1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Freije Engineered Solutions 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Freije Engineered Solutions (the Employer or Plan Sponsor) who have completed sixty days of service and are age 18 or older. They may enter the Plan on the 1st day of each calendar month after they have met the eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Board of Directors is responsible for oversight of the Plan and determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

Each year, participants may defer a portion of their annual compensation, as defined in the plan document, up to the maximum amount allowable by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). These contributions can be made through a combination of pre-tax contributions (traditional 401(k)) and after-tax contributions (Roth 401(k)). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing qualified rollover distributions from other qualified plans (rollover). Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. They may change their investment options among those investments provided at any time during the plan year.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 1% of eligible compensation, an automatic escalation provision to increase the deferral rate annually by 1% up to a maximum of 6%, and their contributions invested in a designated balance fund until changed by the participant.

Effective February 1, 2025, the Plan Sponsor amended the Plan's auto-enrollment provision. Under the amended provision, all participants will be automatically enrolled in the Plan at a default rate of 6% of eligible compensation, an automatic escalation provision to increase the deferral rate annually by 1% up to a maximum of 10%. This change in provision does not impact the financial position of the Plan as of year-end but will be reflected in future periods.

The Plan allows for discretionary matching and nonelective (profit sharing) contributions as determined by the Plan Sponsor. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan Sponsor elected to match 50% of elective deferrals up to 6% of the participants' eligible compensation. There was no profit sharing contribution made in 2024. The matching Employer contribution is invested as directed by the participant.

Participant contributions and loan repayments in 2024 and 2023 were paid after the time frame required by the Department of Labor (DOL). The Plan Sponsor remitted the 2023 late contributions during 2023 and the related lost earnings during 2024. The Plan Sponsor remitted the 2024 late contributions during 2024 and the remaining lost earnings were remitted subsequent to year end.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each plan participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Employer's matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Employer's profit sharing contribution and plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based upon participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants become vested in the Employer's matching and profit sharing contribution portions of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon based on years of service. A participant vests on a graduated schedule and becomes fully vested after five years of credited service. If not already vested, a participant becomes fully vested upon the occurrence of the participant's attainment of normal retirement age, death while employed by the Employer, or satisfying the requirements for disability.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. Note terms are at the discretion of the participant and plan administrator, but in no case more than five years, unless the loan is for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate is set at 1% above the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. A participant may have one loan outstanding at a time.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service or due to attainment of normal retirement age (as defined), a participant may elect to receive installment payments or a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested account balance. A participant can make a hardship withdrawal, as defined in the plan agreements. In-service distributions are also permitted, at age 59 ½.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled, \$59,161 and \$26,566, respectively. The non-vested portion of former participants' accounts may be used to pay

administrative expense of the Plan or to reduce the amount of future employer contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, no forfeitures were utilized to pay plan expenses or to reduce employer contributions.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Investment held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to full benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes in those assets and liabilities, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (EAICA) maintains the Plan's investment funds. Investments in pooled separate accounts are credited with earnings and gains or losses on the pooled investments. The separate accounts are stated at fair value as reported to the Plan by EAICA, based on the quoted prices of the underlying mutual funds. The unit value of the separate account is calculated by dividing the total value of the assets of the separate account by the number of units in the separate account. For separate accounts that invest exclusively in mutual funds, the total value of the assets of the separate account is based on the net asset value (NAV), or price per share, of the underlying mutual fund. The mutual fund calculates its NAV by dividing the mutual fund's net assets by the mutual fund's outstanding number of shares.

The investment strategies for the pooled separate accounts investing in mutual funds or equity securities vary based on the degree of investment risk chosen by the fund manager and the criteria of the fund or security's investment goal. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchase and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded when earned. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as distributions based upon the terms of the plan agreement. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributes these excess contributions to the applicable participants in the subsequent year.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan Sponsor provides administrative and accounting services to the Plan at no cost. The majority of the Plan's expenses include certain administrative expenses and accounting fees which are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor. Certain recordkeeping and investment advisory related expenses are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net changes in fair value of investments.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated events or transactions occurring subsequent to the statement of net assets available for benefits date for recognition and disclosure in the accompanying financial statements through the date the financial statements were available to be issued, which is September 17, 2025.

3. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S CUSTODIAN

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, EAICA, the custodian of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the schedule of assets at December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity and interest income on notes receivable from participants reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). However, in accordance with Subtopic 820-10, the pooled separate account investments that are measured at NAV per share (or its equivalent) have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy.

The description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis are included in Note 2. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Investments Measured Using the NAV per Share Practical Expedient

The following table summarize investments for which fair value is measured using the NAV per share practical expedient as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. There are no participant redemption restrictions for these investments; the redemption notice period is applicable only to the Plan.

5. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract values is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. The contract value of this traditional investment contract held by the Plan was \$136,032 and \$249,476 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate is based on an agreed-upon formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include but may not be limited to the following: (a) amendments to plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (b) changes to the plan's prohibition on competing investment options, (c) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the plan, (d) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The plan administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any such event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants, is probable.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract
3. A material misrepresentation
4. A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer

6. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

Parties-in-interest are defined under DOL regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the Employer and certain others.

The Plan invests in assets held by EAICA, which is the custodian and recordkeeper of the Plan, and receives payments for recordkeeping services, as well as direct payment from participants on a transactional basis for processing distributions. Investment advisory fees are paid to LPL Financial. Notes receivable from participants represent exempt parties-in-interest transactions. Blue & Co., LLC is the independent auditor for the Plan and receives payment from the Plan Sponsor.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become fully vested in their employer contributions. The plan administrator would facilitate the distribution of account balances in single lump sum payments to each participant in accordance with the Plan until all assets have been distributed by the trustee.

8. TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a pre-approved plan document sponsored by Empower Retirement, LLC, which has received an opinion letter from the IRS dated November 14, 2022, stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the plan administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by various federal and state taxing authorities. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the accompanying financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
