

**A. Plan Description:**

The following description of the Bryan Construction, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document and summary plan description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General:

The Plan is a participant-directed defined contribution plan sponsored by Federal Contracting, Inc. d/b/a Bryan Construction, Inc. (the Company) covering permanent employees of the Company who are age 18 or older. It is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA), as amended. An executive of the Company served as the Trustee, Alerus Financial, N.A. served as the plan custodian, recordkeeper, and third-party administrator and the Corundum Group, Inc. served as investment manager through August 14, 2024. Effective August 15, 2024, Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company serves as the Trustee, Principal Life Insurance serves as the plan custodian, recordkeeper, and third-party administrator, and Fisher Investments serves as investment manager as the 3(38) fiduciary of the Plan.

Contributions:

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100 percent of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also elect to make Roth contributions utilizing after-tax contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions of 100 percent of the first 3 percent of base compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan plus 50 percent of the participant contributions between 3 percent and 5 percent. Company profit sharing contributions are discretionary as determined by the Company's executives. The Company contributions are invested as directed by the participant. No discretionary profit sharing contributions were made for the years ended December 31, 2024 or 2023. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts:

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, allocation of the Company's contributions and plan earnings and any fees. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**A. Plan Description (Continued):**

Investment Options:

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various mutual funds, collective investment trusts, and money market mutual fund options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment allocations at any time.

Vesting:

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary and company safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's profit sharing contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100 percent vested after six years of credited service.

Forfeited Accounts:

Nonvested participant accounts that are forfeited upon termination of service are used to reduce future employer contributions or pay plan expenses. The Plan held \$-0- and \$2,113 of forfeited nonvested accounts at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Plan used \$2,196 and \$-0- forfeitures to reduce employer contributions during 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Notes Receivable from Participants:

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts in accordance with the Plan provisions. Loan terms range from one to five years for standard loans. Loan terms for the purchase of a primary residence are consistent with commercial home loan practices. Loans are limited to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of the vested account balance and are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Interest rates are equal to the Wall Street Journal Prime Rate plus 1 percent. Principal and interest is paid ratably through weekly or biweekly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits:

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or separation from employment, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of his or her vested account. The Plan allows for hardship withdrawals within certain limitations and in-service withdrawals after reaching age 59.5. Terminated participants with vested balances of \$7,000 or less will have their balances distributed upon termination. Participants may take a distribution from their rollover account at any time.

**B. Summary of Accounting Policies and Investments:**

Basis of Accounting:

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Notes Receivable from Participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Use of Estimates:

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition:

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The plan administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the custodians. See *Note D* for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. Net realized and unrealized appreciation is recorded in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits as net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Payment of Benefits:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses:

The Company absorbs certain administrative and operating costs of the Plan. Certain administrative services are paid directly by the Plan and recorded as administrative fees in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Accordingly, Alerus Financial, N.A., the custodian of the Plan from January 1, 2023 through August 14, 2024 and Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust company d/b/a Principal Trust Company, the custodian of the Plan from August 15, 2024 through December 31, 2024, have certified the following information included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets held (at end of year) is complete and accurate.

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the accompanying schedule of assets held (at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

The Plan's independent auditor did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information except for comparing such information to the related information included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets held (at end of year).

**D. Fair Value Measurements:**

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures* establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are:

- Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

- If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurements.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual funds and money market mutual fund:* Valued at quoted market prices, which represent the net asset values (NAV) of shares held by the Plan. Mutual funds and the money market mutual fund held by the Plan are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds and money market mutual fund held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Collective Investment Trust:* Valued at the NAV of the funds as reported to the plan administrator by the custodian of the funds on a daily basis. The two collective investment trusts seek to meet or exceed the performance of a broad market index benchmark through investing in a diversified portfolio of fixed income and fixed income-related securities as well as common stocks and other equity-type securities.

*Money market account:* Valued at the amount of cash held by the Plan in the related deposit accounts plus accrued interest.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**E. Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions:**

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50 percent or more of such an employer or employee association, or relatives of such persons.

During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan incurred fees of \$19,612 and \$56,365 to the custodians Principal Life Insurance and Alerus Financial, N.A., respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2023, the Plan incurred fees of \$69,887 to Alerus Financial, N.A. The custodians remit a portion of fees collected to investment managers.

The Company provides certain administrative services at no cost to the Plan.

**F. Plan Termination:**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

**G. Plan Tax Status:**

The Plan operates under a non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan document provided by Principal Life Insurance Company. The pre-approved plan has been filed with the appropriate agency and has obtained a favorable opinion letter, dated June 30, 2020, from the Internal Revenue Service stating that the Plan constitutes a qualified plan under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code and that the related trust was tax-exempt. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements for the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Management performs an annual analysis of the Plan's various tax positions, assessing the likelihood of those positions being upheld upon examination by relevant tax authorities. Management believes the Plan has conducted its operations in accordance with applicable income tax reporting requirements, and has properly maintained its tax-exempt status, and has taken no material uncertain tax positions that qualify for recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

**H. Risks and Uncertainties:**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**I. Nonexempt Party In Interest Transactions:**

During 2023, certain participant contributions and loan repayments in the amount of \$11,948 were not remitted to the Plan in a timely manner and are considered to be delinquent. Management funded lost earnings for these delinquent contributions and loan repayments to the Plan during 2024. These lost earnings are included in other income in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Plan management does not believe these late remittances had a material effect on the financial statements nor affect the qualified tax status of the Plan.

**J. Plan Transfer:**

Effective for the blackout period of August 7, 2024 through August 25, 2024, the Plan's assets of approximately \$15,313,000 were liquidated and transferred from Alerus Financial N.A. to Principal Financial Group. The plan document was also restated effective August 15, 2024 as a result. There were no significant changes to the Plan's operations as a result of this restatement.

**K. Subsequent Events:**

The Plan did not have any subsequent events through the date of the Independent Auditor's Report, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued, for events requiring recording or disclosure in the financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2024.
