Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of All-State International, Inc. Retirement Plan (the “Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 20, 2024 and December 31, 2023 and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period January 1, 2024 through December 20, 2024 and the year ended December 31, 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan’s financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 20, 2024 and December 31, 2023 and for the period January 1, 2024 through December 20, 2024 and the year ended December 31, 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 6 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors’ Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the accompanying financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments; administering the Plan; and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audits.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audits in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audits, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of All-State International, Inc. Retirement Plan (the "Plan") is provided for general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. Effective February 28, 2024, All-State International, Inc. terminated the Plan and the participants received either a lump sum payment or an annuity purchased on their behalf.

General

The Plan is a defined benefit pension plan covering certain full-time salaried employees of All-State International, Inc. (the "Plan Sponsor"). It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). As of June 1, 2003, Plan benefits were frozen if a participant had not attained the age of 55 as of January 1, 2003 and, for participants who had attained age 55, benefits were frozen effective December 31, 2005.

Pension Benefits

Employees with five or more years of service are entitled to annual pension benefits beginning at normal retirement age (65). The monthly normal retirement benefit is the sum of the accrued benefit as of December 31, 1988 under the prior benefit formula, plus .85% of annual compensation, plus .65% of the excess of annual compensation over \$22,000 for each year of service after January 1, 1989 and, prior to January 1, 2004, limited to a maximum of 35 years.

For 2003 frozen participants, if the participant had less than 1,000 hours of service during 2003, no benefit is earned for the 2003 plan year. If the participant had 1,000 hours of service or more during 2003, the benefit earned for the 2003 plan year is 5/12 of .85% of annual compensation during 2003 plus 5/12 of .65% of compensation during 2003 in excess of \$22,000. For other than 2003 frozen participants the annual benefit for participants with 1,000 hours of service or more during 2003 would be 5/12 of .85% of annual compensation during 2003 plus 5/12 of .65% of annual compensation during 2003 in excess of \$22,000 plus 7/12 of .425% of annual compensation during 2003 plus .325% of annual compensation during 2003 in excess of \$22,000. If the other than 2003 frozen participants had less than 1,000 hours of service during 2003, no benefit is earned for the 2003 plan year.

For years of credited service after December 31, 2003 and prior to January 1, 2006, the benefit earned is .425% of annual compensation plus .325% of annual compensation in excess of \$22,000.

The minimum monthly benefit is equal to the lesser of \$10 per month for each year of service or \$100 per month.

Pension Benefits (Continued)

The normal form of benefit is a life annuity. If employees terminate before rendering five years of service, no termination benefit is payable. If a participant stops working before his or her normal retirement date for reasons other than death, disability or retirement, after at least five years of service, the participant will be a vested former participant and will be entitled to receive a monthly vested pension beginning on the participant's normal retirement date. The participant's vested pension will be equal to the participant's accrued benefit at date of termination.

Death and Disability Benefits

If a participant should die before becoming vested, no benefits are provided. If an active employee dies prior to retirement, but on or after the date on which the participant has attained eligibility for early retirement, the participant's designated beneficiary shall be entitled to receive 50% of the retirement benefit. Retirement benefits are also provided for the surviving spouse of a participant who dies after age 55 with five years of service and for the surviving spouse of a vested participant who dies prior to age 55.

A participant shall be eligible for a disability retirement benefit if, after completing 10 years of service, prior to the participant's normal retirement date, the participant becomes totally and permanently disabled and if the participant becomes eligible for and receives a disability benefit under the Federal Social Security Act. The latter benefit must commence as of a date, which is either prior to the participant's termination of service or within one year after the participant's last day of active employment.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared under the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") in compliance with the Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") of the Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein; disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities; and the actuarial present value of accumulated Plan benefits at the date of the financial statements, and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments in pooled separate accounts are valued at the net asset value (NAV) per unit as determined by the custodian at year end. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investment held by the fund less its liabilities.

This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends and interest income are included in net appreciation or depreciation. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Actuarial Present Value of Accumulated Plan Benefits

Accumulated Plan benefits are those future periodic payments, including lump-sum distributions that are attributable under the Plan's provisions to the service employees have rendered. Accumulated Plan benefits include benefits expected to be paid to (a) retired or terminated employees or their beneficiaries, (b) beneficiaries of employees who have died and (c) present employees or their beneficiaries. Benefits under the Plan and the accumulated Plan benefits for active employees are based on their average compensation, as defined in the Plan documents and amendments thereto, taking into consideration the freezing of the accrued benefits on June 1, 2003 and December 31, 2005.

Benefits payable under all circumstances - retirement, death, disability and termination of employment - are included, to the extent they are deemed attributable to defined employee service rendered to the valuation date. Benefits to be provided via annuity contracts, excluded from Plan assets, are excluded from accumulated Plan benefits.

The actuarial present value of accumulated Plan benefits is determined by an actuary from Principal and is that amount that results from applying actuarial assumptions to adjust the accumulated Plan benefits to reflect the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as for death, disability, withdrawal or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment. The significant actuarial assumptions used in the valuation as of January 1, 2024 were (a) life expectancy of participants (the MP-2021 Table), (b) retirement age assumptions (the assumed average retirement age was 65) and (c) investment return (5.09%).

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid either by the Plan or the Plan Sponsor, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation of fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent events

The Plan's management has evaluated subsequent events through October 1, 2025 the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

ASC Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). Categorization within the valuation hierarchy is based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. Under this standard, fair value is defined as the exit price, or the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants as of the measurement date.

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC Topic 820 are described below:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;

- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

Assets and liabilities measured at fair value are based on one or more of three valuation techniques identified in the table below. The valuation techniques are as follows:

- (a) *Market approach.* Prices and other relevant information generated by market transactions involving identical or comparable assets or liabilities;
- (b) *Cost approach.* Amount that would be required to replace the service capacity of an asset (replacement cost); and
- (c) *Income approach.* Techniques to convert future amounts to a single present amount based on market expectations (including present value techniques, option-pricing and excess earnings models).

As of December 20, 2024, the Plan held no assets measured at fair value due to the Plan termination and distribution of all assets during the year.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2023.

Pooled separate accounts. Pooled separate accounts are valued at the NAV per share. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investment held by the fund less its liabilities. NAV is not a publicly quoted price in an active market and is computed in accordance with accounting and reporting for investment companies.

NOTE 4 FUNDING POLICY

The Plan is a defined benefit plan which covers certain regular full-time salaried employees. The Plan sponsor has agreed to voluntarily contribute such amounts as are necessary to provide assets sufficient to meet the benefits to be paid to Plan participants.

The Plan's ERISA minimum funding requirements have been met.

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA.

NOTE 5 - TAX STATUS

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on May 10, 2012, in which the Internal Revenue Service (the "IRS") stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the "IRC"). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 20, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to examinations by the IRS for years prior to 2021.

NOTE 8 - RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain employees and officers of the Plan sponsor, who may also be participants in the Plan, perform administrative services on behalf of the Plan at no cost to the Plan.

The Plan’s investments are shares of pooled separate accounts managed by Principal Life Insurance Company which is an entity related to Principal Trust Company (“Principal”). Principal is the custodian of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for the administrator services amounted to \$142,209 and \$77,780 for the period January 1, 2024 through December 20, 2024 and the year ended December 31, 2023, respectively.

NOTE 9 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Plan contributions are made and the actuarial present value of accumulated Plan benefits are reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, inflation rates and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties, inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term would be material to the financial statements.

NOTE 10 - PLAN TERMINATION AND ASSET DISTRIBUTION

The Plan was terminated effective February 28, 2024. In connection with the termination, the Plan received additional employer contributions of \$1,475,861 to cover the funding shortfall. During the period January 1, 2024 through December 20, 2024, the Plan distributed \$3,626,957 to participants in the form of lump-sum payments and rollovers to other qualified plans, and used \$6,000,125 of Plan assets to purchase a nonparticipating group annuity contract. As of December 20, 2024, all Plan assets had been distributed, and the Plan held no assets. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements reflect no balances for investments and net assets available for benefits.
