Note 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the American Sugar Refining and Subsidiaries Hourly Savings and Investment Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, which is available from Plan management.

General

The Plan is a deferred compensation plan (defined contribution plan) covering all eligible employees of American Sugar Refining, Inc. (the Company) who were or are covered by a collective bargaining agreement that provided for participation in the Plan. Employees are eligible for participation in the Plan upon their date of employment. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the assets of the Plan are held by Fidelity Management Trust Company (the Trustee). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 20 percent of their compensation, subject to maximums established by law. The Company makes annual contributions to the Plan pursuant to various collective bargaining agreements. Eligible employees may also make "catch up" contributions as allowed under the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan offers numerous investment fund options with the Trustee. Each participant may direct their contributions among the funds in multiples of at least 1 percent. The investment options are described in the summary plan description. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and the Company's contributions, as well as allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. The method of charging participants for record keeping is a fixed dollar approach (\$16.25 per quarter). The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants shall be vested in matching employer contributions based on their years of service in accordance with the following schedule:

Vesting under the Plan is based upon the elapsed time method. Hours of service are not counted and instead periods of service are computed. A period of service starts with your date of employment and, generally, ends on your date of termination. Only your whole years of service with your Employer will be counted to compute your years of service for vesting purposes.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 or, if less, the entire value of the participant's account, but not less than in one hundred dollar increments and up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by Plan management. Note terms shall not exceed five years unless the loan is used to purchase a primary residence. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon separation of service due to death, disability, retirement or termination of employment, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments in the form of an annuity payment. For termination of services for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$62,957 and \$28,362, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future Company contributions and to pay Plan expenses. Company contributions were reduced by \$7,881 and \$0, respectively, from forfeited non-vested accounts. During 2024 and 2023, \$1,910 and \$2,640, respectively, of forfeitures were used to pay plan expenses.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP) requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Pension Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded at the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

Plan Management's Review of Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 30, 2025, the date that the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3. Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplementary information, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurement, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Self-directed brokerage accounts: Accounts primarily consist of mutual funds that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

Collective trust funds: Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Stable value fund: Valued at the NAV of the shares held by the Plan at year end, which is based on the fair value underlying investments using information reported by the investment advisor at year end. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value.

- (c) The trust seeks the preservation of principal and to provide income reasonably obtained under prevailing market conditions and rates, consistent with seeking to maintain liquidity.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 5. Related Party Transactions and Party in Interest Transactions

Certain investments of the Plan are shares of mutual funds managed by Fidelity Investments, an affiliate of the Trustee. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. All investment fund earnings or losses posted to each Plan participant's account are net of investment management fees charged by each investment fund under the Plan.

Management fees of \$158,534 and \$147,906 were paid by the Plan to the Trustee of the Plan for the plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Note 6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their Company contributions.

Note 7. Tax Status

Effective December 1, 2021, the Plan adopted a nonstandardized prototype defined contribution profit sharing plan with Internal Revenue Code Section 401(k) Cash or Deferred Arrangement (CODA) which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020. The Plan has been amended since the date of the last amendment covered by the above mentioned determination letter. However, Plan management believes that the plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

US GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Market risks include global events, which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that some changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9. Transfer of Assets

The transfers of assets into and out of the Plan represent changes in participants' eligibility for their respective plans.
