirect new contributions on a daily basis among any of the funds offered in the Plan.

### Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the participant's vested account balance and bear interest at rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. Generally, notes must be repaid within five years unless being used to purchase a principal residence. Participants may have only one note outstanding at a time.

### Payment of Benefits

On termination of service, retirement, disability or death, participants or beneficiaries are entitled to a distribution equal to the total value of the participant's vested account. A participant or beneficiary may elect to receive the value of the vested account in a lump-sum cash payment or a rollover distribution to an eligible retirement account, or a combination of both payout options. Effective April 1, 2022, the Plan was amended to allow a participant or beneficiary to elect to receive the vested amount in their account through installment payments.

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For vested balances of less than \$1,000, benefit payments shall be made to the participant in the form of a lump sum payment. If the vested balance is greater than \$1,000, but less than \$7,000, benefit payments are automatically rolled over to an IRA account unless a distribution is requested by the participant. If the vested balance is greater than \$7,000, the participant or beneficiary may defer payment benefits until required by law to receive minimum required distributions.

Participants may withdraw from their vested accounts upon certain hardship situations defined in the Plan or upon attainment of age 59 1/2.

### Plan Amendment and Termination

The Plan may be amended at any time by the plan sponsor, provided that no such amendment may deprive participants of their vested benefits. Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, all participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

### Forfeitures

Forfeitures can be used to reduce plan expenses related to the administration of the Plan or to reduce future employer contributions. Forfeited non-vested accounts in the amount of \$481,531 were used to reduce employer matching contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, unallocated forfeitures amounted to \$32 and \$83,518, respectively.

### Administrative Expenses

Generally, expenses are paid by the plan sponsor. Fees for the origination of notes receivable from participants, maintenance of former employees' participant accounts, and other administrative expenses are paid by the participants. Investment management fees charged to the Plan are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately stated. During the plan year ended December 31, 2024, fees paid by the Plan's participants amounted to \$29,789.

## **Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

### Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in conformity with U.S. Generally Accepted Accounting Principles ("GAAP").

### Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amount of net assets available for benefits at the date of the financial statements and the changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities, if applicable, at the date of the financial statements. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

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### Investments

All investments are recorded at fair value in these financial statements. Fair value is measured in accordance with U.S. GAAP as more fully described in Note 4. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation/depreciation in fair value of investments includes realized and unrealized gains and losses on the fair value of investments held by the Plan.

### Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when incurred. Delinquent notes receivable are reclassified as distributions in accordance with the terms of the Plan document. Management has determined that no allowance for credit losses is necessary as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

### Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

### Income Tax Status

The Plan operates under a Fidelity Volume Submitter Plan. The Fidelity Volume Submitter Plan being utilized obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Fidelity Volume Submitter Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and that the Plan was qualified as of the financial statement date. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

In determining the recognition of uncertain tax positions, the Plan applies a more-likely-than-not recognition threshold and determines the measurement of uncertain tax positions considering the amounts and probabilities of the outcomes that could be realized upon ultimate settlement with taxing authorities. As of December 31, 2024, the Plan has no uncertain tax positions that qualify for either recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is generally subject to potential examination by taxing jurisdictions for the prior three years. Currently, no audits for any tax periods are in progress.

### Subsequent Events

The date to which events occurring after December 31, 2024 have been evaluated for possible adjustment to the financial statements or disclosure is the date of the Independent Auditor's Report which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Fair value is defined under U.S. GAAP as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date. The Plan is required to maximize the use of observable inputs, minimize the use of unobservable inputs, and disclose in the form of an outlined hierarchy the details of such fair value measurements. The hierarchy of valuation techniques is based on whether the inputs to fair value measurement are considered to be observable or unobservable in a marketplace. Observable inputs reflect market data obtained from independent sources, while unobservable inputs reflect the Plan's market assumptions. The hierarchy requires the use of observable market data and gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The fair value hierarchy is based on three levels of inputs as follows:

Level 1 - Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2 - Observable inputs other than those included in Level 1. For example, quoted prices for similar assets in active markets or quoted prices for identical assets in inactive markets.

Level 3 - Unobservable inputs reflecting management's own assumptions about the inputs used in estimating the value of the assets.

Following is a description of the Plan's valuation methodologies for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

### *Mutual Funds*

These investments are public investment vehicles valued using the Net Asset Value ("NAV") provided by the administrator of the fund and calculated at the close of business on the NYSE. The NAV is based on the value of the underlying asset owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. Investments in mutual funds are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

### *Collective Investment Trusts ("CITs")*

The Plan's investments in collective investment trusts are public investment securities valued using the net asset value ("NAV") provided by Matrix Trust Company. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur

daily. The CITs do not have any unfunded commitments relating to their investments, and participant directed redemptions have no restrictions. These investments measured at net asset value per share have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value amounts presented in the table below are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the line items presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

## Note 5 - Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan. Accordingly, certain transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, fees from notes receivable from participants, maintenance fees, and other administrative expenses totaling \$29,789 were charged to participant accounts and paid to the Plan's trustee. Investment related expenses are included in realized and unrealized gains and losses, net. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Company, as plan sponsor, pays certain administrative expenses of the Plan.

## Note 6 - Notes Receivable from Participants

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, notes receivable from participants bear interest at rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50% and maturing at various dates through April 2033.

## Note 7 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of the Plan's investments, such as a pandemic, recession or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.
