Opinion

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1 – Description of Plan

The following brief description of the SAFE Boats International Employee Stock Ownership Plan and Trust (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for complete information.

General – SAFE Boats International, Inc. (the Company), established the Plan effective January 1, 2023. The Plan operates as a leveraged employee stock ownership plan (ESOP) and is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the IRC), and is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). The Plan is administered by the Company with appropriate officers of the Company authorized and directed by the board of directors of the Company to work with counsel to accomplish the purposes of the Company in administering the Plan. ESOP Trustee Services serves as an independent third-party trustee of the Plan (the Trustee).

On March 31, 2023, the Plan purchased 100% of the Company's common stock from the selling shareholders through notes payable, which were then reassigned to the Company. After the reassignment, the Plan had a note payable to the Company for the full purchase price (Note 7) and holds the stock in a trust established under the Plan. The stock was purchased at a price of \$0.90 per share, for an aggregate purchase price of \$4,499,366.

The borrowing is collateralized by the unallocated shares of Company stock. As the Plan makes each payment of principal and interest, an appropriate percentage of stock will be allocated to eligible employees' accounts in accordance with applicable regulations under the IRC. The Company has no rights against shares once they are allocated under the ESOP. Accordingly, the financial statements of the Plan present separately the assets and liabilities therein pertaining to:

- a. The accounts of employees with rights in allocated stock (Allocated) and
- b. Stock not yet allocated to employees (Unallocated).

Eligibility – Employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan upon reaching the age of 18 and following the completion of at least one year of service in which they are credited with at least 1,000 hours of service. Eligible participants must have at least 1,000 hours of service and be employed on the last day of the Plan year to receive Company stock allocations or contributions for that year, unless the Participant did not meet these requirements due to normal retirement, death, or disability during the Plan year.

Company contributions – The Company is obligated to make contributions in cash to the Plan which, when aggregated with the Plan's dividends and interest earnings, if any, equal the amount necessary to enable the Plan to make the regularly scheduled payments of principal and interest due on its note payable. The Company may also make contributions to fund benefit payments to terminated or retired participants. Employee contributions are not permitted.

Participant accounts – The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. As of the last day of each Plan year, each participant's account receives an allocation of shares of the Company's common stock released by the Trustee from the unallocated account and forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts. Annual allocations of common stock and forfeitures are based on the ratio that the compensation of each such participant bears to the total compensation of all such participants, subject to allocation limits. Appreciation or depreciation in the value of Company stock is allocated to each participant's Company stock account based on the ratio of the participant's Company stock account balance to all participants' Company stock account balances.

Vesting – Participant accounts vest according to the following schedule:

A participant's account shall fully vest upon retirement, death or disability.

Forfeitures – Forfeitures are the nonvested portion of a participant's account that are lost upon a terminated participant incurring a five-year break in service. The forfeitures shall be allocated to eligible participants as of the allocation date of the Plan year in which the forfeitures occur. There were no shares forfeited or reallocated to eligible participants in 2024.

Payment of benefits – Distributions shall be made in accordance with the Plan's distribution policy when a participant retires, becomes disabled, dies (in which case, payment shall be made to his or her beneficiary or, if none, his or her legal representatives), or otherwise terminates employment with the Company. In general, a participant's account will be distributed in cash through liquidation of shares at a price representative of the fair market value of the stock. In the event Company stock is distributed, it will be subject to repurchase by the Company within a time frame defined by the Plan.

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or after reaching normal retirement age (as defined) the distribution of the participant's account will be made within the year after termination. Upon termination for other reasons, the distribution of the participant's account will be made on the sixth year after termination. Distributions may be made in a single lump sum payment or substantially equal installments over a five-year period as determined by the Employee Owned Advisory Committee.

If a participant's account balance is less than \$1,000, it will be distributed in cash to the participant, unless otherwise directed by the participant. If the account balance is between \$1,000 and \$7,000 it will be paid as a direct rollover to an individual retirement account designated by the Trustee unless otherwise directed by the participant.

Diversification – Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in the Company stock into investments that are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 and have at least 10 years of participation in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Due to the 10-year participation rule, the diversification provisions will commence January 1, 2033, for eligible participants enrolled in the Plan when it was formed on January 1, 2023. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six-year period. In each of the first five years, a participant may diversify up to 25% of the number of shares in their account less all amounts previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage increases to 50%.

Voting rights – In general, shares of Company stock are voted by the Trustee as further described in the Plan document. With respect to certain corporate matters such as a merger, consolidation, recapitalization, liquidation, dissolution, or sale of substantially all assets of a trade or business, each participant is entitled to direct the Trustee as to the voting of shares of Company stock allocated to his or her account. In those matters, unallocated shares or participant shares without a proxy statement will be voted by the Trustee as directed by the Administrative Committee. The Trustee is required to vote all shares in a manner determined by the Trustee to be consistent with ERISA.

Plan termination – Although the Company has expressed no intent to do so, it reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to the Plan provisions. Upon complete or partial termination of the Plan, the entire interest of each of the affected participants shall become 100% vested and be distributed in accordance with the Plan provisions and the IRC. Upon termination of the Plan, the Company shall direct the Trustee to pay all liabilities and expenses of the trust fund and through approval of the board of directors of the Company to sell shares of stock held in the unallocated account to the extent it determines such sale to be necessary in order to repay the loan.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting – The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP), using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the use of estimates and assumptions that may affect certain amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation – Investments are reported at fair value. See Note 6 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Income recognition – The net appreciation in fair value of Company common stock consists of both the realized gains or losses and unrealized appreciation and depreciation of allocated and unallocated Company stock.

Payment of benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses – The Company pays the administrative expenses of the Plan.

Allocations – The financial statements of the Plan present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to (a) the accounts of employees with rights in allocated stock (allocated) and (b) stock not yet allocated to employees (unallocated), including shares that are committed to be released. Shares are released from collateral and become allocated generally in the period in which debt service is actually paid.

Subsequent events – The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 29, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 – Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated December 31, 2024, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

In accordance with guidance on accounting for uncertainty in income taxes, the Plan administrator has evaluated the Plan's tax positions and does not believe the Plan has any uncertain tax positions that require disclosure or adjustment to the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 4 – Administration of Plan Assets

The Plan assets, which consist of Company common stock, are held by the Trustee of the Plan.

Company contributions are held and managed by the Trustee, which invests cash received and makes benefit payments to participants. The Trustee also administers the payment of interest and principal on the loan using the Company contributions to the trust.

Certain Plan administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

Note 6 – Fair Value Measurements

The Plan has adopted authoritative guidance on fair value measurements. The guidance defines fair value as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (i.e., the exit price) in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

The Plan classified its investments based upon an established fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 – Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical, unrestricted assets or liabilities;

Level 2 – Quoted prices in markets that are not considered to be active or financial instruments without quoted market prices, but for which all significant inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly;

Level 3 – Prices or valuations that require inputs that are both significant to the fair value measurement and unobservable.

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The fair value of the Company common stock held by the Plan is valued at fair value based upon an independent appraisal. This appraisal was based upon a combination of the market and income valuation techniques. The appraiser took into account historical and projected cash flow and net income, weighted average cost of capital, market comparables, and other factors. The valuation reflects the conclusion that market participants would recognize a discount for lack of marketability.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 7 – Note Payable

In 2023, the Plan entered into a note payable totaling \$4,499,366 with the Company. The proceeds of the note were used to purchase the Company's outstanding common stock. Unallocated shares are collateral for the note. The agreement provides for the note to be repaid over 25 years. The note bears interest at 3.74% per annum.

Due to the level of risk associated with the investment in the common stock and to uncertainties inherent in estimates and assumptions, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of the common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
