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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Plan Administrator of the

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of First National Corporation 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about First National Corporation 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are issued or are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about First National Corporation 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matters - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Plan Description

The following description of the First National Corporation 401(k) Plan ("Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering employees of First National Corporation ("Company") who are age nineteen or older. The Plan covers employees of First National Corporation and its subsidiary, First Bank. On May 16, 2016, the Plan was amended to exclude seasonal workers and part time employees expected to work less than 20 hours a week. Effective October 1, 2024, the Plan was restated to allow enrollment and prior service credits to be provided to employees acquired during the merger with Touchstone Bankshares, Inc. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Board of Trustees is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan's Board of Trustees.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute an amount up to the maximum allowed by the Internal Revenue Service, as defined in the Plan. Each new participant in the Plan is deemed to have been elected to make a pre-tax contribution of 3% of compensation unless an election is made within 60 days of becoming eligible to participate in the Plan for a different contribution amount. Any participant auto enrolled in the Plan will have their deferral percentage increased annually by one percent until a deferral rate of 6% percent is reached. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

The Company makes a matching contribution equal to 100% of the first 1% and 50% between 2% and 6% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan for the benefit of the respective employee. The Company also makes a safe harbor match equal to 3% of eligible compensation. In addition, the Company will make a profit sharing contribution to the Plan for eligible employees.

Notes to Financial Statements

The profit sharing contribution is allocated based on the table below to the accounts of eligible participants.

An additional discretionary profit sharing contribution may be contributed at the option of the Company's Board of Directors. The contribution, if any, is to be allocated in the proportion of a participant's covered compensation to covered compensation of all participants. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participants' Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of (a) the Company's matching and discretionary contributions, if any, and (b) Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and the Company's safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after 2 years of credited service.

Investment Options

The contribution portions of the assets in the Plan are directed by individual participants. Participants are given the option to direct account balances and their contributions made into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms range to a maximum of 5 years or up to 30 years for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the Prime rate plus 1%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Notes to Financial Statements

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to resignation, death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to either receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or roll over his or her distribution into an Individual Retirement Account or another qualified plan. In certain situations, participants may receive in-service hardship withdrawals from the employee's pre-tax portion of their accounts.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there was \$1,292 and \$23,360 in forfeited nonvested accounts, respectively. These accounts are used to reduce employer contributions and pay administrative expenses. There was \$30,000 of forfeited nonvested accounts utilized to reduce employer contributions during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and trustees. See Note 7 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 3. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become vested in all employer contributions and Plan earnings thereon.

Note 4. Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a non-standardized form of a prototype plan sponsored by VOYA Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. The plan provider has received an advisory letter from the Internal Revenue Service as to the plan's qualified status. The advisory letter has been relied upon by the Plan. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 5. Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's accounts and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation of the fair value of investments.

Note 6. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 7. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the assets or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered investment companies: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective Trust Funds: Valued based on the NAV of units of the collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimating fair value. The NAV is based upon fair value of the underlying investments comprising the trust less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Investments in collective trust funds valued at NAV as a practical expedient can generally be redeemed daily.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model-based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value to another.

We evaluated the significance of transfers between levels based upon the nature of the financial instrument and size of the transfer relative to total net assets available for benefits. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no significant transfers in or out of different levels.

Note 8. Certification

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of the investments, dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Administrator. The Plan Administrator has obtained a certification from VOYA Institutional Trust Company that the information provided to the Plan Administrator by the trustee is complete and accurate.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 9. Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by VOYA Institutional Trust Company. VOYA Institutional Trust Company acted as trustee and custodian as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

VOYA Institutional Trust Company provides certain administrative services to the Plan pursuant to an agreement between the Company and the custodian. The custodian receive revenue from mutual fund and collective trust service providers for services provided to the funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to the custodian for its administrative services to the Plan.

If the revenue received by the service provider from such mutual fund or collective trust service providers exceeds the amount owed under the agreement, the custodian remits the excess to the Plan's trust on a regular basis. Such amounts may be applied to pay Plan administrative expenses or allocated to the accounts of the participants. During 2024, there were no excess amounts. The Plan or Company may make a payment to the service providers for administrative expenses not covered by revenue sharing.

VBA Benefits Corporation provides investment services to the Plan pursuant to an agreement between the Plan and VBA Benefits Corporation. Therefore, amounts paid to VBA Benefits Corporation qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These fees are included as a component of administrative expenses on the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 10. Subsequent Events

The Plan Administrator has evaluated subsequent events through September 22, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
