**NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following brief description of Team Select Holding, LLC 401k Retirement Plan (the Plan), is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information.

**General**

The Plan is a 401(K) plan established by Team Select Home Care - Arizona on January 1, 2010 to provide retirement benefits for all employees of Team Select Home Care - Arizona (the Company). The following affiliated employers have adopted the plan as of or prior to December 31, 2024: (1) Team Select Home Care – Colorado, LLC, (2) Home Health Agency Oklahoma City, Inc., (3) Elite Home Health Services, LLC, (4) My Life, (5) Team Select Services, LLC, (6) Vivicare Health Partners, LLC, (7) Laguna Home Health Services, LLC, (8) Team Select Home Care of Texas, Inc., (9) Team Select Homecare of Missouri, Inc., (10) Alliance Home Care, LLC., (11) Integrated Nursing Associates, (12) Lincoln Health Care LLC, (12) CR&RA Investments LLC, (13) Integrity Health Services Orlando, LLC, (14) 24 Seven Home Health LLC, (15) J&K Staffing Solutions LLC, (16) Together Homecare of Evansville LLC, (17) Together Homecare of Fort Wayne LLC, (18) Together Homecare of Greenwood LLC, (19) Together Homecare of Indianapolis LLC, (20) Together Homecare of Jeffersonville LLC, (21) Together Homecare of Northwest Indian LLC, (22) TS Mobile Physicians AZ LLC, and (23) Harbor Health Solutions, LLC.

Employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan after having completed one month of service and reaching a minimum age of 21 years old. The plan entry date is the first day of the month following attainment of the service requirement. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

**Contributions**

Each year, plan participants may contribute to the Plan, on a pretax basis, an amount not to exceed 90% of their compensation, subject to a limit of \$23,000 and \$22,500 for 2024 and 2023, respectively. Eligible employees may elect to make additional “catch up” contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts on an after-tax basis through Roth contributions subject to the same limitations as pretax basis contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Company currently does not make contributions to the Plan.

**Participant Accounts**

A separate account is maintained for each investment option selected by the participant. Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and the Plan’s earnings. Allocation of the Plan’s earnings is based on participant’s account balances.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers thirty-one funds as investment options for participants.

**Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in employee contributions. If the Company were to make contributions, the participants would vest in Company contributions ratably over a six year period with 20% being vested after year two of service, and then 20% each year of service thereafter with full vesting after the sixth year of service.

**Payment of Benefits**

In case of a normal retirement, retirement due to permanent disability or termination of employment, participants may elect to receive the value of their account balance in a lump sum distribution, or as a rollover in whole or in part to an eligible retirement plan, in accordance with the provisions of the Plan. In the event that a participant dies before retirement, the beneficiary will receive the value of the participant's account balance in either a lump-sum distribution or, if the beneficiary is a surviving spouse, as a rollover in whole or in part to an eligible retirement plan. If a participant's vested balance is greater than \$1,000 and less than \$5,000, and the participant does not make an election to either receive or to rollover the distribution, the distribution can be rolled over to an Individual Retirement Account.

**NOTE 2 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

**Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator and management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

**Benefit Distributions**

Benefit distributions are recorded when paid to participants.

**Valuation of Investments**

Investments are reflected at fair market value as determined by the custodian. Mutual funds are valued at quoted market prices, which represent the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end. Participant loans are valued at cost, which approximates fair value. Units of collective investment trusts are reported at fair value based on an analysis of the fair values of the underlying investments. Investment transactions are recorded on a settlement-date basis. Total recorded

investment value as recorded on a settlement-date basis does not materially differ from what total investment value would be if transactions were recorded on a trade-date basis.

**Administrative Services**

The expenses necessary to administer the Plan are paid by the Plan or Plan sponsor including, but not limited to, those involved in retaining necessary professional assistance from an attorney, an accountant, an actuary, or an investment adviser. Fees related to distributions and loans are charged directly to the participant's accounts and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

**Risk and Uncertainties**

The Plan provides for various investment options. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value in the near term would materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits and the Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Loans are made available to all participants in accordance with the specific provisions set forth in the Plan. The amount of a loan cannot exceed the lesser of \$50,000 or one-half of a participant's total vested account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years. Loan terms range from one to thirty years when used to construct or acquire a principal residence. Loans to participants bear interest at a rate of 1% above prime rate at the time the loan is made. Participants with loan balances had interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50% during the plan year ending December 31, 2024. All loans are subject to specific repayment plans and are secured by the participant's non-forfeitable interest in his/her account equivalent to the principal amount of the loan.

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued, but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Loan origination fees of \$125 are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

**NOTE 3 - TAX STATUS**

The Plan uses a volume submitter plan document sponsored by FMR, LLC which received an opinion from the IRS, dated June 30, 2020, which states that the volume submitter document satisfies the provisions of Section 401 of the IRC. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS. However, the Plan's management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

**NOTE 4 - TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES-IN-INTEREST**

Certain plan investments are investments managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company. Fidelity Management Trust Company is the custodian of the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. For the plan year 2023 through June 30, 2024, certain Plan investments were investment funds managed by Reliance Trust Company. Reliance Trust Company was the custodian of the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Certain fees for investment management, recordkeeping and administrative expenses are with the custodian and are not considered prohibited transactions under ERISA. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest.

**NOTE 5 - PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

**NOTE 6 - INVESTMENTS**

Effective June 30, 2024, the Plan's investments were held by Fidelity Management Trust Company. Through June 30, 2024, the Plan's investments were held by Reliance Trust Company. As custodians, both Fidelity Management Trust Company and Reliance Trust Company maintain the investments in separate accounts, which comprise a significant portion (98.04% - 2024, 97.29%-2023) of the Plan's assets. The accounts are credited with earnings on the underlying investment and charged for plan withdrawals. Fidelity Management Trust Company certified for June 30, 2024 through December 31, 2024 as to the completeness and accuracy of the information reported. Reliance Trust Company certified for January 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024 as to the completeness and accuracy of the information reported. Realized and unrealized gains (losses) on investments totaled \$1,308,677 and \$1,677,856 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

**NOTE 9 - EXCESS CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE**

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions to the applicable participants in February 2025. The plan distributed the 2023 excess contributions to the applicable participants in March 2024.

**NOTE 10 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

Financial Accounting Standards Board *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB Statement ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the assets or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or by other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Common Collective Trusts:* Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.
