Note 1: Description of Plan

The following description of Mechanical Dynamics & Analysis LLC 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan covering all eligible employees of Mechanical Dynamics & Analysis, LLC (the Company), including three affiliated groups. Employees who have worked for the Company or one of its affiliated groups for three months are eligible to participate in the Plan. Employees are also eligible for the Company's matching contribution once they have met the age and service requirements outlined in the plan document. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions - Participants can contribute 100% of compensation subject to the maximum amount allowed by Internal Revenue Code limitations. Eligible employees who have attained age fifty before the close of the plan year shall be eligible to make catch-up contributions in accordance with Internal Revenue Code provisions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. The Company matches 100% of the eligible participants' contributions to the extent of 5% of each participant's compensation. In accordance with the provisions of the Plan, each participant has the right to direct the investment of their contributions, the Company's contributions, and any rollover/transfers, if applicable, into the Plan.

Investment Options - The Plan's provisions allow participants to make their own investment elections by contacting the investment manager or via their online account with Fidelity. A participant may direct the investment of their contributions, the Company's contributions, and any rollover/transfers, if applicable, to any of the registered investment companies (mutual funds), money market funds, commingled fund, stable value account, or self-directed brokerage investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant accounts - Each participant's account is credited or charged, as applicable, with the participant's contribution, allocations of the Company's contributions, transfers, earnings (losses), payments, forfeitures, withdrawals, or other distributions made to or from such accounts during the period. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances in accordance with terms of the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and the Company's matching and nonelective employer contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Payment of benefits - Upon termination of service or separation of service, due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant or their beneficiary will be entitled to receive a distribution of their total vested account balance. Benefits will be paid in accordance with the terms of the plan document.

Plan termination - Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event the Plan terminates, each participant's account will become fully vested and be distributed in accordance with the plan document.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance reduced by the current outstanding balance on any notes receivable outstanding. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. All notes bear a reasonable rate of interest as determined by the plan administrator based on prevailing interest rates charged by persons in the business of lending money for loans which would be made under similar circumstances. Notes are required to be repaid in level payments of principal and interest over a term ranging from one to five years. However, notes used to acquire a principal residence may be paid over a term that exceeds five years but not more than ten years.

Forfeitures - At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts amounted to \$3,816 and \$77, respectively. Forfeitures may be used to reinstate previously forfeited account balances of former participants, if any, or applied to reduce employer contributions or pay plan expenses. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, no forfeitures were used to pay plan expenses; however forfeitures, which include earnings, were used to reduce employer contributions in the amounts of \$-0- and \$17,289, respectively.

Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting - The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Investment income recognized by the Plan includes earnings from investments, net gains (losses) realized from sale of investments, and the net changes in the unrealized appreciation (depreciation) of investments. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recognized by the Plan in the period in which it is earned based on the outstanding principal balance times the stated interest rate at the date the note receivable originated. Delinquent participant notes are reclassified as deemed distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Income taxes - The Plan has adopted a prototype plan through Fidelity Management Trust Company which has an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, they believe that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

The Plan is exempt from federal income tax under the Internal Revenue Code. Tax positions are evaluated and recognized in the financial statements when it is more-likely-than-not the position will be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service or other applicable taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. The application of these accounting principles involves the exercise of judgment and use of assumptions as to future uncertainties and, as a result, actual results could differ from these estimates. The Plan periodically evaluates estimates and assumptions used in the preparation of the financial statements and makes changes on a prospective basis when adjustments are necessary.

Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Note 3: Information Certified by the Trustee

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of the investments and the notes receivable from participants reflected in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment and notes receivable activity reflected in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The information certified includes total investments and notes receivable from participants of \$123,562,122 and \$104,092,331, at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, and related investment income of \$17,423,030 and \$17,212,739, respectively, and interest on notes receivable from participants of \$123,052 and \$91,761 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Note 4: Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets and inputs that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, for substantially the full term of the financial instrument.
- Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used to determine fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered investment companies (Mutual funds) and the underlying investments of the brokerage link account: Valued at quoted market prices on the last trading day of the plan year.

New York Life Stable Value Account: The Plan has adopted the provisions of Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2009-12, *Investments in Certain Entities that Calculate Net Asset Value per Share (or its Equivalent)*. ASU 2009-12 allows for the estimation of fair value of investments in certain investment companies for which the investment does not have a readily determinable value by using net asset value (NAV) per share or its equivalent as a practical expedient. The New York Life Stable Value Account is primarily valued at the closing NAV of the units held by the Plan at year-end based on information provided and certified by Fidelity Management Trust Company.

The preceding methods may produce fair value calculations that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although plan management believes its valuation methodologies are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in different fair value measurements at the reporting date.

For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, Fidelity Investments Institutional received fees (net of revenue credits) of \$46,644 and (\$25,500), respectively, of which \$74,287 and \$59,520, respectively, are included in administrative fees in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits and \$858 and \$516, respectively, are included in the net appreciation in fair value of investments. Note 10 discusses revenue sharing fees received during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Strategic Advisors, Inc. provides investment advisory services to the Plan. These services are paid for by the Plan and, therefore, qualify as party-in-interest transactions. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, Strategic Advisors, Inc. received fees of \$42,009 and \$37,127, respectively, which are included in administrative fees in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

The Company, at its discretion, may pay certain administrative expenses including, but not limited to, consulting, legal, and audit fees of the Plan. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company paid \$170,002 and \$167,919, respectively, in administrative expenses on behalf of the Plan.

For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no prohibited transactions between either the related parties and the Plan or the parties-in-interest.

Note 7: Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investments. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such change could materially affect participant account balances and amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 8: Commingled Trust Fund with Fidelity Management Trust Company

Prior to September 16, 2024, the Plan held an investment contract with Fidelity Management Trust Company. The Fidelity Managed Income Portfolio fund meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Fidelity Management Trust Company, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Note 8: Commingled Trust Fund with Fidelity Management Trust Company (continued)

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. Fidelity Management Trust Company may not terminate the contract at any amount less than the contract value. Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Sponsor or other Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA.

Note 9: Investment in New York Life Anchor Account

In May 2024, the Plan entered into a group annuity contract with New York Life Insurance Company (NYLIC). Contributions from the Plan are deposited into NYLIC's Stable Value Account, which invests in New York Life's Pooled Separate Account No. 25 (PSA). Interest is credited to the account daily based on the accrued balance in the account from the prior day. The crediting interest rate will be declared by New York Life annually and will be based on the investment experience of the PSA but will never be less than 0%.

Note 10: Revenue Credit Account

The Plan has a Revenue Credit Account with Fidelity in which the Plan receives a Participant Revenue Credit (PRC) each quarter for account balances held in both Fidelity and non-Fidelity investment products based on a formula outlined in the agreement between the Plan and Fidelity. Based on the terms of the agreement, Plan assets held in the BrokerageLink portion of the Plan are specifically excluded from the PRC. Amounts received by the Plan are allocated to eligible participants as outlined in the agreement. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, eligible participants were allocated \$28,801 and \$85,536, respectively. These amounts are included in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the balance in the Revenue Credit Account was \$2,896 and \$2,323, respectively.

Note 11: Subsequent Events

Plan management has evaluated events subsequent to the statement of net assets available for benefits date of December 31, 2024, and through September 24, 2025, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued and has determined that there are no subsequent events that require recording or disclosure.
