To the Plan Administrator of **Point Broadband 401(k) Plan**:

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of **Point Broadband 401(k) Plan**, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

A. Description of Plan

The following description of Point Broadband 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement or the Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

Point Broadband Fiber Holding LLC (the "Company") is the Plan sponsor and Plan administrator. The Plan is a defined contribution, tax-deferred retirement savings plan covering all salaried and hourly wage employees of the Company and of Point Services, LLC, a related company, with certain exceptions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Eligibility and Entry Date

An employee must be at least eighteen years of age and have completed six months of service to participate in the Plan. An employee may begin participation in the Plan on the semi-annual entry date, coinciding with or next following the date that eligibility requirements are met.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of compensation, not to exceed the maximum salary deferral limit and other limitations established by law. Compensation is defined in the Plan documents as wages, tips and other compensation as reported on Form W-2, elective pre-tax deferrals, and pre-tax contributions made to a qualified cafeteria plan. Defined compensation excludes taxable fringe benefits and certain other items.

Participants may elect deferral contributions as pre-tax elective deferrals, as Roth after-tax deferrals, or as both. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions as allowed by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants also may make rollover contributions of distributions from other qualified plans or individual retirement accounts, subject to Plan provisions. Participant contributions are invested according to direction of the participants.

The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions to the Plan each pay date equal to 100% of salary deferrals up to 4% of compensation. Company contributions are invested according to participant investment elections.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions. Investment earnings, losses, and changes in market value are allocated based upon the investment experience of each holding in a participant's account. Certain transactional costs and service charges, if any, are allocated to the specific accounts involved in the transaction or receiving the service. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are 100% vested immediately in their own deferral and rollover contributions. Employer safe harbor matching contributions are also fully vested when contributed.

Participant Loans

Participants who are active employees may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance, subject to certain other Plan provisions. Loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate of interest in effect at the initiation of the loan plus one percent. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deduction from each regular paycheck. A Participant may only have one loan outstanding at any time.

Receipt of Benefits

Plan participants are eligible to receive benefit payments from the Plan at retirement, prior to retirement under certain circumstances, upon termination of employment with the Company, upon disability and at death. Benefit payments, limited to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, may be elected as a lump-sum payment or rollover. Hardship distributions are allowed. Partial withdrawals or installment plans are available for required minimum distributions.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, unallocated forfeitures totaled \$1,556 and \$2, respectively. Forfeitures may be used to reduce employer contributions or pay Plan expenses. During 2024, zero forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions or to pay Plan expenses.

B. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

Preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are valued at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits payments are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Per-use transaction fees are charged directly to specific participant accounts for certain services. Administrative expenses are allocated proportionately to participant accounts and are included in fees and other expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events for disclosure in these financial statements through September 9, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

C. Information Prepared and Certified by the Plan Trustee

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. Accordingly, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, each a trustee and custodian of Plan assets during 2024 and 2023, have certified as to the completeness and accuracy of reported investment balances and related activity in these financial statements and supplemental schedules, summarized as follows:

D. Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurement). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability. Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;

- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective trust funds: Collective trust funds are valued at the NAV of units of the bank collective trust. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The following tables set forth by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's assets at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Assets are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies

or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

E. Guaranteed Interest Contract

The Empower Investments Fixed Account Series II investment is a guaranteed interest contract issued by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (“EAICA”). EAICA maintains the contributions in a general company account and is contractually obligated to repay principal and a specified interest rate to the Plan. A single crediting interest rate is applied to all Fixed Account assets regardless of when contributions are made. The crediting interest rate may change or stay the same quarterly. The average crediting interest rates during 2024 and 2023 were 1.66% and 1.48%, respectively. The Fixed Account contract value was \$70,273 at December 31, 2024 and \$55,816 at December 31, 2023.

The Empower Investments Fixed Account Series II contract meets the fully benefit responsive investment criteria for participant-initiated withdrawals and therefore is presented at contract value on the statements of net assets available for benefits. Contract value is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by EAICA, represents contributions made under the contract, plus interest credited, less participant withdrawals. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value, subject to provisions for transfers to “competing investment options.”

The Plan’s ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer’s ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer’s ability to meet its financial obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

Certain events, such as Plan termination, layoffs, early retirement incentives, merger, acquisition, partial Plan termination, or termination of the contract by the Plan sponsor, may be subject to a market value adjustment and limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer of the contract. The Plan administrator believes that any events which would limit the Plan’s ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of not occurring.

F. Related Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions

Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America is the recordkeeper and third party administrator of the Plan and received fees for services, per-use transactions, and other administrative services. Empower Trust Company, LLC is the Plan trustee and custodian of the Plan assets and received fees for services. A financial advisor receives fees for advisory services provided to the Plan and Plan participants. The Company provides the Plan with accounting and administrative services, for which no fees are charged to the Plan. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

G. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

H. Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and reported in its opinion letter dated November 14, 2022, that the form of the adopted pre-approved plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is currently being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. Management believes that no uncertain tax positions have been taken or are expected to be taken that would require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

I. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported on the statements of net assets available for benefits.
