Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Carter BloodCare Employee's Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained certification from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note E to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAS”). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management’s election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management’s responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan’s ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan’s transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan’s provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor’s report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matters – Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of Form 5500, Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, is presented for the purpose of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or was derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2024 and 2023

A. Description of the Plan

General

The following brief description of the Carter BloodCare Employee's Savings Plan (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. The Plan is sponsored by Carter BloodCare (the "Company" or "Plan Sponsor"). Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information. The Company's corporate offices are located in Bedford, Texas.

The Plan was effective November 1, 1986, and was most recently restated on July 1, 2022, and is a defined contribution plan available to all employees of the Plan Sponsor. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

The purpose of the Plan is to encourage the Plan Sponsor's employees to save and invest, systematically, a portion of their current compensation so that they and their families may have a source of additional income upon their retirement, or in the event of death.

Contributions

Beginning on their first day of employment, participants may elect to defer up to 100% of their annual pre-tax and after-tax annual compensation, as defined by the Plan. Contributions are subject to limitations on annual additions and other limitations imposed by the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code") guidelines. Eligible participants may make pre-tax and after-tax rollover contributions from another qualified plan to the Plan.

Participants who are eligible to make salary deferral contributions under the Plan and who have attained age 50 before the close of the year may make catch-up contributions in accordance with, and subject to, the limitations imposed by the Code.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 3% of pre-tax eligible compensation 365 days after the Plan entry date or reentry date (whichever is applicable). The auto-enrollment applies to eligible employees with an employment commencement date or reemployment commencement date on or after January 1, 2019.

After completing one year of service, the Plan Sponsor will make a matching contribution ("non-elective employer contribution") equal to 100% of the first 4% of each participant's eligible compensation, plus 50% of the next 4% of each participant's eligible compensation, for the Plan year. At the option of the Plan Sponsor's Retirement Plan Committee, the Plan Sponsor has the option to make an additional contribution ("elective employer contribution") to participants. No elective employer contribution was made for the year ended December 31, 2024 or 2023.

A. Description of the Plan – continued

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of: (1) the Plan Sponsor's contributions; and (2) earnings. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

Effective January 1, 2019, active participants became immediately vested in their existing employer contributions balances, plus actual earnings thereon. Any employer contributions made on or after January 1, 2019, plus actual earnings thereon, are immediately vested. Participants who were terminated as of December 31, 2018, follow the below vesting schedule for their employer contribution balances in their accounts as of December 31, 2018, plus actual earnings thereon:

In the event of disability, normal retirement, or death, a participant will become fully vested.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts an amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balances. Loan terms range up to five years, or longer for the purchase of a primary residence. Loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Sponsor. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, interest rates ranged from 3.25% to 8.50% and 3.00% to 8.50%, respectively. Loan repayments are made through payroll deductions and are reinvested in the individual funds according to the investment allocations of the participant. Interest earned on these loans is allocated to the individual participant's account.

Benefit Payments

Participants withdrawing during the year for reasons of service, disability, retirement, death, or termination are entitled to their vested account balances. Benefits are distributed in the form of annuity payments, rollovers to other qualified plans, or lump-sum payments.

A. Description of the Plan – continued

Benefit Payments – continued

Certain in-service withdrawals are allowed. A participant may elect to withdraw all or a portion of his/her vested account balance while employed after reaching age 59½. A participant may also receive a hardship distribution from salary reduction contributions if the distribution is: (1) on account of uninsured medical expenses incurred by the participant, his/her spouse, or dependents; (2) to purchase (excluding mortgage payments) a principal residence of the participant; (3) for the payment of post-secondary tuition expenses; (4) needed to prevent eviction of the participant from his/her principal residence or foreclosure upon the mortgage of the participant's principal residence; (5) for burial or funeral expenses for the participant's deceased parent, spouse, children, or dependents; (6) for the repair of damage to the participant's principal residence; or (7) expenses or losses incurred by the participant on account of a disaster declared by the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

Forfeitures

Forfeited balances are first used to pay Plan expenses at the discretion of management. All unused forfeitures are then used to offset non-elective employer contributions. No forfeitures were used to pay the Plan's expenses for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. There were approximately \$400 and \$10,000 of forfeitures used to offset the non-elective employer contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. There were no unutilized forfeitures as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct his/her salary deferrals in 1% increments into any of the Plan's investment options.

Plan Expenses

Employees of the Plan Sponsor perform certain administrative functions with no compensation from the Plan. In accordance with Plan provisions, the Plan's participants pay substantially all costs relating to recordkeeping, which are reflected in the accompanying financial statements.

B. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are presented on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

B. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies – continued

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from these estimates.

Contributions

Contributions from the Plan Sponsor and participants are recorded as they become obligations of the Plan Sponsor, as determined by the Plan's administrator, and in the period in which they are deducted from the participant's compensation, in accordance with salary deferral agreements.

Investment Valuation and Income

The investments of the Plan are stated at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value) as of the end of the year and are subject to market or credit risks customarily associated with equity investments. Fair value measurements are determined in accordance with GAAP, which defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value, and requires certain disclosures about assets and liabilities measured at fair value. See Note C for information related to the Plan's valuation methodologies.

Investment gains and losses are accounted for using the average cost basis of the securities sold. The net realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments include realized gains and losses on sales of investments during the year and unrealized increases or decreases in the market value of investments held at year-end. Interest income and dividends are recorded as received.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are recorded at the unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

C. Fair Value Measurements

GAAP defines fair value as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date and establishes a three-tier hierarchy that is used to identify assets and liabilities measured at fair value. The hierarchy focuses on the inputs used to measure fair value and requires that the lowest level input be used. The three levels are as follows:

- Level 1 — observable inputs that are based upon quoted market prices for identical assets or liabilities within active markets.
- Level 2 — observable inputs other than Level 1 that are based upon quoted market prices for similar assets or liabilities, based upon quoted prices within inactive markets, or inputs other than quoted market prices that are observable through market data for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 — inputs that are unobservable for the particular asset or liability due to little or no market activity and are significant to the fair value of the asset or liability. These inputs reflect assumptions that market participants would use when valuing the particular asset or liability.

GAAP requires that management describe the methodologies used to measure the fair value of assets and liabilities. The methodologies used to measure the fair value of the Plan's investments are as follows:

- Mutual funds are valued at the published per share net asset value ("NAV") of shares held by the Plan and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. There are no significant restrictions on redeeming these investments at NAV.
- Common collective trust funds are valued on the basis of relative interests of each participating investor in the fair value of the underlying assets of the trusts, which are published for the participating investor, and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 or 2023. The following table details the Plan's investments at fair value by level, within the fair value hierarchy, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan has no assets classified within Level 2 or Level 3 of the valuation hierarchy.

D. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

The Plan holds the Principal Fixed Income Guaranteed Option, which is comprised of a portfolio of traditional investment contracts. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The Plan's investment in this investment contract was \$6,983,662 and \$6,962,783 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer, but may not be less than one percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on a semiannual basis for resetting. The contract cannot be terminated before the scheduled maturity date.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

E. Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net realized and unrealized gain on investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company, the custodian of the Plan.

F. Tax Status

Effective July 1, 2022, the Plan was restated by the adoption of the Principal Financial Group Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan with CODA which has a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") dated June 30, 2020. This opinion letter states that the form of the prototype plan is acceptable under Section 401 of the Code. The Plan Sponsor may rely on this letter with respect to the qualification of the Plan under the Code Section 401(a) with certain limitations.

Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualification. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

GAAP requires management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

G. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions and terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event the Plan terminates, all amounts credited to participants' accounts will become 100% vested.

H. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

CARTER BLOODCARE EMPLOYEE'S SAVINGS PLAN

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS *(continued)*

I. Party-In-Interest Transactions

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee organization, or relatives of such persons.

The Plan invests in investments managed by Principal Trust Company, who acts as the custodian for the Plan. Transactions in such investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules. The Plan paid certain expenses related to operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. Notes receivable from participants to the Plan qualify as party-in-interest transactions and are also exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

J. Subsequent Events

In preparing the accompanying financial statements, management has evaluated all subsequent events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through September 30, 2025, the date the financial statements were available for issuance.

Effective January 1, 2025, the automatic contribution arrangement of the Plan was amended to reduce the number of days after eligibility before automatic enrollment commences from 365 days to 30 days.

Effective January 1, 2025, the automatic contribution arrangement of the Plan was amended to include a provision for the automatic increase of participant contributions, annually, on May 1st of each subsequent year, up to a maximum of 8%.
