We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Stone City Products, Inc. 401(k) Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion on the Financial Statements

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 2 to the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements and supplemental schedules are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2; this includes determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Stone City Products, Inc. 401(k) Savings Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan, established January 1, 1994, sponsored by Stone City Products, Inc. (the "Company" or "Employer"). The Plan includes salary deferral features of Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). All employees, except for union employees and certain other employees, are eligible to participate in the Plan once they have attained age 18 and completed thirty days of service. Participants may enter the Plan on the first day of the month following the date they satisfy the eligibility requirements.

Contributions

Participants are permitted to make pre-tax deferral contributions up to the current Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limit or 90% of eligible compensation, through a salary reduction deferral election. Participants may also contribute rollover amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

Participants are eligible for Employer matching contributions, which are discretionary, after one month of service. In addition, the Plan allows for Employer nonelective discretionary contributions, which are based upon a uniform percentage of participant compensation, compared to the total plan eligible compensation. Participants are eligible for nonelective discretionary contributions after one year of service. During the 2024 plan year, there were no discretionary nonelective contributions.

The Plan also has automatic enrollment provisions at an initial deferral of 1%, with annual increases of 1% thereafter up to a maximum 3% deferral.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocation of: (a) the Employer's contribution, (b) plan earnings, and (c) administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participants' earnings, account balances, or transaction fees, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants can direct investments in their account into several investment options and are allowed to change investment selections on a daily basis.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Each participant can obtain a note between \$1,000 and the lesser of 50% of the participant's vested account balance or \$50,000. A participant may have one outstanding note at a time. The loan term may not exceed five years unless such loan is for the purpose of the participant's primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate of one percent above prime. Principal and interest are paid during each pay period through payroll deductions.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. There is a graded five-year vesting schedule for Employer matching contributions and nonelective contributions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of employment due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive installment payments or a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested account balance. The Plan permits hardship withdrawals from participant contributions and actual earnings thereon. Participants who are at least 59 ½ may also withdraw their vested Employer contribution account balance, participant contributions and any earnings.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their Employer contributions.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$11,647 and \$7,962, respectively. Forfeited nonvested accounts are available to offset administrative expenses or employer contributions. In 2024, \$18 was used to offset administrative expenses.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting. That basis differs from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America in that contributions and investment income are recorded when

received by the Plan and expenses are recorded when paid. The modified cash basis differs from the cash basis in that investments are recorded at fair value, and notes receivable from participants are recognized.

Although the modified cash basis of accounting represents a departure from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, it is an allowable method of accounting for employee benefit plans under the reporting requirements of ERISA.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded when received. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Notes Receivable

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest.

Administrative Expenses

The Employer pays a significant amount of the Plan's administrative expenses, which are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan.

Plan Tax Status

The plan has adopted a preapproved plan document sponsored by TAG Resources, LLC ("TAG"), which has received an opinion letter from the IRS dated August 17, 2021, stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the plan administrator believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require disclosure in the accompanying financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated events or transactions occurring subsequent to the statement of net assets available for benefits date for recognition and disclosure in the accompanying financial statements through the date the financial statements were available to be issued, which is September 16, 2025.

3. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S TRUSTEES

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company, the trustee of the Plan, certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and in the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity and interest on notes receivable from participants, reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). However, in accordance with Subtopic 820-10, the Plan's investments that are measured at net asset value per share (or its equivalent) have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- *Pooled separate accounts:* Investments in pooled separate accounts are credited with earnings and gains or losses on the pooled investments. The separate accounts are stated at fair value as reported to the Plan by its trustees (see Note 3), based on the quoted market prices of the underlying mutual funds. The unit value of the separate account is calculated by dividing the total value of the assets of the separate account by the number of units in the separate account. For separate accounts that invest exclusively in mutual funds, the total value of the assets of the separate account is based on the net asset value (NAV), or price per share, of the underlying mutual fund. The mutual fund calculates its NAV by dividing the mutual fund's net assets by the mutual fund's outstanding number of shares. The investment strategies for the pooled separate accounts investing in mutual funds or equity securities vary based on the degree of investment risk chosen by the fund manager and the criteria of the fund or security's investment goals.
- *Unallocated insurance contract:* The investment contract is valued at fair value by the issuer by discounting the cash flows of the guaranteed interest account using a discount rate that represents the interest rate that would be credited on accounts of similar duration. Reasonableness of the methodology is evaluated through a variety of factors including review of existing contracts, economic conditions, industry and market development, and overall credit ratings.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

6. PARTY-IN-INTEREST AND RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Party-in-interest transactions, as defined under Department of Labor regulations, include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, and certain others. The Plan's investments are sponsored through a group annuity contract issued by the trustee of the Plan; transactions in these investments therefore qualify as exempt-party in interest transactions. In addition, the Plan provides for participant loans, which qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Certain administrative functions are performed by employees of the Company. Blue & Co., LLC is the independent auditor for the Plan. TAG Resources is the third party administrator of the Plan. Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company performs recordkeeping and trust functions for the Plan. Payments for these services are made by the Plan or Plan Sponsor.
