Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Goodwill Retirement Savings 403(b) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Basis for Opinion

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following brief description of the Goodwill Retirement Savings 403(b) Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information.

General — The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering eligible employees of Goodwill of Colorado, Goodwill Industrial Services Corporation and Discover Goodwill Foundation of Southern and Western Colorado (collectively, the Organization). Employees are eligible to make elective deferrals to the Plan immediately upon hire, excluding independent contractors and employees defined as service employees as defined in the Service Contract Act. Participating employees who are at least 18 years old and have completed one year of service with at least 1,000 hours are eligible to receive employer contributions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

Contributions — The Plan provides for employee salary deferral contributions, before and after tax, up to a maximum of 100% of annual compensation subject to maximum tax-deferred limitations established by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Eligible employees who have reached age 50 during the plan year may elect to make catch-up contributions, as limited by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Participants may also make contributions to the Plan in the form of a rollover of funds from another qualified plan. The Organization has a matching contribution of 100% up to 2% of participant contributions and allows for a discretionary contribution for all eligible employees.

Participants' Accounts — Each participant shall have one account and such account will be credited with the participant's contributions, an allocation of the Organization's contributions and an allocation of the Plan's earnings and losses. The Plan's earnings or losses other than those on loans to participants are allocated among those participating in each fund based upon the proportion that each participant's account bears to the total participants' account balances related to that fund. Earnings resulting from loans to participants are credited to the respective participants' accounts. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants — Until January 2020, participants were allowed to borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of (a) \$50,000 or (b) 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with prevailing rates. Principal and interest are paid ratably through regular payroll deductions. Subsequent to January 2020, no additional notes receivable are allowed to be issued from the Plan.

Benefit Payments — Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or various installment annuities.

For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. The Plan allows for terminated participant vested account balances of \$5,000 or less to be automatically rolled out of the Plan into an individual retirement account. The IRS has required minimum distributions once a participant reaches age 73 during the previous plan year and is no longer employed by the Organization. A participant may also elect to receive an account distribution if the participant has attained the age 59½ or incurred a hardship in accordance with the Plan provisions.

Vesting — Participants are 100% vested in their contributions and the related allocation of the Plan's earnings and losses thereon. Participants vest in the employer matching and discretionary contributions after three years of service. A participant's account becomes 100% vested upon death, attaining normal retirement age or retirement due to disability.

Forfeitures — If a participant is not fully vested on his or her termination date, the nonvested amount of the account is forfeited. Forfeitures are used to reduce future employer contributions. Forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions were \$191,633 and \$140,791 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Forfeited non-vested account balances totaled \$1,701, at December 31, 2023. There were no forfeited non-vested account balances at December 31, 2024

Plan Termination — While it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, funds in the participant accounts become 100% vested.

Administrative Expenses — Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Organization. Expenses that are paid by the Organization are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting — The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition — Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants. The plan administrator determines the Plan's valuations utilizing information provided by the asset custodian. See Note 4 for information on fair value measurements.

Fully benefit-responsive investment contracts held by a defined-contribution plan are required to be reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The Plan's investment in the Voya Fixed Plus Account as of December 31, 2023 represents a fully benefit-responsive investment contract.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation and depreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Use of Estimates — Preparation of financial statements in conformity with the accrual basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets, changes in net assets and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants — Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits — Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events — The Plan has evaluated subsequent events for recognition or disclosure through the date of the Independent Auditors' Report, which is the date the financial statements were available for issuance.

3. TAX STATUS

The Plan, as adopted, is a volume submitter plan of Principal Life Insurance Company, which does not require an application for a determination letter from the IRS. The volume submitter plan has received a favorable notification letter from the IRS dated March 31, 2017. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan continues to be operated and administered in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan administrator has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, the Plan has no material uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

4. INVESTMENTS

Voya Fixed Plus Account – As described in Note 2, since the Voya Fixed Plus Account is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for this investment contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Voya Institutional Trust Company represents

contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Voya Fixed Plus Account was fully liquidated.

Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. Interest earned on the Voya Fixed Plus Account is compounded daily to the effective annual interest rate. The interest rate to be credited is determined monthly. Amounts may be transferred from the participant's account balance in the Voya Fixed Plus Account at any time. Termination of the agreement or full Plan withdrawal from this account could restrict the liquidation of the account balances. The Voya Fixed Plus Account was fully liquidated during 2024 and there were no liquidation fees or restrictions imposed.

Fair Value Measurements — Generally accepted accounting principles require the Plan to use a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1: Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Prices determined using significant other observable inputs. Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Prices determined using significant unobservable inputs.

The investment's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds — Valued at the quoted prices of shares held by the Plan at year-end. The shares are actively traded.

The preceding method may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values.

Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

6. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

7. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan investments include mutual funds of Principal Trust Company and a fixed account with Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, who are custodians of the investments, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.
