Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Esperanza Health Systems 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter—Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules of Assets Held at End of Year are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

**NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
December 31, 2024 and 2023**

1. Description of Plan - The following description of the Esperanza Health Systems 401(k) Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan's sponsor is Esperanza Health Systems, Ltd. dba La Hacienda Treatment Center ("the Company").
 - a. General - The Plan is a defined contribution profit-sharing plan with a 401(k) option covering all full-time employees of the Company who have completed 1,000 hours of service during a twelve-consecutive month period of service, are 21 years of age or older, are not reclassified employees, and are not a nonresident alien without U.S. source income from the Company. The plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA") and certain provisions of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC").
 - b. Administration - The Company is the administrator of the Plan. As administrator, the Company has exclusive authority and responsibility for all matters in connection with the operation and administration of the Plan, including the authority and responsibility to invest, manage and control the assets of the Plan specifically allocated to the trustee. Matrix Trust Company (the "Trustee") is the appointed trustee for the Plan and acts at the direction of the Company.
 - c. Contributions - Each year, participants may contribute the lesser of 50% of their eligible compensation or the maximum amount allowed by law (\$23,000 for 2024) of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. This Plan also allows for catch-up contributions for participants over 50 years of age (\$7,500 for 2024) of pretax annual compensation. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Plan currently offers 20 mutual funds and one money market fund as investment options for participants.

For each plan year, the Company, in its sole discretion, may make annual discretionary contributions. The Company contribution is invested pro-rata according to the investment allocations selected by the participant for their participant contributions. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the company elected to match 25% of participant contributions up to 5% of total eligible compensation.

- d. Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution and, (b) Plan earnings, and (c) Plan administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.
- e. Notes Receivable from Participants - Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to 100% of one-half of the total vested account balance or \$50,000, whichever is less. The notes receivable are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Interest rates on notes receivable from participants at December 31, 2024 were 5.25% to 10.50%. All notes must be repaid within a specific period of time, not to exceed five years, except those that are used for the purchase of a principal residence in which case the note can be extended for up to 10 years. In most cases, repayment of the note will be made through after-tax payroll deductions.
- f. Rollovers and Transfers - Participants who have a balance in another qualified employee benefit plan, as described in Section 401(a) of the IRC, may transfer or rollover the lump sum of values of their account directly into the Plan, provided it meets the requirements of the IRC.

- g. Vesting - Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the company's discretionary contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on the following schedule:

- h. Payment of Benefits – Benefits become available to participants upon the earliest of four events: (1) termination of employment, (2) death of the participant (benefits are payable to the participant’s spouse or beneficiary), (3) upon the participant’s retirement or (4) reaching the age of 59 ½. Benefits are payable as lump sums, rollover distributions, or installment payments.

If the participant terminates employment, and their vested balance is less than \$5,000, the participant’s vested benefits are available in a lump sum distribution. If the participant has not provided distribution instructions, the balance will be distributed to an individual retirement account established in the participant’s name.

If the participant terminates employment, and their vested account balance exceeds \$5,000, the participant’s benefits will not be distributed until the participant requests payment from the Plan administrator. If the participant does not request a distribution of their vested account balance, it will be left in the Plan. However, the participant is required to begin making minimum distributions no later than April 1 of the calendar year following the calendar year in which the participant turns 70 ½ or upon death.

In-service withdrawals of vested account balances are permitted after age 59 ½.

Upon termination of service due to death prior to retirement, the participant’s account becomes 100% vested, and the participant’s benefit will be distributed to the participant’s spouse or beneficiary. If the vested balance is less than \$5,000, the spouse or beneficiary will receive a lump sum payment of the entire balance unless the beneficiary elects for the distribution to be directly rolled into an individual retirement account. If the vested balance exceeds \$5,000 and is not subject to the Retirement Equity Act (“REA”), the beneficiary will receive the money in periodic payments from an insurance company, unless a special form is signed. These periodic payments will be made on a monthly basis. If the vested balance exceeds \$5,000 and is subject to REA, the beneficiary will receive benefits in one of the following forms of distributions: lump sum, installment payments, or annuity contract.

Upon the participant reaching the normal retirement age of 65, benefits will be provided as described below at the option of the participant. The participant may defer benefit payments after reaching the normal retirement age of 65 if the participant’s vested account in the Plan does not exceed \$5,000. Benefits must start being paid by April 1, following the calendar year in which the participant reaches age 70 ½ (for participants defined as over 5% owners) or the calendar year in which they retire, if later (available only for participants that do not qualify as over 5% owners).

If the participant becomes disabled and is eligible for Social Security disability benefits or is determined disabled by a physician selected by the Plan Administrator, the participant’s account becomes 100% vested.

h. Payment of Benefits (continued)

Payments from the plan that are eligible rollover distributions may be taken in two ways: (1) paid in a direct rollover to an individual retirement account or another eligible retirement plan, or (2) paid to the participant. If the participant elects to have plan benefits paid directly to the participant, only 80% is paid as the Plan Administrator is required to withhold 20% of the payment for income tax withholding.

i. Forfeited Accounts – At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$-0- and \$-0-, respectively. These accounts may be used to reduce future employer contributions.

j. Plan Expenses – The expenses of operating and maintaining the Plan have been paid by the Company. In the event the Company does not continue to pay the Plan expenses, the Plan expenses will be paid by the Plan and charged on a pro-rata basis to the value of the participants' account balances.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP"). Investments are presented at fair value in accordance with GAAP as prescribed for defined contribution plans.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, the actual results may differ from those estimates.

Income Recognition

The Plan presents in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits the net appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of its investments, which consists of realized gains or losses and the unrealized appreciation or depreciation on those investments. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a settlement date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Investment Valuation

Investments are reflected in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits at their estimated fair values. Fair value at December 31, 2024 and 2023, as determined by the Trustee, is based primarily on the quoted market prices of the underlying securities. Money market investments are valued at cost plus accrued earnings, which approximates fair value, as determined by the Trustee. Due to the inherent uncertainty of these valuations, the estimated values may differ from the actual fair values that may or may not be ultimately realized.

Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and investment income during the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by the Trustee.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies (continued)

Notes Receivable – Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are classified as deemed distributions in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits based upon the terms of the Plan document. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$8,633 was recorded as interest income on notes receivable from participants.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain administrative expenses are paid by the Plan Sponsor and, accordingly, are not reflected in the accompanying financial statements of the Plan.

Subsequent Events

The Company evaluates events that occur subsequent to the balance sheet date of periodic reports, but before financial statements are issued for periods ending on such balance sheet dates, for possible adjustment to such financial statements or other disclosure. This evaluation generally occurs through the date at which the Company's financial statements are electronically prepared for filing with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. For the financial statements as of and for the period ending December 31, 2024, this date was September 29, 2025.

3. Party-In-Interest

There are no prohibited party-in-interest transactions for the years ended December 31, 2024 or 2023.

4. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

5. Tax Status

The Plan operates under a standardized adoption agreement in connection with a prototype 401(k) profit-sharing plan sponsored by the Third-Party Administrator. This prototype plan document has been filed with the appropriate agency and has obtained a determination letter as of August 30, 2001, in which the IRS stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and was exempt from income taxes. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

5. Tax Status (continued)

The Plan has adopted authoritative guidance on accounting for uncertainty in income taxes, which defines a recognition threshold and measurement attribute for the financial statements recognition and measurement of a tax position taken or expected to be taken in a tax return. As a result of the adoption, the Plan did not identify any uncertain tax positions that qualify for either recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

6. Fidelity Bond – The Plan was covered as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 by a \$500,000 fidelity bond, and as a result, the Company was in compliance with the ERISA bonding requirements.

7. Fair Value Measurements – The Plan’s investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to measure the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value at the reporting date.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1). Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. There are no plan assets requiring the use of Level 3 inputs for the periods presented.
