1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Allan Industries, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

Allan Industries, Inc. (the "Company") established the Allan Industries, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, a participant-directed defined contribution plan, effective January 1, 1998. The Plan was amended and restated on November 3, 2011. The Plan is established under the provision of Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"), which includes a qualified cash or deferred arrangement as described in section 401(k) of the IRC, for the benefit of eligible employees of the Company. The Plan offers options in which participants may elect to direct their pay conversion contributions, Company matching contributions, and any additional voluntary contributions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Eligibility

Employees of the Company were eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of the month subsequent to attaining the age 21 and completing 1,000 hours of service in a consecutive twelve-month time period. As of November 2023, employees over 21 years old are eligible to participate in the Plan after 90 days of service. Union employees are not allowed to contribute to the Plan.

Contributions

Each eligible employee may make a salary deferral election to have their compensation reduced for the year in any amount selected by the employee subject to limitations, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions subject to certain Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limitations. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds, common stocks, bonds, guaranteed interest accounts and government securities as investment options for participants.

The Company made a safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of the participant's salary deferrals that do not exceed 3% of total compensation plus 50% of the salary deferrals between 3% and 5% of compensation for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The safe harbor matching contribution is 100% vested. The Company may make discretionary matching contributions to the Plan, in which all eligible employees will receive a proportionate amount of the Company's contribution based on the amount of the participant's contribution.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, Company safe harbor and profit sharing contributions, and allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of any administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and any safe-harbor contributions made by the employer, as well as the actual earnings thereon upon retirement, termination, disability or death. Vesting in the remainder of their accounts attributable to employer's optional profit-sharing and matching contributions is based on years of continuous service as follows:

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at 4.25% through 9.50% which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments as defined by the Plan document. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$1,282 and \$1,232, respectively. These accounts may be used to reduce Plan expenses, future employer contributions or be reallocated to existing participants' accounts. Forfeitures in the amount of \$1,194 were used to reduce employer contributions during the year ended December 31, 2023. There was no reduction of employer contributions from forfeitures during the year ended December 31, 2024.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements have been prepared on the modified cash basis. Therefore, with the exception of appreciation or depreciation in the market value of investments, income and expense items are recognized only as cash is received or paid and receivables (other than notes receivable from participants), payables (other than cash overdraft which is reported as operating payables) and accrued expenses are not reflected.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts of assets and liabilities, revenues and expenses and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and contingent liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The trustee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by investment advisors and custodians. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income and dividends are recorded when received. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Interest income is recorded when received. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when paid. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account.

Subsequent Events

The Plan's administrator has reviewed subsequent events and transactions that occurred after December 31, 2024 through the date of the independent auditor's report and the date the financial statements were available to be issued, September 30, 2025. The financial statements include all events or transactions, including estimates, required to be recognized in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Management has determined that there are no unrecognized subsequent events that require additional disclosure.

3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to measurements involving significant unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;

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- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the funds. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at the NAV of units of a collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Common/Collective Trust funds: Valued at the NAV of units of a bank or insurance company collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be profitable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchased and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

4. Group Annuity Contract with Principal Life Insurance Company

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive group annuity contract (the "contract") with Principal Life Insurance Company ("PLIC") totaling \$1,219,190 and \$1,123,421 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. PLIC maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The group annuity contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer. The crediting rate is reviewed on a regular basis for resetting. The group annuity contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for a fully benefit-responsive investment contract because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transitions under the terms of the Plan.

Contract value, as reported to the Plan by PLIC, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at the contract value. The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, (4) a material amendment to the agreement without consent of the issuer.

6. Related Party Transactions and Party In Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by the trustee of the Plan. Additionally, the trustee provided administrative services to the Plan, and therefore, these qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts. These accounts may be reduced by administrative expenses incurred and paid by the Company for which the Company seeks reimbursement by the Plan.

8. Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirement of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

The plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for three years from the latest filing date.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
