### *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit*

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Clemens Family Sharing Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. 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#### (1) Description of Plan

The following description of the Clemens Family Sharing Plan (the Plan), sponsored by The Clemens Family Corporation (the Company), provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

##### ***General***

The Plan is a contributory defined contribution plan qualified under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The plan trustees are responsible for oversight of the Plan, determine the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitor investment performance.

The Plan was amended and restated as of January 1, 2022.

On April 30, 2024, the Kunzler & Company, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan was acquired by the Company and subsequently transferred \$21,280,503 into the Plan.

##### ***Eligibility***

Substantially all employees of the Company having worked for the Company for sixty days are eligible to participate in the Plan.

##### ***Contributions***

Each year, participants may contribute up to 60% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined by the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants are also permitted to make Roth contributions to the Plan. In addition, participants may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan at 5% unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. The participant's contributions are automatically invested in the Plan's default investment option whenever a participant does not actively choose the investments for contributions made to their account. The Plan includes an auto-escalation provision whereby participants with a pre-tax contribution percentage between 1% and 10% will automatically be increased by 1% (unless the participant elects otherwise) annually during the month of January.

In order to be eligible for employer contributions, employees are required to complete one year with the Company and attain 1,000 hours of service. Employer contributions consist of separate components as follows:

##### *Contributions, Continued*

*Safe Harbor Matching Contributions* – The employer has in place a safe harbor match: the employer matches 100% of the first 3% of elective deferral contributions plus 50% of the next 2% of elective deferral contributions. Employees are required to contribute to their 401(k) in order to get the match. The safe harbor matching contribution is made on a payroll period basis. The employer matching contribution for the plan year ended December 31, 2024, was \$8,588,926.

*Discretionary Matching Contributions* – The Company may choose, in its sole discretion, to make discretionary matching contributions. There were no discretionary matching contributions made during the plan year ended December 31, 2024.

*Profit Sharing Contributions* – The Plan allows for profit sharing contributions which are allocated to the participants in proportion to their eligible compensation, as defined by the plan document. There were no profit-sharing contributions made during the plan year ended December 31, 2024.

Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

##### *Participant Accounts*

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, safe harbor matching contributions, discretionary matching contributions, profit sharing contributions, and plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

##### *Vesting*

The trustee maintains a participant directed employee account for each participant. All participant deferrals, including performance bonus deferrals, catch-up and rollover balances directed into the Plan are immediately vested. All employer safe harbor contributions into the Plan are also immediately vested. Employer matching contributions and profit sharing contributions are subject to a three year cliff vesting schedule based on years of service.

##### *Notes Receivable from Participants*

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Most loans must be repaid over a period not to exceed 60 months with the exception of loans meeting special criteria that may be repaid over a period in excess of 5 years. The loans are secured by the balances in the participants' accounts and bear interest at a fixed rate equal to the prime rate plus 1%, ranging from 3.24% to 9.50% at December 31, 2024. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

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### (1) Description of Plan, Continued

#### *Payment of Benefits*

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a distribution equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in either a lump-sum amount or annuity, or a combination of both. All distributions are subject to the applicable provisions of the plan agreement.

Other forms of benefit payment may be available. Participants may take certain in-service withdrawals including hardship withdrawals, subject to the applicable provisions of the plan agreement. The plan also provides for the automatic distribution to certain terminated participants whose vested account balances are less than \$5,000.

#### *Forfeitures*

On December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$129,430 and \$5,066, respectively. These accounts will first be used to reinstate previously forfeited account balances of former participants, if any, and the remaining forfeitures, if any, will be used to reduce future employer contributions (excluding safe harbor contributions). Employer contributions were reduced by \$40,000 from forfeited non-vested accounts during 2024.

### (2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### *Basis of Accounting*

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

#### *Use of Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### *Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's trustees determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor and trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

##### *Investment Valuation and Income Recognition, Continued*

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

##### *Notes Receivable from Participants*

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default based upon the terms of the plan document, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

##### *Contributions*

Contributions from plan participants and the matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

##### *Expenses*

Participants pay an annual fee for administrative costs associated with the recordkeeping and trustee fees, as well as transaction charges for loan and benefit payment transactions which are paid by the Plan by reducing the balances of those participants initiating the transactions. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

##### *Payment of Benefits*

Benefits are recorded when paid.

##### *Subsequent Events*

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 30, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

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#### (3) Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments at fair value and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividend income and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Bank of America, N.A. (Bank of America), a qualified institution.

#### (4) Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Cash, interest-bearing:* Valued at the cost that equals fair value.

*Common collective trust:* Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of a trust company collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

*Registered investment companies:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Registered investment companies held by the Plan are open end registered investment companies that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These investments are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. Registered investment companies held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Self-directed brokerage accounts:* Valued based on quoted market prices of the underlying investments. The underlying assets consist of common stock and registered investment companies that are actively traded.

#### (5) Related Party Transactions and Party-In-Interest Transactions

The Merrill Lynch Bank deposit program, representing interest bearing cash, is managed by Bank of America. Bank of America is the trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules. Fees paid by the Plan for operational and investment management services amounted to \$627,767 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

The Plan is administered by a board of trustees, comprising employees of the Company appointed by the Company's board of directors. The Company has entered into a trust agreement with the members of this board giving those members, as trustees, oversight of the plan assets, which are maintained by Bank of America.

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#### **(5) Related Party Transactions and Party-In-Interest Transactions, Continued**

The Plan is responsible for payment of all investment management fees.

#### **(6) Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

#### **(7) Tax Status**

The Plan uses a prototype document sponsored by Merrill Lynch Pierce Fenner & Smith, Inc. (Merrill Lynch). The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed Merrill Lynch by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the prototype plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

#### **(8) Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
