Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the 2024 Financial Statements

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of the Union Partners I LLC 401(k) Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ["ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"]. Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the 2024 financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the 2024 Financial Statements section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. - Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the 2024 financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

2024 Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules, Schedule of Assets Held at End of Year and Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024, respectively, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the 2024 financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion—

- the form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Auditor's Report on the 2023 Financial Statements

The 2023 financial statements of the Plan were audited by predecessor auditors. As permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the Plan Administrator instructed the predecessor auditor not to perform, and they did not perform, any auditing procedures with respect to the information certified by a qualified institution. Their report dated April 4, 2025 indicated that the form and content of the information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule other than that derived from the certified information, were presented in compliance with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

The following description of the Union Partners I LLC 401(k) Savings Plan (the “Plan”), provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General. The Plan is a contributory, defined contribution plan available to all eligible employees of Union Partners I LLC (the “Employer”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as amended by subsequent legislation.

Eligible participants may make contributions to the Plan if they have attained age 21 and completed one month of service. An employee may begin participating in the Plan once they are eligible and reach their entry date. An employee’s entry date will be the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the date they satisfy the Plan’s eligibility requirements.

Contributions. A participant may defer a percentage of their annual compensation each year. In addition, a participant may separately elect to defer up to 100% of any bonuses paid during the year. However, a participant’s total deferrals in any year may not exceed the maximum amounts established by the Internal Revenue Code (the “IRC”). Certain employees of the Employer are eligible to participate and receive discretionary matching contributions, fixed nonelective contributions (for employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement at National Metalwares, L.P.), and discretionary nonelective contributions.

Participant Accounts. Each participant’s self-directed account is credited with the participant’s contribution and, when applicable, the Employer contributions and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Earnings are based on the performance of specific mutual funds chosen by each participant and are allocated to participant accounts based on their proportionate share of identified fund balances and other Plan assets. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting. Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and the Employer matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Forfeitures. All forfeitures will be applied to reduce Employer contributions to the Plan or to pay ordinary and necessary administrative expenses. Forfeiture balances were of \$538,127 and \$461,034 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. There were no forfeitures used to reduce Employer contributions or pay administrative expenses for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Investments. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various registered investment companies and a common or collective trust as investment options for participants.

Notes Receivable from Participants. Participants may borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at rates ranging from 4.16% and 9.50% at December 31, 2024, which is commensurate with local prevailing rates for this type of loan as determined by the Plan’s administrator (“Plan Administrator”). Principal and interest is paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions and are payable within five years, except for loans used to acquire a principal residence, which are payable within ten years.

Payment of Benefits. In the event of retirement, termination of service, death or disability, participants or their beneficiaries may elect to receive a single lump-sum payment equal to the vested value of their account or a direct rollover distribution. Participants may obtain withdrawals of any portion of their participant contributions after attaining the age of 59½ or for certain financial hardship situations, as defined in the Plan document.

Concentrations of Credit Risk. Substantially all of the Plan’s assets were held by Empower Trust Company, LLC (the “Trustee”) which held the Plan’s investments and executed all investment transactions. The Trustee is a qualified institution pursuant to ERISA.

Recent Legislation. The SECURE Act 2.0 was signed into law on December 23, 2022. The SECURE Act 2.0 allows more part-time workers to participate, increases the age for required minimum distributions and reduces the penalty for missed minimum distributions, permits plan participants to elect to receive vested employer contributions on an after-tax basis, and allows penalty free withdrawal for terminal illness, effective January 1, 2023. Additionally, it will allow for higher catch-up contributions, allow for matching contributions on student loan payments, permit plan sponsors to add an emergency savings account to their retirement plans, increase the availability of penalty-free withdrawals, and add automatic enrollment error relief provisions, effective January 1, 2024. Many of the provisions in SECURE 2.0 went effective in 2023, but SECURE 2.0 will not be completely implemented until 2027.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting. The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAP”).

Estimates and Assumptions. The preparation of financial statements requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Future events and their effects cannot be predicted with certainty; accordingly, accounting estimates require the exercise of judgment. Accounting estimates used in the preparation of these financial statements change as new events occur, as more experience is acquired, as additional information is obtained and as the operating environment changes.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition. The Plan’s investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between willing market participants as of the measurement date. The Plan’s valuation policies are determined utilizing information provided by the Trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year (unrealized).

Administrative Expenses. Certain expenses of administering and operating the Plan are paid by the Employer. The Plan pays certain administrative expenses and transaction costs related to participant loans and investment fees. Investment fees are included in the net unrealized appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

Payment of Benefits. Benefits are recorded when paid.

Notes Receivable from Participants. Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest, with no allowance for credit losses, as repayments of principal and interest are received through payroll deductions. Delinquent participants’ loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

NOTE 3 – INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE OF THE PLAN ASSETS

The following is a summary of the unaudited information regarding the Plan, included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule that was prepared by the Trustee and furnished to the Plan Administrator. The Plan Administrator has obtained certifications from the Trustee that such information is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Interest and dividend income from investments, interest from notes receivable from participants and net appreciation in fair value of investments, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Note 4: All investment balances.
- The schedule of assets held for investment purposes at end of year as of December 31, 2024, as shown on Form 5500, Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i.

NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1. Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2. Inputs to the valuation methodology include the following:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3. Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds. Valued at closing price reported on the active market on which the mutual funds are traded.

Life Insurance Policies. This investment represents the cash surrender value of multiple life insurance policies. The cash surrender value is determined by taking the discounted cash flows of premiums and death benefits determined in a mortality-based model. Such mortality-based modeling method is the equivalent of calculating the present value at every discrete time period (i.e., every year) then weighting the outcomes by the likelihood that each will occur. For each year, the payment is the death benefit multiplied by the subject's expected mortality, less the planned premium multiplied by the subject's survival rate.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan Administrator believes the valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become fully vested in their accounts.

NOTE 6 – INCOME TAX STATUS

As of November 2023, the Plan uses a prototype plan document sponsored by the Trustee. The prototype plan obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, which states that the prototype document satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The prototype plan opinion letter has been relied upon by the Plan. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

The Plan provides for investing in numerous funds, which invest in various types of investment securities and in various companies within various markets. Investment securities, generally, are exposed to several risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level risk associated with the funds, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of the funds will occur in the near term and such changes can materially affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and supplementary schedule. In addition to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 10 – DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS

During the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, management inadvertently excluded certain compensation from eligible compensation as defined in the Plan document. Management elected to use the self-correction program to remit lost earnings to the Plan in addition to contributions improperly excluded, which will be paid from Employer funds and not Plan assets. Payment has not been remitted to the Plan as of the date the accompanying financial statements were available to be issued. The Employer intends to remit funds to the Plan in 2025.

NOTE 11 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management has evaluated all known subsequent events from December 31, 2024 through September 25, 2025, the date the accompanying financial statements were available to be issued, and is not aware of any material subsequent events occurring during this period that have not been disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.
