NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the Year Ended December 31, 2024

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Krypton Solutions, LLC 401(k) Plan (“the Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan was established January 1, 2010, and is a defined contribution plan available to qualifying employees of Krypton Solutions, LLC, and related employers: DEKJ, Inc., DJSSP, Inc., SMASH, Inc., Preston Rose, Inc., Abacus Management Services, Inc., Fortuna Management Services, Inc., and Apex Assets, LLC. (collectively, the “Company” or “Plan Sponsor”). The Plan was established January 1, 2010 and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Plan Amendments

On May 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to bring the Plan in compliance with the Setting Every Community Up Retirement (“SECURE”) Act.

SECURE 2.0 Act

On December 23, 2022, Congress passed the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023, which included the SECURE 2.0 Act. SECURE Act 2.0 contains over 90 new retirement provisions, with varying effective dates through 2033. Since the provisions of SECURE Act 2.0 include both required and optional elements, applicable provisions will be evaluated and implemented in accordance with accompanying regulations and guidance prior to the deadline, December 31, 2026. Effective January 1, 2023, the age requirement for minimum distributions was raised to 73 from 72 for any participant who turns 72 on or after January 1, 2023. Certain provisions became effective for 2024, including changes to long-term part-time eligibility. These changes had no material impact on the Plan’s 2024 financial statements.

Eligibility

Employees who have attained the age of 21 and have completed 90 days of service are eligible to participate in the Plan and are eligible for the Company’s safe-harbor match. Upon completion of one year of service (defined as 1,000 hours) employees become eligible for the employer match and employer non-elective contributions. Union members, non-resident aliens, and residents of Puerto Rico who are employed by the Plan Sponsor, are not eligible to participate in the Plan. Employees are enrolled in the Plan on the first day of each plan year quarter immediately following or coinciding with the date upon meeting the eligibility.

Contributions

Participant Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined by the Plan, subject to Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (“rollover”). Participants have the option of designating a portion of their elective deferral contributions as after-tax (“Roth”) contributions. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

1. Description of Plan (continued)

Contributions (continued)

Employer Safe-Harbor Matching Contributions

The Company makes safe-harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of each participant's elective deferrals that do not exceed 3% of the participant's compensation, plus 50% of deferrals between 4% and 5% of the participant's compensation.

Employer Matching Contributions

The Company, at its discretion, may contribute employer matching contributions to eligible participant accounts. During the Plan year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made no such employer matching contributions.

Employer Non-Elective Contributions

The Company, at its discretion, may make non-elective contributions. During the Plan year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made no such employer non-elective contributions.

Contributions from Plan participants and the associated matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's contributions, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and the Company's safe-harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's non-elective and matching contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant vests in 20% increments annually after their second year of service, until 100% vested after six years of continuous service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance in their account during the immediate preceding 12 month period. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate is set at 1% above the prime rate, as defined. Participants may have a maximum of one loan outstanding at one time. Loan terms may not exceed five years. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Description of Plan (continued)

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in their account as a lump-sum distribution, subject to minimum balance distribution requirements, or installment payments if the participant's balance exceeds \$5,000. A participant may withdraw part of the vested interest in their account upon attainment of age 59 1/2, subject to Plan provisions. The Plan also permits hardship distributions to participants that can demonstrate an immediate and heavy financial need. Upon separation with the Company, participants with account balances less than \$5,000, a single lump sum payment will be made automatically into an individual retirement account of the plan administrator's choosing. The Plan document further stipulates that account balances less than \$1,000 are to be automatically paid to the participant, without consent.

Forfeited and Unallocated Accounts

The Plan allows for nonvested amounts forfeited by participants to be used to reduce the Company's matching contributions or to pay expenses associated with the operation and administration of the Plan. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$13,221 and \$12,692, respectively. For the year ended December 31, 2024, participants forfeited \$346 in previously contributed nonvested amounts. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeited amounts were not used to reduce Plan expenses.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). The common collective trust fund is stated at net asset value ("NAV") as determined by the trustee at the end of the plan year. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Refer to Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

The Company pays certain administrative expenses incurred by the Plan. Certain investment and administration fees are deducted directly from participant's investment returns. Transaction costs borne by the Plan are charged to the individual participant who initiated the transaction to which the charge relates by reducing the participant's account balance.

Recently Adopted and New Accounting Principles

In June 2016, the Financial Accounting Standards Board issued Accounting Standards Update ("ASU") No. 2016-13, *Financial Instruments - Credit Losses (Topic 326): Measurement of Credit Losses on Financial Instruments*, and subsequent amendments to the initial guidance, ASU 2019-10. This accounting standard changes the methodology for measuring credit losses on financial instruments and the timing of when such losses are recorded. ASU No. 2016-13 is effective for fiscal years, and interim periods within those years, beginning after December 15, 2022. The Plan adopted the provisions of ASU 2016-13 for the year ended December 31, 2023. The adoption of this standard did not have a material impact on the Plan's financial statements.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan failed to distribute the excess contributions related to the Plan year ended December 31, 2024 to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2025; however, these amounts were distributed on May 5, 2025. As the corrective action was not taken within 2 ½ months following the end of the Plan year, the plan administrator is required to pay a 10% excise tax on this amount. Such excise taxes are not permitted to be paid from Plan assets.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through the date of the report of independent auditors, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no items that would require recognition in the financial statements or disclosure in the notes to the financial statements.

3. Information Certified by the Trustee (unaudited)

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplementary information, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments and interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, (collectively “Empower”), the custodian and trustee of the Plan.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value hierarchy provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB accounting guidance are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

4. Fair Value Measurements (continued)

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (“SEC”). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective trust fund: Valued at the NAV of units of a collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Group Annuity Contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the plan to transact at contract value with the participants. In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

6. Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds, common collective trust fund, and guaranteed income account provided through or managed by Empower. Empower is the record-keeper, custodian, and trustee of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. All investment fund earnings or losses posted to each Plan participant's account are net of investment management fees charged by each investment fund under the Plan.

Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan also made direct payments to the record-keeper, custodian, trustee, and third-party administrator totaling \$23,943. These costs incurred by the Plan are included in administrative expenses on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. The Company pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

8. Income Tax Status

The Plan adopted a pre-approved defined contribution plan sponsored by Empower. Empower received an opinion letter from the IRS dated November 14, 2022, which states that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Although the Plan has since been amended, the plan admin believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

9. Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

11. Administrative Failure

Delinquent Participant Contributions and Loan Repayments

During the years ended December 31, 2021 and 2022, the Company failed to remit certain participant contributions and loan repayments to the Plan within the time frame required by the Department of Labor's Regulation 29 CFR 2510.3-102, thus constituting a non-exempt (prohibited) transaction between the Plan and the Company. Delinquent remittances of participant contributions and loan repayments amounted to \$26,690. These amounts, including lost earnings, were remitted to the Plan by year end. Plan management has fully corrected this administrative failure outside the Voluntary Fiduciary Correction Program ("VFCP") by transmitting lost earnings, to the Plan by December 31, 2024. Additionally, plan management is implementing policies and procedures to ensure that future employee contributions are remitted to the Plan in a timely manner.
