1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

Silicon Laboratories Inc. 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all eligible employees of Silicon Laboratories Inc. (the "Company" or "Plan Sponsor"). The Plan became effective January 1, 1997 and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). All Plan assets are held by Charles Schwab Trust Bank ("Charles Schwab"). Complete information regarding the Plan is included in the Plan Agreement. Significant Plan provisions are summarized below.

SECURE 2.0

An expansion of Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 ("SECURE 2.0") was signed into law on December 29, 2022, as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023. The effective dates of provisions within SECURE 2.0 vary through 2026. The Plan Sponsor has until the end of the first plan year beginning on or after January 1, 2026 to amend the Plan for the changes related to SECURE 2.0. Effective March 1, 2024, the Plan was modified to allow Qualified Disaster Recovery Distributions. Effective March 4, 2024 the Plan was modified permit participants to request that otherwise available in-service distributions that qualify as a terminally ill individual distribution are processed to reflect the exception to the 10% early distribution penalty and permit in-service domestic abuse victim distributions to be taken by participants who are still employed. Effective April 14, 2025, the limits on catch-up contributions were increased to comply with administrative provisions. The Plan has not been formally amended to adopt these provisions as of the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Eligibility

Employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan upon date of hire if the participant is at least 21 years of age. Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan on the same day that the eligibility requirements are met. Participants must be employed on the last day of the allocation period to be eligible for discretionary matching contributions and discretionary non-elective contributions unless the participant terminates due to death, disability, or retirement. Union employees, non-resident aliens, and leased employees are not eligible to participant in the Plan.

Contributions

Participants are allowed to make elective pre-tax, after-tax, or Roth contributions to the Plan up to their annual compensation, as defined, subject to limitation under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants who have attained age 50 are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing rollovers from other qualified retirement plans or individual retirement accounts.

Contributions (continued)

The Company may make discretionary matching or non-elective contributions to the Plan of amounts determined and authorized by the Plan and Company's Board of Directors up to the maximum amount permitted by the IRC. During 2024, the Company's Board of Directors approved a discretionary match up to \$5,000 per eligible participant based on their contributions to the Plan, which was calculated and funded each quarter. No discretionary non-elective contributions were approved or made for 2024.

Participant accounts

Participants direct the investment of their accounts among various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Each participant's account is credited with (a) the participant's contributions, (b) an allocation of employer contributions, and (c) an allocation of investment earnings, and is charged with (a) withdrawals, (b) an allocation of investment losses, and (c) certain administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, including rollover contributions, plus earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary contributions, plus earnings thereon, is based on years of credited service, as defined. A participant is 100% vested upon death, disability, or retirement.

Forfeitures

Non-vested balances of participants' accounts may be subject to forfeiture upon termination of their employment with the Company. A forfeiture occurs in the Plan year in which the participant either receives a distribution of their vested account or has five consecutive one-year breaks in service, as defined by the Plan. Forfeitures are retained in the Plan and used either to pay Plan administrative expenses or to reduce future employer contributions. The forfeited unvested account balance totaled \$2,865 and \$5,906 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. For the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures totaling \$55,391 were used to pay Plan administrative expenses.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 and up to a maximum of i) \$50,000 reduced by the highest outstanding note receivable balance over the prior twelve months less the outstanding balance on the date a new note receivable is made or ii) 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. Notes receivable from participants are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest based on prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Sponsor. Participants may only have one note receivable outstanding at a time. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions over a period generally not to exceed five years, unless the funds are used for purchase of a principal residence, in which case repayment terms may be extended. At December 31, 2024, interest rates on notes receivable from participants ranged from 3.25% to 8.50% with varying maturity dates through August 2051.

Payment of benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or termination of employment, a participant is entitled to receive an amount equal to the vested interest in his or her account, payable in a single lump sum or in partial distributions. In general, if a participant's vested account balance, as defined by the Plan, is greater than \$1,000 (the "involuntary cash-out amount") and employment is terminated other than due to retirement or death, the account may not be distributed before normal retirement without the participant's consent. However, if the participant does not make an election within 30 days after notice was provided, the Plan may, upon termination of service of a participant for any reason, pay the benefits owed in a lump sum if the account balance is less than \$1,000. Distributions are subject to the applicable provisions of the Plan Agreement.

In-service withdrawals of all or a portion of a participant's vested account balance may be withdrawn by the participant after reaching age 59½.

Withdrawals from the Plan may also be made under circumstances of financial hardship, in accordance with the provisions specified in the Plan. Hardship withdrawals are strictly regulated by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

Payment of benefits (continued)

Distributions from the Plan will generally be subject to income taxes and in certain circumstances may also be subject to IRS penalties, unless the distribution is transferred to another qualified plan or individual retirement account.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and uncertainties

The Plan provides for investments in various investment securities, which, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Retirement Plan Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies using information provided by investment advisers, the custodian, and the insurance company. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Management fees and expenses charged to the Plan for investment accounts are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. For participant loans that become delinquent, are not cured and result in default, the amount of the unpaid loan principal and interest due to the Plan will be treated as a deemed distribution. Deemed distributions are reported as a taxable distribution and remain part of the participant's account balance until a distributable event occurs.

Contributions and contributions receivable

Contributions from participants are recorded based on the date the contributions have been separated from a participant's pay by the Company, which is the pay date. The Plan records receivables for participants' contributions based upon the contributions recognized, less amounts received by the Plan as of the last day of the Plan year. Contributions from the Company are recorded in the year earned and coincide with the year in which the Company records the contributions to its general ledger. The Plan records receivables for Employer contributions based upon the contributions recognized, less amounts received by the Plan as of the last day of the Plan year. Rollover contributions from participants are recorded based on the date the rollover contributions have been received by the Plan's trustee.

Payment of benefits

Benefits to participants are recorded by the Plan when actual payment is made.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payment transactions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses and expensed when incurred. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments. The Plan is not required to reimburse the Plan Sponsor for expenses paid on its behalf.

Subsequent events

The Company evaluated events occurring between the end of the most recent fiscal year and through the report date, October 1, 2025, the date the financial statements and supplemental schedule were available to be issued. Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was retroactively amended to exclude all imputed income from the Plan's definition of eligible compensation.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The guidance for fair value measurement establishes the authoritative definition of fair value, sets out a framework for measuring fair value, and outlines the required disclosures regarding fair value measurements. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan uses a three-tier fair value hierarchy based upon observable and non-observable inputs as follows:

- Level 1: Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the reporting entity has the ability to access at the measurement date.
- Level 2: Inputs other than quoted prices included in Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly.
- Level 3: Unobservable inputs developed using the Plan's estimates and assumptions which reflect those that market participants would use.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- *Mutual funds*: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.
- *Collective trust fund*: The Schwab Managed Retirement Trust Funds are a collective trust fund administered by Charles Schwab. This fund is valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust fund, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. The NAV is not a publicly-quoted price in an active market. Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 information on the Schwab Managed Retirement Trust Fund's underlying assets and their assigned fair value hierarchy was obtained from the audited financial statements that are made available to applicable plan sponsors.

- *Self directed brokerage accounts*: The Plan offers a participant-directed brokerage account as an investment option. If elected, a participant-directed brokerage account, which is administered by Charles Schwab, allows a participant to direct the investment of the participant's contributions to the Plan among various mutual fund options offered, including mutual funds that are not otherwise offered as investment options under the Plan, subject to certain minimum investment and withdrawal requirements and an overall investment limit of not more than 95% of the value of the participant's overall Plan account balance. These investments are valued at the respective NAVs of the funds held in the accounts. Participant-directed brokerage accounts are not monitored or managed by the Plan Sponsor or the Plan.

The Plan administrator has requested that the Plan's independent auditor perform no audit procedures on the certified information other than agree the certified information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

5. RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

ERISA defines parties-in-interest similarly to the definition of a related party under U.S. GAAP, except that ERISA's definition is broader and includes all entities and individuals that provide services to the Plan; however, these entities may not necessarily be related parties. Management did not identify any related parties to the Plan that were not also considered to be parties-in-interest. The Plan did not enter into any material related party transactions during the Plan year related to compensation arrangements, expense allowances, or similar items. Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, and a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association or relatives of such persons.

Plan assets include investments in funds managed by Charles Schwab and notes receivable from participants. Charles Schwab serves as the Plan's trustee and as such, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. The Plan Sponsor may pay directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

6. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of the termination of the Plan, the individual accounts of all members shall become fully vested. After deducting all charges and expenses, the balances of all individual accounts will be adjusted and the remaining assets distributed.

7. TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted a prototype plan document that received an opinion letter from the IRS on September 21, 2020. The opinion letter stated that the prototype plan document is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan, as adopted and amended, is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes is included in the Plan's financial statements.
