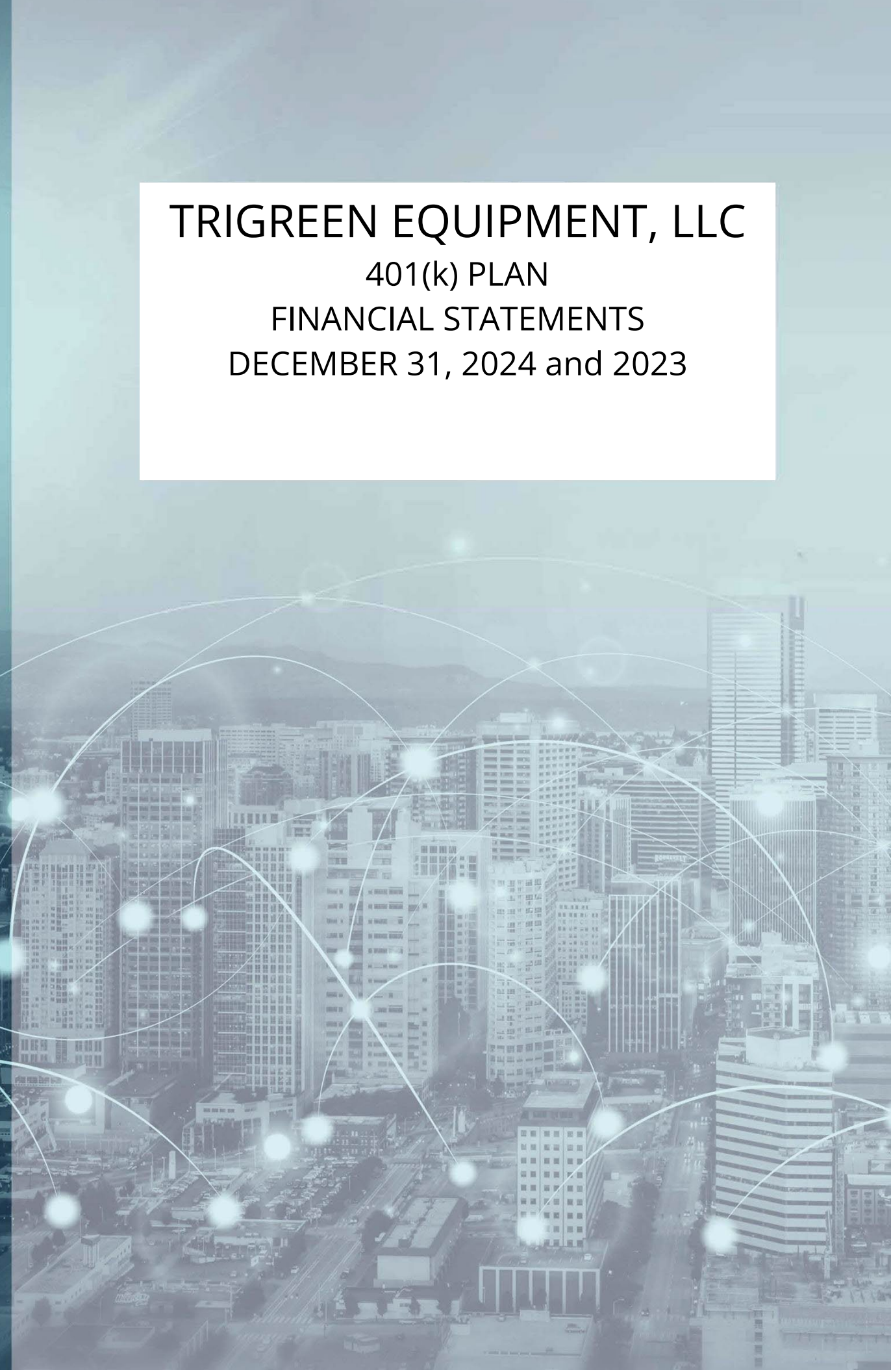

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of TriGreen Equipment, LLC 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

This involves maintaining sufficient records for each participant to determine the benefits that are due or may become due.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.



Notes To Financial Statements

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the TriGreen Equipment, LLC 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees, as defined by the Plan, of TriGreen Equipment, LLC (the Plan Sponsor) upon the date the employee first completes a month of service and has attained age 18. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. The Plan Sponsor is responsible for the oversight of the Plan. The Plan Administrator determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan's Sponsor.

Contributions

Participants may make salary deferred contributions to the Plan up to 100% of their annual compensation, not to exceed the annual limits imposed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Participants may elect to make all pre-tax deferrals, all roth deferrals, or a combination of deferrals each pay period. Contributions from employees are recorded and remitted in the period in which the Plan makes the deductions from the participants' payroll. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan has recorded a liability of \$29,807 and \$28,893, respectively, for the refund of excess participant contributions. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company may contribute a discretionary matching contribution to the Plan in an amount equal to a uniform percentage or dollar amount of the participant's elective deferrals. The Company may also contribute a discretionary nonelective contribution to the Plan. For the year ended December 31, 2024, \$696,871 in discretionary matching contributions were made by the Employer.

The Plan records employer and employee contributions receivable when compensation is earned. The Plan adopted ASC 326, *Financial Instruments – Credit Losses*, effective January 1, 2024, using the modified retrospective method. In accordance with ASC 326, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded at December 31, 2024, as employer and employee contributions receivable have never historically incurred losses and current conditions and supportable forecasts show zero risk of nonpayment.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company's matching contributions (if any), as well as allocations of the Plan earnings, and is charged with an allocation of certain administrative expenses. Allocations are based on account balances, specific participant transactions, or may be charged equally to each participant, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of participant accounts is based on years of service, as defined. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service.

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of the lesser of \$50,000 or one-half of their vested account balance. The notes receivable from participants are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The notes receivable from participant's interest rate, a fixed rate that ranges from 3.25% to 8.50%, is commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant with a vested balance equal to or less than \$1,000 is entitled to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. If the vested account is at least \$1,001 and not greater than \$5,000, it will be rolled to an individual retirement plan designated by the Plan Administrator, unless the participant chooses to have it paid in a single sum or to another direct rollover. A participant with a vested balance exceeding \$5,000 may elect to receive a lump-sum cash distribution, direct rollover, or monthly installments over a period not exceeding the participant's life expectancy. In addition, distributions to participants on account of financial hardship may be made in certain circumstances limited under the terms of the Plan.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$47,167 and \$33,328, respectively. Non-vested forfeited accounts, when applicable, may be used to pay for reasonable Plan expenses, offset future employer contributions, or re-allocate to participants. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$33,102 of forfeitures were used to reduce amounts required to be contributed to the Plan.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP, requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, custodians, and insurance company.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent loans are treated as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2025.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

In preparing these financial statements, the Company has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through the date of the auditor's report, which was the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3. INFORMATION CERTIFIED AND PROVIDED BY THE TRUSTEE

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the information certified by Empower Trust Company, LLC, trustees and custodians of the Plan, except for comparing such information certified by the trustees and custodians to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule.

NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurement and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Unit prices are valued at net asset value based on fair value of the underlying investments. The underlying investments are owned by Empower Retirement and include mutual funds or common collective trusts. The unit prices are not publicly available, and units are not publicly traded. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value.

NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

Collective Investment Funds: Unit prices are valued at net asset value based on quoted market prices of underlying investments. The unit prices are not publicly available, and units are not publicly traded. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

The Plan has investments in various pooled separate accounts which invest in equity, bond, and target date funds. The objective of those investment vehicles invested in equity investments is to approximate the risk and return characterized by various indexes. The objective of those investment vehicles invested in bond funds is generally to yield a higher return than money market or stable value investments while still preserving principal. The objectives of the investment vehicles invested in target date funds is to achieve growth, income, and conservation of capital. These funds invest a greater portion of their assets in fixed income, equity income, and balanced funds as they approach and continue past target date.

NOTE 5. GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan has a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Mass Mutual Life Insurance Company. Mass Mutual Life Insurance Company maintains the contributions in a general account. Balances in the contract totaled \$165,223 and \$211,931 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1% or more than 3%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Mass Mutual Life Insurance Company, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 6. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

During 2024, certain Plan investments were shares of pooled separate accounts and fixed investment accounts managed by Empower Trust Company, LLC. Empower Trust Company, LLC serves as the trustee of Plan assets, and therefore, these transactions qualify as parties in interest to the Plan. Fees of \$114,685 were paid to Empower Trust Company, LLC by the Plan during the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts and the Employer will direct the distribution of accounts in a manner permitted by the Plan as soon as practicable.

NOTE 8. TAX STATUS

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.
