NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of The Whiting-Turner Contracting Company 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan, which was established January 1, 1994, is a defined contribution plan covering all nonunion employees of The Whiting-Turner Contracting Company (the Company) who have attained the age of 18, age 21 effective January 1, 2024. Employees are eligible to enter the deferral, discretionary match, and discretionary nonelective features of the Plan on the first day of each payroll period. Union employees, nonresident aliens, employees who are residents of Puerto Rico, leased employees, reclassified employees, summer interns, on-call employees, and employees who were hired to provide craft and other services at a construction job site or to a customer of the employer whose employees are eligible to participate in The Whiting-Turner Contracting Company Hourly Craft 401(k) Plan are excluded from participation in the Plan. If an employee is excluded solely on their regularly scheduled hours, they will become eligible for participation in the Plan once they have reached age 18, age 21 effective January 1, 2024, and have worked 1,000 hours during a 12-month computation period. If the company does not maintain records that accurately reflect actual hours of service with respect to an Employee, the company credits 45 hours of service for each week the employee performs an hour of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Effective September 20, 2024 a plan participant who ceases to be eligible for The Whiting-Turner Contracting Company Hourly Craft 401(k) and will becomes eligible for the Plan shall have their plan account balance, including any outstanding loans, transferred into the plan within a reasonable time following the eligibility change. Participant Account balances totaling \$160,283 were transferred to the plan during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan allows for Roth contributions. The Plan allow participants to make after-tax contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollover contributions). Participants may elect to make an in-plan Roth rollover contribution of any vested amount held in their account. Participant account balances being used as collateral for an outstanding loan balance may not be rolled over as an in-plan Roth rollover contribution. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Newly eligible employees and active participants who had a deferral contribution rate set below 6% were automatically enrolled in the Plan with a deferral rate of 6% of eligible compensation. Participant contributions are invested in a designated target date collective trust closest to the age the participant will reach 65 years of age, or until changed by the participant.

Contributions (Continued)

Employees who are making 401(k) contributions in an amount less than 15% of eligible compensation will have their deferral election increased by 1% on January 1st of each year until their deferral rate reaches 15% of eligible compensation unless the employee affirmatively elects otherwise.

Although not obligated to do so, the Company may make a discretionary matching and discretionary nonelective contribution at the approval of the Company's Board of Directors (Board). For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company's Board approved a discretionary nonelective contribution of 5% for all eligible plan participants, subject to an annual \$3,500 minimum. The Company's Board also approved a Company discretionary supplemental nonelective contribution for all eligible plan participants for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The contribution rate for each eligible participant was determined by a third-party actuary. Additionally, the Board approved Company discretionary matching contributions of 50% up to 6% of employee elective deferral contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Company also approved true up matching contributions for participants who were employed on the last day of the plan year to the extent matching contributions were not made during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, as well as allocations of (a) Plan earnings (b) administrative expenses and (c) Company contributions, if applicable. Allocations are based on participant's compensation, participant's earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. Participants become fully vested in the Company's contributions upon death, total disability, normal retirement of the participant, or the termination of the Plan. The Company's discretionary match and nonelective contributions vest according to the following schedule:

Any employee who has three or more years of service as of April 23, 2017, will be 100% vested in the standard nonelective Company contribution. Any participant who has three or more years of service as of July 1, 2022, will be 100% vested in discretionary matching and true up matching contributions. Effective August 14, 2024, any employee who has two or more years of services will be 100% vested in prior matching contribution and prior nonelective contribution.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance or \$50,000. Loans must be repaid in five years unless the proceeds are used to acquire a primary residence. The loans are collateralized by the balance in the participants' account and bear interest at the prime rate plus 1% as determined on the first business day of each month. Loans are repaid through payroll deductions based upon an established amortization schedule.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant with a vested balance of less than \$1,000 will receive a lump-sum distribution. If the balance of the terminated participant's account is between \$1,000 and \$5,000, the Company may authorize that the benefit payment be rolled into an individual retirement account in the participant's name. Effective August 14, 2024, as a result of the SECURE 2.0 Act, the mandatory cash out limit was increased from \$5,000 to \$7,000. Participants or their beneficiaries who have a balance greater than \$1,000 may elect to receive the total vested balance in a lump-sum distribution or may leave the balance in the Plan until minimum distribution is required. The Plan allow for installment distributions. Participants may withdraw voluntary contributions from their accounts by reason of financial hardship under specific guidelines set forth in the Plan. In-service withdrawals are also allowed for participants who are at least 59½ years old.

Forfeitures

The Plan provides those forfeitures of nonvested Company contributions, if any, shall be applied to reduce future employer contributions. Forfeited nonvested accounts as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$38,487 and \$11,576, respectively. There were \$635,917 and \$1,121,199 of forfeitures used to reduce Company contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Residual Excess Pension

The Whiting-Turner Contracting Company Pension Plan terminated and all residual assets totaling \$112,951,291 were transferred on January 2, 2024, to the Plan. The Plan uses this account to reduce nonelective contributions no less rapidly than ratably over a seven-Plan year period beginning with the year of the transfer. The Residual Excess Pension account as of December 31, 2024 totaled \$100,553,640. There were \$16,305,760 of Residual Excess Pension assets used to reduce Company contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates in Preparing Financial Statements

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Contributions

Contributions from participants and Company contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payments are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expense. Quarterly recordkeeping fees are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments. The Plan received \$0 and \$26,815 in shared revenue, for which \$0 and \$26,855 was allocated to eligible participants during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Plan used shared revenue to pay expenses of \$0 and \$68 during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the shared revenue account totaled \$920 and \$876, respectively.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 2, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 CERTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT INFORMATION

T. Rowe Price Trust Company, the qualified institution of the Plan as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and The Northern Trust Company, the qualified institution of the Plan as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024, have supplied the Plan administrator with certifications as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment information and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENT

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liabilities;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Money Market Fund: Valued at the closing NAV per share which equals cost which is based on an active market.

Common Collective Trusts: Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis of current transactions. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Government, Corporate and Municipal/Provincial bonds: Valued using pricing models maximizing the use of observable inputs for similar securities. This includes basing value on yields currently available on comparable securities of issuers with similar credit ratings. When quoted prices are not available for identical or similar bonds, the bond is valued under a discounted cash flows approach that maximizes observable inputs, such as current yields of similar instruments, but includes adjustments for certain risks that may not be observable, such as credit and liquidity risks or a broker quote if available.

NOTE 5 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the participants would become 100% vested in their Company contributions.

NOTE 6 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares or units of mutual funds, money market and common collective trusts managed by T. Rowe Price Trust Company, the qualified institution and recordkeeper of the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and certain plan investments are shares or units of a money market and common collective trusts are managed by Northern Trust Company, the qualified institution. These investments qualify as party-in-interest investments/transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 7 TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated September 26, 2022, that the Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 RISK AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities which are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
