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### To the Plan Administrator Growve 401(k) Plan

#### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Growve 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 7 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

#### Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the *Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP).
- the information in the financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

#### Basis for Opinion

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with US GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with US GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

## Notes to Financial Statements

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### 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Growve 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants and other users of the financial statements should refer to the Plan document, adoption agreement and summary plan description for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### **General**

The Plan was created on January 1, 2023 and is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Viva 5, LLC dba Growve, APAK Packaging, LLC, Sunwarrior Ventures, LLC, Nutraself, LLC, Smoky Mountain Ventures, LLC, and Vitauthority, LLC. To be eligible to participate in the Plan, employees must be at least 18 years of age and have completed two-months of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

#### **Contributions**

Contributions to the Plan include: (i) salary reduction contributions authorized by participants, (ii) safe harbor matching contributions made by the Company, (iii) discretionary matching contributions made by the Company, and (iv) participant rollovers from other plans.

Participants may elect to contribute a percentage of their eligible compensation, as defined by the Plan document, to the Plan each year, subject to the limitations of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Regular 401(k) contributions are excluded from the participant's taxable income for federal income tax purposes until received as a withdrawal or distribution from the Plan. Roth 401(k) contributions are not excluded from the participant's taxable income for federal income tax purposes, but withdrawals of contributions and earnings thereon at retirement are tax free. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Company made a safe-harbor matching contribution to each participant's account equal to 100% of the first 3% of each participant's contribution, plus 50% of the next 2% of each participant's contribution.

Additional discretionary amounts may be contributed at the discretion of the Company's board. During the year-ended December 31, 2024, the Company did not make additional discretionary contributions to the Plan.

#### **Participant Accounts**

Individual accounts are maintained for each participant of the Plan. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. Participants may direct the investment of their account balance into various investment options offered by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

#### **Vesting**

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and safe-harbor matching contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. Vesting in Company discretionary matching contributions to participant accounts, and earnings thereon, is based on years of service as follows:

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### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of one-half of the vested account balance or \$50,000. The loans are secured by an assignment of a participant's vested interest in the Plan, and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates at the time funds are borrowed as determined by the Plan Administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions or as a lump sum for the outstanding loan balance. Loan terms range from one to five years; however, terms may exceed five years for the purchase of a primary residence. As of December 31, 2024, participant loans had maturities through June 2053 at interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%.

### ***Payment of Benefits***

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. Participants are also eligible to make hardship withdrawals from their deferred contributions in the event of certain financial hardships.

### ***Administrative Expenses***

Plan administrative expenses may be charged directly to the Plan (either allocated to the participants or using forfeiture funds) or paid by the Employer. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan paid \$49,372 of administrative expenses. Certain administrative expenses are paid by the Company. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in the fair value of investments in the statement of changes in assets available for benefits.

### ***Forfeitures***

When certain terminations of participation in the Plan occur, the nonvested portion of the participant's account represents a forfeiture. The Plan document permits the use of forfeitures to either reduce future Employer contributions or pay Plan administrative expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$13,873 and \$7,620, respectively. During 2024, forfeited amounts totaled \$6,101, and investment gains on forfeited account balances was \$152. Forfeitures during 2024 were for terminated individuals who were part of the Sunwarrior 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan prior to the merger into the Plan.

### ***Plan Termination***

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants become 100% vested in their accounts.

## **2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

### ***Basis of Accounting***

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared using the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP).

### ***Use of Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

### ***Risks and Uncertainties***

The Plan provides for investments in securities that are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, currency exchange rate, credit, and the overall fluctuation in the market. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

### **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit responsive contract, which is reported at contract value). Investments in mutual funds are stated at fair value based upon quoted market prices. The fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract is recorded at contract value, which is calculated as contributions plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses, minus early withdrawal charges, which charges are contractually defined.

Net appreciation of investments includes realized and unrealized gains or losses on investments and is recognized in income currently. Amounts invested may earn interest and dividends, which in turn are reinvested. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions when the participant has a distributable event.

### **Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid by the Plan.

### **Subsequent Events**

Plan management has evaluated events occurring subsequent to year-end through September 18, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

## **3. Fair Value Measurements**

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Financial Accounting Standards Board established a framework for measuring fair value in the form of a fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes inputs into valuation techniques used to measure fair value into three broad levels. This hierarchy requires assets to be classified by level in their entirety based upon the lowest level of input that was significant to the fair value measurement. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows:

Level 1 : Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2: Observable inputs other than Level 1, including quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in less active markets, or other observable inputs that can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3: Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market data for financial instruments whose value is determined using pricing models, discounted cash flow methodologies, or similar techniques, as well as instruments for which the determination of fair value requires significant management judgment or estimation.

#### **4. Fully Benefit Responsive Guaranteed Investment Contract**

As of December 31, 2024, the Plan had a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract (GIC) with Empower Annuity Insurance Company. Empower Annuity Insurance maintains the contributions in a general account, which is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Accordingly, the GIC is considered a traditional investment contract. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0 percent. The contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date. Since the GIC is fully benefit-responsive, it is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. Management has concluded that no events are probable of occurring that would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

#### **5. Exempt Party-In-Interest Transactions**

Certain Plan investments are managed by Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Annuity Insurance Company, who are the trustees of the Plan. These transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. The notes receivable from participants are also exempt party-in-interest transactions.

#### **6. Federal Income Tax Status**

The Plan uses a prototype plan document sponsored by National Benefit Services, LLC (NBS). NBS received an opinion letter from the IRS, dated June 30, 2020, which states that the prototype document satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service. However, Plan management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

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US GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by tax authorities. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions of the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there were no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits in tax jurisdictions for tax years for which the applicable statutes of limitations have not expired; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

#### **7. Information Certified by the Trustee**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under that election, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Annuity Insurance Company, the trustees of the Plan, except for comparing such information certified by the trustees to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedules:

- All investment assets held by the Plan
- Notes receivable from participants
- The recording of transactions related to all investment assets and notes receivable from participants, including related earnings (losses) and interest and dividends.
