INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Plan Administrator of the

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the 403(b) Thrift Plan of Children's Friend and Service of Rhode Island (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the Statements of Net Assets Available for Plan Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Plan Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 7 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the 403(b) Thrift Plan of Children's Friend and Service of Rhode Island (the Plan) is intended to provide only general information regarding the Plan. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan that contains a salary deferral arrangement as described under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 403(b). All employees of Children's Friend and Service of Rhode Island (the Plan Sponsor) are eligible to participate in the salary reduction contribution feature of the Plan except for those employees that are non-resident aliens or an employee eligible to make salary reduction contributions to another plan of the Plan Sponsor. Participants who have completed one year of service (1,000 hours) and have attained the age of 21 are eligible for the Plan Sponsor contributions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Plan Sponsor is also the administrator of the Plan. As administrator, the Plan Sponsor has exclusive authority and responsibility for all matters in connection with the operation and administration of the Plan. Mutual of America Life Insurance Company (Mutual of America) is the appointed custodian of the Plan and acts at the direction of the Plan's administrator.

Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute pretax annual compensation, not to exceed annual limitations as provided by the IRC. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants with 15 years of service are permitted to make special IRC Section 403(b) catch-up contributions. Participants may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover contributions).

The Plan includes an automatic contribution provision under which the Plan Sponsor automatically enrolls the participants to make tax-deferred contributions in an amount equal to 1% of their eligible compensation, with no annual escalation provision.

The Plan Sponsor contributes two types of employer contributions to the Plan: a matching contribution and a base contribution. As it relates to the Plan Sponsor's matching contributions, the Plan Sponsor will contribute 25% of an eligible participant's salary reduction contribution deferrals not to exceed 6% of the participant's eligible compensation. As it relates to the Plan Sponsor's base contribution, the Plan Sponsor contributes 3% of a participant's eligible compensation. Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan Sponsor amended the Plan to eliminate the Plan Sponsor's base contribution.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Plan Sponsor's contributions and their allocation of Plan earnings (losses) and any expenses incurred. Allocations are based on compensation or individual participant account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Plan Loans

Participants may request a loan from the custodian for a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. Loans to participants are treated as Plan loans and are not directed investments in the Plan. The participant must have 120% of the loan amount invested in the insurance company general account investment option as collateral and will bear a reasonable rate of interest that may not exceed the legal limit. Participants are allowed to have only one outstanding loan at any given time. Note terms typically range from one to five years, but can exceed five years for the purchase of a primary residence. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Plan participants had loans outstanding with the custodian of \$306,116 and \$247,144, at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions (including rollover contributions) plus actual earnings on those contributions. Participants become fully vested in the Plan Sponsor contributions and earnings on those contributions after three years of service. Participants are also vested upon death, disability or attainment of normal retirement age.

Payment of Benefits

On retirement, death, disability or termination of service, a participant (or participant's beneficiary in the event of death) receives a lump-sum amount or installment payments equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Amounts in the salary reduction contribution portion of a participant's account that were made prior to December 31, 1988 may be withdrawn at any time. If a participant has reached age 59½, distributions of amounts in the employee deferral account may be made, at the participant's election, without requiring the participant to terminate employment. If a participant's vested balance is less than \$1,000, the participant will receive an immediate cash-out of their vested account balance, and the non-vested portion shall be treated as a forfeiture.

Hardship withdrawals from the Plan are also permitted subject to the applicable Internal Revenue Service (IRS) laws.

Forfeitures

Participants in the Plan who leave the employment of the Plan Sponsor before completing three years of service forfeit the non-vested portion of their accounts. Forfeitures will be used to pay Plan expenses or reduce future Plan Sponsor contributions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts available to reduce future Plan Sponsor contributions totaled \$758 and \$3,336, respectively. During 2024, Plan Sponsor contributions were reduced by \$57,288 from forfeited non-vested accounts.

Investment Options

Participants may direct their contributions in percentage increments into a series of fund options offered by the custodian to be held in the Plan's separate account. Alternatively, participants may invest their funds in the interest accumulation account, which provides a stated rate of return as the invested funds are held in the custodian's general account. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

The Plan includes a default investment option where contributions made on behalf of a participant where no investment option has been designated shall be allocated to the Mutual of America Retirement Funds that are appropriate to the participant's age at the time of allocation.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

Investments in the insurance company general account are held in an interest accumulation account in accordance with the contract described in Note 4 and are stated at contract value. Investments in the insurance company separate accounts are valued at net asset value (NAV) as a practical expedient to approximate fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (Note 3).

The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by investment advisors and the custodian.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Participant and Plan Sponsor contributions are recorded bi-weekly when the Plan Sponsor remits the contributions for investment into the Plan.

Excess Contributions Refundable

Amounts refundable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the excess contributions to the applicable participants subsequent to year end.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recognized when paid to participants or their designated beneficiaries.

Administrative Expenses

Certain administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor, unless the Plan Sponsor directs that the expenses be paid by the Plan. Expenses that are paid by the Plan Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Plan loan set-up and maintenance fees are paid directly by the participants through a reduction in their account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment management and recordkeeping fees, if applicable, are paid by the Plan through revenue sharing as a reduction of investment income (net appreciation or depreciation) from the related investment fund.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Sponsor to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options with various investment objectives. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Plan Benefits.

The Plan invested in an insurance company general account that accounted for approximately 27% and 29% of total Plan investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Financial Instruments with a Concentration of Credit Risk

The Plan's investments are held by a single custodian. The Plan's exposure to credit risk is associated with the outside custodian's non-performance of its fiduciary responsibilities relating to these amounts as specified in the agreements. Benefits provided by the Plan are not insured or guaranteed by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation.

3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy and inputs to the valuation methodologies are described as follows:

Level 1 inputs are unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 inputs are other than quoted prices in active markets that are observable either directly or indirectly for the asset. Such inputs are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data for similar assets by correlation or other means, over substantially the full contractual term of the asset, if applicable.

Level 3 inputs are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement. Such inputs generally rely on the Plan's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis:

Insurance Company Separate Accounts: Valued using the NAV provided by the administrator of the fund based on the fair value of the underlying investments. NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan did not have investments that would be included in the fair value hierarchy as noted above. However, the Plan's investments in insurance company separate accounts are reported at NAV and in accordance with subtopic 820-10 would be presented outside the fair value hierarchy table as a reconciling item.

4. Investment Contract with Insurance Company

The Plan has entered into an investment contract with Mutual of America. Amounts held in connection with this contract may be held in Mutual of America's general account or separate accounts which invest in mutual funds advised by Mutual of America, mutual funds sub-advised by third parties, mutual funds managed by external mutual fund companies or invested directly in securities. Contributions allocated to the interest accumulation account are invested in the general account of, and are guaranteed by, Mutual of America. All other contributions allocated to any investment fund become part of separate accounts and are maintained separately from the general assets of Mutual of America. The value of the general account investments included in the financial statements are reported at contract value, as reported to the Plan by Mutual of America. Contract value is equal to the sum of contributions made plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

The contract value of funds allocated to the general account with the insurance carrier at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$5,284,493 and \$5,020,967, respectively. The crediting interest rate was 2.85% for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the crediting interest rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis. Participant transactions may occur daily. Certain redemption restrictions exist were the Plan to liquidate the entire holding of the general account investment.

The guarantee of values provided for the investment made with Mutual of America under the Plan's investment contract is based on the financial strength and claims-paying ability of Mutual of America.

5. Plan Termination

The Plan Sponsor expects to continue the Plan indefinitely. However, the Plan Sponsor reserves the right to amend the Plan, or contributions thereto, at any time and in any manner that it deems advisable, provided that no amendment shall have the effect of diverting Plan assets for purposes other than for the exclusive benefit of the Plan participants and any Plan termination would be subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, the participants would become fully vested and entitled to receive all amounts credited to their accounts.

6. Income Tax Status

Final regulations under Section 403(b) were published by the IRS on July 26, 2007. Under the regulations, a 403(b) plan sponsor by December 31, 2009 must have adopted a written plan intended to satisfy the requirements of Section 403(b) and the regulations effective as of January 1, 2009. The IRS is in the process of establishing pre-approved and individually designed plan programs under which a plan sponsor can obtain assurance that the written form of its plan satisfies Section 403(b). Transition relief will be provided to the 403(b) plan sponsors who have made appropriate efforts to comply with the written plan requirement in the final regulations. The Plan Sponsor adopted a written plan which it believes satisfies the written plan requirement. The Plan Sponsor also believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Sponsor has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken, or expected to be taken, that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

10. Subsequent Events

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan adopted a provision of the SECURE Act 2.0 allowing certain eligible participants to make increased catch-up elective deferrals, referred to as “super catch-up” contributions. Under this provision, the maximum catch-up deferral amount for participants between the ages of 60 and 63 increased from \$7,500 to \$11,250.

Management has evaluated subsequent events through September 16, 2025, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued.
